



**TEXAS SOCIETY OF CLINICAL ONCOLOGY
BYLAWS**

ARTICLE I: Name

The name of this organization shall be the Texas Society of Clinical Oncology ("Society") or ("TxSCO").

ARTICLE II: Purpose

The purposes of the Texas Society of Clinical Oncology are

- (1) To improve the quality of oncology care available to the people of Texas;
- (2) To maintain and advance the standards of cancer care;
- (3) To support oncology education;
- (4) To facilitate the development and use of new cancer management techniques in the community;
- (5) To provide effective representation of the oncology field for its members and the public;
- (6) To foster effective communication enhancing access to scientific, socioeconomic, research, and other relevant data; and
- (7) To promote collegial relationships among oncologists in the State of Texas

ARTICLE III: Membership

Section 1. Qualifications. All board certified or eligible oncologists or hematologists licensed and in good moral and professional standing with the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners who are engaged in or interested in oncology and who support the purposes of the Society shall be eligible for membership in the Society. Membership shall be open to those individuals who practice in Texas or adjacent States.

Section 2. Classes of Membership. There shall be five (5) classifications of membership. The Board is authorized to create additional membership categories with specific requirements, rights, and privileges as shall be set by the Board from time to time.

Regular Membership: Regular membership is open to physicians in the practice of oncology, past or present, who meet the requirements as set out by the Board of Directors and who are residents of, and who practice in, the State of Texas. Regular Members shall be eligible to vote, hold elective office, attend Society business meetings, and receive all Society mailings. Regular Members shall pay all dues as established by the Board of Directors.

Associate Membership: Associate membership is open to those physicians enrolled in oncology or hematology training programs in the state of Texas, who meet the requirements as set out by the Board of Directors. Their application will

require an attached reference letter from the training program director. Associate Members shall not be allowed to vote or hold elective office, and are not required to pay dues.

Retired Membership: Retired membership is open to those physicians who are no longer in the practice of oncology or hematology in the state of Texas, but who fulfill all other requirements of Regular membership. Retired Members shall not be allowed to vote, hold elective office, or pay dues. They may serve on committees.

Honorary Membership: This special membership category will be open to those physicians who are nominated by the Board of Directors and so honored by a vote of 51% of the membership at any meeting. Honorary Members shall have all the rights of Regular Members. Honorary Members shall not be required to pay dues.

Corresponding Membership: Corresponding membership is open to oncologists who reside outside the state of Texas. Corresponding Members may attend Society meetings and receive all Society mailings, but may not vote nor hold office in the Society. They will pay dues, at a rate to be determined by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Election to Membership. Each candidate for membership shall be required to submit an application to the Society for approval. Candidates will be approved for membership using criteria and procedures established from time to time by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV: Officers

Section 1. Officers. The officers of the Society shall be the President, President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer and, after the first year, the Immediate Past President.

Section 2. Election and Term of Office. All officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors and shall serve until their successors are elected. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person, provided that the Corporation shall have not fewer than two persons as officers. All officers shall be subject to removal at any time by the Board of Directors whenever in the judgment of the Board of Directors the best interests of the Corporation will be served thereby. The Board of Directors may, in its discretion, elect acting or temporary officers, elect officers to fill vacancies occurring for any reason whatsoever, and limit or enlarge the duties and powers of any officer elected by it. Officers need not be directors of the Corporation.

Section 3. Duties of Officers. The officers shall perform the duties prescribed by these Bylaws and by the parliamentary authority adopted by the Society.

President: The President shall preside at all meetings of the Society, shall call meetings of the Board of Directors as may be necessary to transact the business of the Society, appoint all standing committees and ad hoc committees, fill vacancies

as necessary, coordinate the activities of the Society, and perform such other duties as are customary for a presiding officer

President-Elect: The President-Elect shall assist the President in the performance of his duties, preside at meetings in the absence of the President, perform duties assigned to him by the President, and shall automatically assume the office of the President at the expiration of his term. In the event of the death or removal of the President, the President-Elect shall assume the office of the President. If the President-Elect is unable to assume the Presidency, the Nominating Committee shall choose a replacement

Secretary: The Secretary shall be responsible for maintaining the Society records for all meetings, shall be the custodian of such records, and shall sign and attest on all necessary papers required by law.

Treasurer: The Treasurer of the Society shall be the custodian of all monies, securities, deeds, and properties for the Society, shall hold same, subject to the direction and disposition of the Board of Directors, and shall make a full financial report to the members annually.

ARTICLE V: Board of Directors

Section 1. Number and Qualification of Directors. The initial number of directors of the Corporation shall be as set forth in the Articles of Incorporation. The number of directors may be increased or decreased from time to time by amendment to these Bylaws. The number of directors of the Corporation shall not be less than three. The Board of Directors shall be composed of the Officers of the Society and six directors elected at-large at the annual meeting or by mail or facsimile.

Section 2. Duties. The Board of Directors of the Society shall determine policy, manage finances, and generally direct the affairs of the Society.

Section 3. Terms and Tenure of At-Large Members. The term of office for each director shall be two years, or until their successors are elected. Term of office begins and ends with the annual meeting of the Society. The Board of Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting or by mail ballot or facsimile transmission. They shall be elected by a majority of those voting.

Section 4. Meetings. At least one meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Society.

Section 5. Vacancies. Vacancies in any office shall be filled in the interim by appointment of the President of the Society with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Attendance Requirement. Board members whose unexcused absences exceed three consecutive (3) board meetings in any one (1) year period may be subject to removal from the Board.

Section 7. Quorum (Board Meeting). Three (3) members of the Board, one of whom shall be the President or President-Elect, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board.

ARTICLE VI: Committees

Section 1. In General. The Board of Directors may designate one (1) or more standing or advisory committees whose members shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. All committees shall report their findings and recommendations to the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VII: Meetings

The annual meeting of the Society can be held in conjunction with another state, national or international meeting. Special meetings will be called by the President.

ARTICLE VII: Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Society will extend from January 1 through December 31.

ARTICLE IX: Amendments

These Bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board of Directors. Notice of any proposed amendments shall be given in the notice of any meeting at which it is to be considered.
