Schedule 3- Part III- Statement of Program Service Accomplishments

Polonia, Inc. was created as a Polish social, educational and spiritual organization. Membership is open to everyone but is made up primarily of Polish Americans. Polonia members volunteer their time and services to the organization.

The membership dues are \$ 15.00 annually per member for those who can afford to pay. Those who cannot afford to pay can still become members of Polonia.

The following activities have been provided since inception of Polonia.

Polonia has a weekly Sunday dinner and spiritual gathering for its members and guests. Admission is \$ 7.00 per person, for those who can afford to pay. Families who cannot afford dinner are invited as well.

Another activity is that of the welcome committee which helps new immigrants get established. They provide assistance in obtaining housing, furniture, clothing, food, and medical care. Members donate food, clothing, and furniture to provide a start for the new arrivals.

Education is provided for the new immigrants in English language, American history and American culture in order to pass the U.S. Citizenship exam. This is provided as needed in evenings and weekends and is taught by volunteer members.

Classes in religion, English and Polish language are held every Saturday at a cost of \$ 45.00 per year for those who can afford it.

The primary fund raisers of Polonia are the dinner dances and entertainment programs held monthly, and around various holidays. The cost per ticket is \$ 12.00 per person, and a raffle is also held.

A new activity is the sponsorship of handicapped children from Poland, who need help at the Shriners Hospital. Polonia and its members provide a place to stay, food, clothing and transportation for the child and parent. This is done on an as needed basis at no cost.
