# **REVISED BYLAWS**

#### OF

# THE FOUNDATION FOR IMPROVEMENT OF JUSTICE, INC.

(a Not-For-Profit Corporation)

### ARTICLE I OFFICES

- 1. <u>Principal Office</u>. The principal office of the Corporation shall be located in the County of Gwinnett, State of Georgia.
- 2. Other Offices. The Corporation may also have such offices at such other places within or without the State as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine.

#### ARTICLE II BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- 1. <u>Board of Directors</u>. The Corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors who shall determine all policies and procedures pertaining to the operation of the Corporation.
- 2. <u>Number of Directors</u>. The number of Directors constituting the entire Board shall be no less than three (3) or more than eleven (11). The number of Directors may be increased or decreased by action of the Board of Directors provided that any action by the Board of Directors to affect such increase or decrease shall require the vote of a majority of the entire Board of Directors. No decrease shall shorten the term of any Director then in office.

#### 3. Qualifications of Directors.

- a. Directors shall be mature, competent, trustworthy individuals. Individuals selected as Directors shall have experience in justice-related fields and/or experience involving non-profit foundation operations, an understanding of financial activities of such foundations, and general knowledge of the Federal and State laws concerning non-profit foundations. Directors should bring such experience to the Board of Directors that will benefit the Corporation, assist the Board of Directors in fulfilling its responsibilities, and contribute to the operation of the Corporation.
- b. Directors selected as officers or as members of committees may be required to possess specific qualifications. Directors appointed members of an audit committee or an investment committee should have financial competency and experience.
- c. Individuals being considered as Directors should understand and accept the responsibility and time commitment involved in serving as a Director prior to being appointed as such.

- 4. Other Provisions for Directors. Except as may be provided elsewhere in the Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws, the Board of Directors may prescribe rules and regulations specifying:
  - a. The eligibility and additional qualifications for individuals to serve as Directors and/or to serve on committees.
  - b. The manner in which Directors are selected.
  - c. The manner of suspension or termination of service as a Director, and reinstatement as a Director.
  - d. The amount of any dues, fees, fines or assessments as pertains to Directors, interns, and employees.
- 5. <u>Election of Directors.</u> Directors shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Corporation and shall hold office until the next Annual Meeting. Election of Directors shall be by majority vote of the members of the Board of Directors present at the Annual Meeting and shall be by secret written ballot. Each Director shall hold office until the expiration of the term for which he or she was elected, or until his or her successor has been duly elected, or until his prior resignation or removal as hereinafter provided.
- 6. <u>Removal of Directors</u>. The Board of Directors may remove any Director thereof with or without cause.
- 7. Resignation of Directors. A Director may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Board of Directors or to an officer of the Corporation. Unless otherwise specified in the notice, the resignation shall take effect upon receipt thereof by the Board of Directors or such officer. Acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.
- 8. <u>Filling Vacancies</u>. Newly created directorships or vacancies in the Board of Directors may be filled by a vote of majority of the Board of Directors then in office, although less than a quorum, unless otherwise provided in the Articles of Incorporation. Voting by the Board of Directors to fill a new or vacant directorship must take place at a Board Meeting. A Director elected to fill a vacancy caused by resignation, death, or removal shall be elected to hold office for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor.
- 9. <u>Interns.</u> The Board of Directors may prescribe the rules and procedures for selection, appointment, and service of individuals as interns to instruct and train such individuals as future Directors in all aspects of the functioning of the Foundation. In addition, such interns may be authorized to attend and participate in the discussion at meetings of the Board of Directors, but shall not have the privilege of making motions or voting.
- 10. <u>Employees</u>. The Board of Directors shall have the authority to hire employees and establish policies and procedures pertaining thereto.

11. All resolutions, rules and/or regulations relating to Directors adopted by the Board of Directors shall be affixed to the Bylaws of the Corporation, and shall be deemed to be a part thereof.

