

**BY-LAWS
OF
THE MILLER & CHEVALIER CHARITABLE FOUNDATION**

ARTICLE I - DIRECTORS

The management and all powers of the Foundation shall be vested in and exercised by its Board of Directors which shall consist of such number of persons, not fewer than three and not more than nine, as may be determined by the Board. Except as otherwise determined by unanimous consent of the Directors, the Directors shall be elected by the Directors at the annual meeting of the Directors for a term of one year or until their successors have been elected. The Directors in office at any time shall constitute the members of the Foundation at that time.

Upon reaching the age of 80, a Director shall become a Director Emeritus; he or she shall have no vote, and his or her office as Director shall be filled by the Directors.

ARTICLE II - MEETINGS

Section 1. The annual meeting of the Directors shall be held on the Tuesday of each year immediately preceding Thanksgiving day at the office of Miller & Chevalier Chartered, or at such time and place as the Directors determine.

Section 2. Special meetings may be called by the President, and shall be called by the President upon the written or electronic request of more than one-third of the Directors. A special meeting may be held telephonically by conference call

Section 3. At least ten days' notice in writing shall be given to each Director of the annual meeting of the Directors, and at least ten days' notice in writing shall be given of

any special meeting of the Directors. Notice of any meeting may be waived by a Director, and the Director's presence at, or participation in, the meeting shall constitute a waiver.

Section 4. A majority of the Directors shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the Board of Directors.

Section 5. Any Director may participate and vote in any meeting by proxy. A proxy shall be in writing (including an electronic, Internet message) and filed with the Secretary; the Secretary shall announce each proxy and its terms at the beginning of each meeting.

Section 6. The Board may act without holding a meeting through the exchange of electronic messages over the Internet addressed to all Directors.

ARTICLE III - POWERS

The Foundation shall have power to take and hold, by bequest, devise, gift or purchase, either absolutely or in trust, for any of its purposes authorized by its Certificate of Incorporation, any property, real or personal, without limitation as to amount or value, except such as may be imposed by law, to convey such property, to receive income thereon, to invest, reinvest, deal with and expend or disburse the same, whether principal or income, in such manner as the Board of Directors shall approve, for the promotion of the objects for which the Foundation is organized.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

Section 1 The officers of the Foundation shall be the President, the Vice President, the Secretary and the Treasurer and such other officers as may be elected from time to time by the Board of Directors. The same person may be elected Secretary and Treasurer. In addition, the same person may be elected Vice President and Treasurer.

Section 2. At each annual meeting of the Board of Directors, or in default of election at such meeting, then at any subsequent special meeting called for that purpose, the Directors shall elect the officers for the following year. An officer duly elected shall hold office for one year, or until his or her successor is elected and accepts the office.

Section 3. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Directors at which he or she shall be present. He or she shall appoint all committees, and shall be ex-officio a member of all committees, unless otherwise provided in the establishment or appointment of any committee. He or she shall have power to sign in the name of and for the Foundation all deeds, bonds, contracts, agreements, formal instruments and other obligations. He or she shall keep the Directors advised and fully informed as to, and freely consult with them concerning, the business of the Foundation. He or she shall also have, exercise and perform all other powers and duties as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Board of Directors.

In the case of the absence, disability, or failure of the President to act, the Vice President shall exercise the powers and perform the duties of the President

In the absence or disability of both the President and the Vice President, the President may by written instrument, with the consent of the Board, appoint one or more members of the Foundation to discharge such of his or her functions as he or she may assign to such member or members.

Section 4. Subject to such regulations as may from time to time be prescribed by the Board of Directors, the Treasurer shall have the custody of the funds and securities of the Foundation, including all bonds, deeds and other papers and documents relating to such property, and shall also have charge of the accounts and records. With the consent of the Board of Directors, he may employ a bank, trust company and/or professional manager to keep and/or

manage the funds and other properties of the Foundation. Any money in his or her custody shall be separately kept in a bank account in the name of the Foundation, in such bank or banks as the Board of Directors may by resolution direct. All disbursements shall be made by check signed by two officers or Directors.

Section 5. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Board of Directors and all actions taken without a meeting in books provided for the purpose. The minutes for the annual meeting shall include the names of the recipients of contributions from the Foundation for that calendar year and the amount of each contribution. The Secretary shall attend to the giving and serving of all notices of the Foundation, and shall have charge of such books and papers as the Board of Directors or the President may direct, all of which shall, at all reasonable times, be open to the examination of the officers or Directors of the Foundation; he or she shall in general perform all the duties incident to the office of Secretary, subject to the control of the Board of Directors and the President. The Secretary shall preserve the reports of the Treasurer.

ARTICLE V - ADVISORS

The Board of Directors may consult with one or more advisors not connected with the Foundation, having special experience with charitable giving, and may pay reasonable compensation, if necessary, for such services.

ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES

The Board of Directors by resolution shall provide for committees to evaluate requests for grants and make recommendations to the Directors regarding appropriate grant recipients. The Board of Directors by resolution may provide for other committees and may

delegate to the committees the appropriate powers. Unless otherwise provided in that resolution, the appointment of Directors to serve on such committees shall be made by the President.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS

The Board of Directors shall have power to alter or amend the By-Laws of The Miller & Chevalier Charitable Foundation, by a vote of two-thirds of all the Directors, at any annual or special meeting of the Board, provided that written notice has been sent to each Director at least ten days in advance of the date of the meeting, stating specifically the proposed change or amendment; or, without any such notice, then by a unanimous vote of all the Directors.

ARTICLE VIII - GRANTS

The Board shall generally consider requests for grants only at the annual meeting. Requests shall be screened by such committees as designated by the Board, which committees shall report in writing to the Board their recommendations of grant recipients. Grant recipients and amounts shall be decided by the vote of a majority of Directors present at the annual meeting.

The Foundation's officers are empowered to approve grants during the course of the year not exceeding in total an amount equal to 10% of the prior year's grants, whether such grants are referred to the Foundation or solicited directly, subject to the normal Foundation grant making guidelines and standards and a relatively high standard of urgency. Any grants made under this procedure are not charged against any particular committee.

A commitment to make a grant extending beyond the current year (i.e. a pledge) shall be made only in extraordinary circumstances and only upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the Directors.

ARTICLE IX - LIQUIDATION

The Foundation can be dissolved at any time by a vote of two-thirds of all the Directors.

In the event the firm of Miller & Chevalier Chartered, ceases to exist, either because it has been dissolved or because it has lost its identity by being merged into another firm, the Foundation shall be dissolved.

Any funds or other property owned or held by the Foundation at dissolution shall be disbursed as determined by a majority of the Directors solely to corporations, trusts or funds organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious or scientific purposes, no part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any member, private shareholder or individual.
