









	The APA Publications and Databases Office is responsible for the dissemination of psychological information worldwide Information dissemination projects include 60 scholarly journals, a book and video publishing program, and seven electronic database products In 2010 the APA journals program published more than 3,255 articles in 270 issues PsycARTICLES, the electronic database product containing full text journal content, released 322 issues with 3,701 articles of journal content published in 2010, and 14 issues with 105 articles of older journal content APA published 76 books and 12 videos in 2010 281 books were added to the PsycBOOKS database, these included 42 books published by APA and 239 older books published by others PsycINFO, the bibliographic database, was increased by 198,009 records PsycINFO also added 96 new terms to the Thesaurus of Psychological Index Terms, which constitutes the controlled vocabulary used for indexing APA databases PsycEXTRA, the gray literature database that includes both bibliographic records and full text content, increased by 29,481 records In 2010, 482 new reviews were added to PsycCRITIQUES, the database of book and film reviews

Its programs include research and travel grants for graduate students (159 grants in 2010), disseminating information about the psychology workforce (more than 25 presentations, reports, and briefs, hundreds of data tables posted), supporting advanced research training for faculty and students (4 training sessions, more than 100 participants attending in 2010), and archiving information important to the discipline (over 1900 new items added, over 700 requests satisfied in 2010). The APA Public Interest Directorate applies the science and practice of psychology to the fundamental problems of human welfare and social justice and the promotion of equitable and just treatment of all segments of society through education, training, and public policy. In 2010 the Directorate managed nearly \$3.2 million in federal and foundation grants addressing violence prevention and child maltreatment, HIV/AIDS research, prevention, and care, public education and training about sexual orientation, postpartum depression, SES-related cancer disparities, and work, stress, and health. Among numerous 2010 APA-funded programs and activities were advocacy related to provisions in the new health reform law and to the repeal of the military's "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" policy, guidelines for evaluating dementia and age-related cognitive decline, refugee families and children in the U.S., public education addressing sexual orientation, development of a recovery oriented curriculum for psychologists, homelessness, prevention of violence and child maltreatment, women's leadership in psychology, and the sexualization of girls. The APA Practice Directorate supports a variety of initiatives on behalf of practicing psychologists and consumers of psychological services including advocacy for access to psychological testing/assessment and intervention services for consumers, development of practice guidelines, a public education campaign focusing on Mind/Body Health and the connection between psychological and physical health, the annual Stress in America Survey, the APA Help Center, a web-based platform for consumer information, the Psychologically Healthy Workplace Program, an annual State Leadership Conference for more than 500 psychology leaders throughout the US and Canada, educational and professional development materials for practitioners, and, a Disaster Response Network in cooperation with the American Red Cross.</p>