# ARTICLE III MEETINGS

- 1. <u>Annual Meeting</u>. The Annual Meeting of Board of Directors of the Corporation shall be held on the first Saturday in February unless another date within a month of the first Saturday in February is chosen and approved by the Board of Directors.
- 2. <u>Regular Meetings</u>. Regular Meetings of the Board of Directors other than the Annual Meeting will be held on such date or dates as may be fixed by the Board of Directors.
- 3. <u>Special Meetings</u>. Special Meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by or at the direction of the Chairman of the Board, the President, or by a majority of the Directors then in office.
- 4. <u>Location of Meetings</u>. Annual, Regular, and Special Meetings of the Board of Directors may be held at such place within or without the State of Georgia as the Board of Directors may from time to time fix. In the event the Board of Directors shall fail to fix such place or time, such meeting shall be held at the principal office of the Corporation.
- 5. Notice of Meetings. Written notice of the Annual Meeting of the Directors will state the place, day and hour of the meeting and further state the meeting is being called for the election of Directors and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the Board. Notice of the Annual Meeting shall be given either personally, by first class mail, or by email not less than 10 days or more than 50 days before the date of the meeting. Notices shall be sent to each Director at his or her address recorded on the records of the Corporation, or at such other address that the Director may have furnished in writing to the Executive Director of the Corporation. Notices shall be deemed to have been given when deposited with postage prepaid in a post office or other official depository under the exclusive jurisdiction of the United States Post Office.
  - a. No notice shall be required for Regular Meetings of the Board of Directors for which the date, time and place have been fixed.
  - b. Written, oral, or any other method of notice of the date, time and place shall be given for Special Meetings of the Board of Directors in sufficient time for the convenient assembly of the Board of Directors. Special Meetings may be held by telephone conference call.
- 6. Adjournment of Meetings. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.
  a. In such event, it shall not be necessary to provide further notice of the time and place of the adjourned meeting if announcement of the time and place of the adjourned meeting is given at the meeting so adjourned.

- b. In the event the Board of Directors fixes a new record date for an adjourned meeting, a new notice shall be given, in the same manner as herein provided.
- c. No notice need be given to any Director who executes and delivers a Waiver of Notice before or after the meeting. The attendance of a Director in person or by proxy at the meeting without protesting the lack of notice of a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice by such member.
- 7. <u>Presiding Officer</u>. Meetings of the Board of Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman of the Board. If the Chairman is not present or there is no Chairman, the President shall preside, and if there is not President or in his or her absence, by any other Director chosen by the Board.
- 8. <u>Secretary</u>. The Secretary or an Assistant Secretary shall act as Secretary of every meeting. When neither the Secretary nor an Assistant Secretary is available, the Chairman may appoint a Secretary of the meeting.
- 9. <u>Visitors at Meetings</u>. Attendance at meetings of the Board of Directors shall be limited to the Directors then in office, duly appointed interns, and the Executive Director. The Board of Directors may approve visitors when in its opinion their presence will be advantageous to the work of the Board. Approval of visitors shall require an affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the Board of Directors.
- 10. <u>Order of Business</u>. The order of business at all meetings shall be as follows unless the majority of the Directors agree to a proposed change:
  - Roll call.
  - Reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting.
  - Reports of standing committees and officers.
  - Old business.
  - New business.
- 11. <u>Proxy.</u> Every Director may authorize another person to act for him or her by proxy in all matters in which he or she may participate, including waiving notice of any meeting, voting or participating in a meeting, or expressing consent or dissent without a meeting. Every proxy shall be signed by the Director or his or her attorney in fact, and shall be revocable at the pleasure of the Director executing it, except as otherwise provided by law. Except as otherwise provided by law, no proxy shall be valid after the expiration of eleven months from its date.
- 12. Quorum. Except to the extent herein or in the Articles of Incorporation, a majority of the entire members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum. At any meeting held to remove one or more Directors a quorum shall consist of a majority of the Directors present at such meeting. Whenever a vacancy on the Board of Directors shall prevent a quorum from being present, then, in such event, the quorum shall consist of a majority of the members of the Board of Directors excluding the vacancy. A majority of the Directors present, whether or not a quorum is present, may adjourn a meeting to another time and place. Except to the extent provided by law and these Bylaws, the act of the Board of Directors shall be by a majority of the Directors

present at the time of votes, a quorum being present at such time. Any action authorized by resolution, in writing, by all of the Directors entitled to vote thereon and filed with the minutes of the Corporation shall be the act of the Board of Directors with the same force and effect as if the same had been passed by unanimous votes at a duly called meeting of the Board.

#### 13. Voting.

- a. Voting related to the election or removal of Directors and Officers shall be conducted by secret written ballot listing the names of all nominees. Ballots will be tallied and confirmed by two individuals serving as officers of the Board of Directors and/or the Executive Director. If only one individual is nominated for a given position, the requirement for a secret written ballot shall be waived and the voting conducted by show of hands or oral count.
- b. Voting related to other business before the Board of Directors shall be conducted in accordance with *Robert's Rules of Order* unless specified otherwise by these Bylaws.
- 14. <u>Annual Report</u>. The Board of Directors shall present an Annual Report at each Annual Meeting. Such report shall be filed with the records of the Corporation and entered in the minutes of the proceedings of such Annual Meeting.
- 15. Committees. Whenever the Board of Directors shall consist of more than three persons, the Board of Directors may designate from their number, an executive committee and other standing committees. Such committees shall have such authority as the Board of Directors may delegate, except to the extent prohibited by law. In addition, the Board of Directors may establish special committees for any lawful purpose, which may have such powers as the Board of Directors may lawfully delegate.

### ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

- 1. Officers. The Board of Directors may elect or appoint a Chairman of the Board of Directors, a President, one or more Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, one or more Assistant Secretaries, a Treasurer, one or more Assistant Treasurers, and such other officers as they may determine. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person except the offices of President and Secretary.
- 2. <u>Term of Office</u>. Each officer shall hold office until the Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors, and until his successor has been duly elected and qualifies. The Board of Directors may remove any officer with or without cause at any time.

#### 3. Duties of President and Vice President.

a. The President shall be the chief executive officer of the Corporation, shall have the responsibility for the general management of the affairs of the Corporation, and shall carry out the resolutions of the Board of Directors. During the absence or disability of the President of the Corporation, the Vice-

- President, or if there be more than one, the Executive Vice-President, shall have all the powers and functions of the President.
- b. The Vice-President shall perform such duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors from time to time.
- 4. <u>Duties of Treasurer</u>. The Treasurer shall be the chief financial officer of the Corporation, and shall oversee the funds and investments of the Corporation.

#### 5. Duties of Secretary.

- a. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Board of Directors meetings.
- b. The Secretary shall provide a list of current Directors for roll call at all meetings.
- c. The Secretary and/or the Executive Director is authorized to sign and execute all contracts when necessary to accomplish actions specifically approved by the Board of Directors, e.g., hotel contracts for awards banquet, printing contracts for annual report or other material.
- 5. Executive Director. The Board of Directors may hire an Executive Director.
  - a. If so hired, he or she shall have the care and custody of all of the funds and securities of the Corporation, and shall deposit said funds in the name of the Corporation in such bank accounts as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine. A conveniently located bank, insured by the FDIC, with the highest rate of return available, is hereby designated as a depository of this Foundation and that one or more checking or deposit accounts shall be opened and maintained on behalf of this Foundation with said Bank. All officers and the Executive Director are authorized to sign checks, drafts, and other orders for the payment of money from said accounts, however, all checks for \$1,000 or more will require two signatures of the above individuals.
  - b. If the needs of this Foundation require it, one or more safe deposit boxes shall be rented from said Bank and any officer is authorized and directed to enter into safe deposit box rental agreements on terms and conditions satisfactory to the Bank. Any officer and/or the Executive Director shall have the right to enter any safe deposit box.
  - c. The Executive Director shall have custody of the seal of the Corporation, and affix and attest the same to documents duly authorized by the Board of Directors.
  - d. The Executive Director shall serve all notices for the Corporation that shall have been authorized by the Board of Directors, and shall have charge of all books and records of the Corporation.

#### ARTICLE V DIRECTOR LIABILITY

A Director of the Corporation shall not be personally liable to the Corporation for monetary damages for an act or omission in such Director's capacity as a Director, except for liability for (a) a breach of a Director's duty of good faith or a breach that involves intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of the law, (b) a transaction from which a Director received an improper benefit, whether or not the benefit resulted from an action taken within the scope of the Director's office,

or (c) an act or omission for which the liability of a Director is expressly provided by statute. If the laws of the State of Georgia are hereafter amended to authorize action further eliminating or limiting the personal liability of a Director of the Corporation, then the liability of a Director of the Corporation shall thereupon automatically be eliminated or limited to the fullest extent permitted by such laws. No repeal or modification of the Article V shall adversely affect any right or protection of a Director existing at the time of such repeal or modification with respect to events or circumstances occurring or existing prior to such time.

#### ARTICLE VI MISCELLANEOUS

- 1. <u>Corporate Records</u>. The Corporation shall keep complete and correct records and books of account, and minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors or any committee appointed by the Board of Directors at the principal office of the Corporation.
- 2. <u>Corporate Seal</u>. The corporate seal shall be in such form as the Board of Directors shall from time to time prescribe.
- 3. <u>Fiscal Year</u>. The Board of Directors shall fix the fiscal year of the Corporation subject to applicable law.
- 4. <u>Correspondence</u>. Written documents mailed through the U. S. Postal Service or like companies or transmitted by electronic email shall be considered and used as an official method for correspondence of the Corporation. If appropriate and necessary for official records, postal return receipts or email acknowledgement of receipt may be required and should become a part of the official documents.
- 5. <u>Capital Contributions</u>. In the event any capital contribution shall be made or accepted pursuant to authorization conferred by the Articles of Incorporation of the Corporation, each certificate evidencing such capital contribution shall conform to the law of the State of Incorporation.

# ARTICLE VII PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be the parliamentary authority for all matters of substance or procedures not specifically covered in these Bylaws.

# ARTICLE VIII AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

The Board of Directors shall have the power to make, alter or repeal from time to time the Bylaws of the Corporation. Such action shall be by a majority vote of the Board of Directors at the Annual Meeting or at a Special Meeting called for such purpose.

These Revised Bylaws of the Foundation for Improvement of Justice, Inc. were approved by the Board of Directors at its Annual Meeting, February 5, 2005, and supersede the original Bylaws of the Foundation for Improvement of Justice, Inc. and their subsequent Amendments effective February 5, 2005.
