The above materials should be received

between January 1 and March 31 and will be reviewed at the annual meeting of Directors in June.

Notification on the final decision will be sent in July. If awarded a grant, the school is required to send the Foundation a verification of receipt of the gift.

FINAL FOLLOW-UP

A brief final follow-up, signed by the Head of School, on the status of the funded school project is requested by July 31 of the year following receipt of the grant.

Due to the increasingly large number of applications received and the budgetary limitations of the foundation, the relative number of grants which can be made is regrettably small. If the applicant is successful in receiving a grant, a period of three (3) years must elapse before the applicant applies for a further grant. This time limitation will allow the foundation to evaluate the results of the first grant and will also permit other applicants to participate in the grant program.
