The goals were to establish internal compensation equity, achieve external equity to ensure fair and competitive pay, to develop an objective merit review process, and develop tools to maintain the compensation program. The Internet Society developed compensation benchmarks for each position within the organization, using several compensation studies for U.S. based employees and benchmarks from Mercer. Towers Watson for worldwide employees. These benchmarks are updated annually. In 2010, the Internet Society obtained independent compensation studies for the Chief Financial Officer as a statutory officer of the Internet Society. The contract of the Chief Executive Officer was established in February 2006, under a five-year contract, and will be reviewed in the following year. Staff members fill out self evaluations, followed by an evaluation by their manager, and a meeting is held between the employee and their respective manager to discuss their previous year's achievements and current year's goals. The Internet Society has established the practice to review performance of all employees on a common review date of December 31. Annual salary reviews are based on these performance reviews and compensation surveys. The Internet Society also awards variable compensation to staff based on individual performance during the year. These awards were determined in consultation with the compensation on the compensation of the CEO. The Internet Society entered into an employment contract with its CEO in February 2006, replacing a prior employment contract. The CEO is to receive a base compensation to be paid monthly, and is eligible for annual variable compensation equal to 30% of the base compensation.
