The Lockhart Vaughan Foundation directs its grants toward four goals in Baltimore, Maryland.

Goal: Baltimore children will have access to a quality public education in pre-K through 12th grade.

Strategies:

- Strengthen the reading readiness instruction in pre-K and Kindergarten programs in Baltimore.
- Support programs that challenge motivated students in Baltimore's public schools.
