In addition, during each annual financial audit by an independent accounting firm, the 990 is provided for auditor review. WRTC has annual gross receipts that are normally greater than \$100,000, and while WRTC does receive contributions, it does not solicit contributions.

Form 990, Part III

1. The organization's mission

Washington Regional Transplant Community (WRTC) is the organ and tissue donor agency designated by the federal government to serve the Washington, D.C. metropolitan region. WRTC serves the public by providing donated organs and tissues for transplantation, research, therapy, and education. Federal law requires that every hospital in the region contact WRTC when any person in its facility is declared to be deceased or when death is imminent, and whether or not an individual is a designated donor. WRTC receives approximately 15,000 referrals each year, and makes the determination whether there is potential for donation.

WRTC staff support families who make decisions upon the death of a family member, and provide information about the option for donation. Strict federal rules determine the allocation of organs for transplant and the handling of tissues for human uses. WRTC orchestrates all logistics related to evaluation of the deceased donor, testing for donor viability and medical safety of organs and tissues, surgical teams, transportation, and allocation of the organ and/or tissue to its destination.

Under its federal mandate, WRTC provides extensive community education programs as a free public service, and also provides medical education for the physicians, nurses, and hospital staff who participate in donation cases. WRTC also provides a donor advocacy program, bereavement services to families and extensive contact with donor families and recipients for as many years as they would like. WRTC coordinates the meetings of donor family members and recipients, if they wish to meet, and serves donor families in many ways with integrity and compassion.

4. Exempt purpose achievements

WRTC is able to identify tangible public benefits for the year 2010. In area hospitals and serving families whose loved ones had died, WRTC managed and coordinated 115 deceased organ donation cases, an additional 4 cases involving deceased neonates donating livers for hepatocyte cell clinical trials, and one voluntary living kidney donation case. WRTC also managed and coordinated 293 tissue donation cases. The organ donation cases resulted in 175 kidneys transplanted into waiting recipients, 2 kidneys sent for research, 26 hearts transplanted, 4 hearts for research, 82 livers transplanted, 4 adult livers for research, 20 pancreata transplanted, 4 pancreata for research, 31 lungs transplanted, 7 lungs for research, and 2 small bowel (intestines) transplanted.

Every organ transplanted into a waiting recipient is a life-saving procedure. Without an organ transplant, an individual with end-stage organ failure has no other therapy available to save his or her life. Every day, as many as 18 patients die while waiting on national, regional, and local transplant waiting lists. These federally-regulated lists are managed by the United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS) and are maintained by organ type and by blood type. Candidates are prioritized based on time waiting, their medical condition, and clinical information about their antigens, and other factors.

From the 297 tissue donation cases, over 1,000 tissue specimens were made available for tissue transplants of bone, skin, corneas, heart valves, veins, and connective tissue. Every tissue transplant saves or improves a life. Skin is used for burn victims and for reconstructive surgeries. Bone is used for orthopedic surgeries. Veins can be used for cardiac surgeries and to repair blood vessel injuries. Heart valves are used primarily in pediatric cases, such as for infants born with congenital heart anomalies.

During 2010, WRTC extensively conducted and supported community education programs to raise awareness about donation. With over 200 events each year, WRTC has staff and over 100 volunteers giving presentations in churches, schools, at sports events and concerts, and in civic presentations. The media is used to place ads on radio, television, newspapers, and at movie theaters.

Over the past several years, WRTC has launched, maintained, and participated in the operation of web-based organ/tissue donation registries for the District of Columbia, the State of Maryland, and the Commonwealth of Virginia. These have successfully allowed the public to make their wishes known regarding donation, in addition to identifying it on a wallet donor card or in a motor vehicle database. The registries are:

The registries have had an impact on raising awareness about donation, and helping individuals to make a stronger commitment toward becoming a donor. During 2010, in the D.C./Maryland/Virginia region, nearly 40 percent of driver's licenses identified a 'yes' for donation. In the registries, 44 percent of the population registered to be an organ donor, 52 percent registered to be a tissue donor, and 50 percent registered to be a cornea donor. The national average from 2009 was approximately 28 percent to be an organ donor. The data from these three registries help to identify a good level of awareness among the population in our region.

WRTC has assisted the area's 45 hospitals with establishing and improving their policies to support and facilitate donation. This has resulted in an improvement in hospital ability to conform to accreditation standards and federal Medicare/Medicaid Conditions of Participation, all of which require hospitals to support and cooperate in donation.

WRTC has also created and improved policies in hospitals by which physicians and nurses participate in the donation process. Their involvement is critical to the support provided by WRTC to donor families, during their difficulty in stressful and often traumatic circumstances. WRTC's focus is on complying with the wishes of the deceased person to be a donor. WRTC also focuses its resources on treating families with dignity in their bereavement and during the times they are making decisions to pursue organ and tissue donation or supporting their loved one's wish to be a donor.
