- (F) This trust shall terminate when the youngest of my said grandchildren, Kevin McClung, Kyle McClung and Chad Seaborn reach the age of twenty-five (25) years and all assets of this trust estate then remaining shall become the property of my wife, Ruth Harris, for and during her natural life, and upon her death such assets shall be delivered to the Co-trustees of the Mr. and Mrs. Percy Harris Educational Trust herein established and shall become a part of the assets of such Trust and shall be held and administered along with the other assets of said Trust in accordance with the provisions of this Will pertaining thereto.

IV

I give, devise and bequeath all of the rest, residue and remainder of the property, real, personal and mixed, unto my wife for and during her natural life, and hereby grant her the power in her lifetime to sell and dispose of the said property, or any part thereof, as she may see fit. And I give, devise and bequeath all of the above described property remaining undisposed of by my said wife during her lifetime unto the Chairman of the Official Board of the First Christian Church in Wellington, Kansas, the Minister of the First Christian Church in Wellington, Kansas, and the Principal of Wellington Senior High School in Wellington, Kansas, as Co-trustees in and upon trust, to hold and administer the same for the charitable and educational purpose of providing scholarships for certain students seeking education or training above the high school level according to the provisions hereinafter set forth for the use and benefit of the students selected as hereinafter provided, to-wit:

- (a) This trust shall be known as the Mr. and Mrs. Percy Harris Educational Trust, and the net income of which shall be used exclusively to provide scholarships for students in three different categories, namely, (1) students planning to attend a church related college or university, (2) students planning to attend a four-year Kansas college or university, and (3) students planning to attend a vocational school or a junior college.
- (b) If sufficient funds are available, at least one scholarship shall be awarded each year in each of the three

categories mentioned above to deserving students based upon academic achievement as well as the need of the student, the recipients of all such scholarships to be determined by the Co-trustees after consultation with the proper school officials. It is my desire that all of such scholarships be awarded on a priority basis as follows:

First, to students who are members of the First Christian Church in Wellington, Kansas;

Second, to students who are graduates of Wellington High School in Wellington, Kansas; and

Third, to students who are graduates of a high school in Sumner County, Kansas.

(c) Only the income from the trust property shall be used to pay the scholarships herein provided for. Each scholarship shall be awarded for one (1) year, and may be renewable for a second year if the recipient of the scholarship continues in school.

(d) Each scholarship shall be in the amount of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) per year and shall be payable to the school the recipient is to attend in one lump sum, or in equal parts at such times during the year as tuition is required to be paid at the institution the recipient is to attend, all in the sole discretion of the Co-trustees.

(e) The Co-trustees shall have the authority to determine the number of scholarships to be awarded each year after considering the amount of funds available therefor. In the event that the funds available for such scholarships are not sufficient to award three (3) scholarships, or some multiple thereof, each year, then and in that event, scholarships shall be awarded as follows:

First, to a student planning to attend a church related college or university;

Second, to a student planning to attend a four-year Kansas college or university and

Third, to a student planning to attend
a vocational school or junior college,

and any additional scholarships awarded in any one year shall
be awarded in the same preferential order.

(f) The Co-trustees of this the Mr. and Mrs. Percy Harris
Educational Trust, shall have full power to take,
hold, control, supervise and manage the trust estate, together
with all increase, substitutions and additions thereto, and
shall have the right, power and authority to collect, receive
and receipt for any and all moneys, including proceeds from
policies of insurance, due the trust estate and any and all
income which may be derived therefrom, with full right and
power to enforce in any proper manner whatsoever all claims
and obligations due the trust estate according to the terms
thereof, to pay all taxes and assessments imposed upon or
on account of the trust estate, to pay premiums for insur-
ance necessary for the protection of the trust property,
to pay all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred by
my Co-trustees in the management of this trust and to receive
compensation for their services as such Co-trustees in a

To the extent permitted by law executrixes or executors or trustees, Co-trustees or successor trustees named herein shall not be required to furnish bond or to obtain approval of any court for actions taken or to be taken in carrying out the terms and provisions of this Will and the trusts herein created or to make reports to such court, except, however, that the Co-trustees of the Mr. and Mrs. Percy Harris Trust and any successor trustees of such trust shall be required to file annual accounting with the court having jurisdiction of such trust and approval of such court must be obtained for expenses incur-

red in the operation of such trust.

I hereby make, constitute and appoint my wife, Ruth Harris, of Wellington, Kansas, executrix of this, my Last Will and Testament, and request that she be permitted to serve as such executrix without furnishing bond. In the event of the death, incapacity or failure of the said Ruth Harris to serve as such executrix, then and in that event, I make, constitute and appoint C. E. Russell, of Wellington, Kansas, to serve as such executor of this, my Last Will and Testament, and request that he be permitted to serve as such executor without furnishing bond.
