AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS

 \mathbf{OF}

PATTERSON FOUNDATION

ARTICLE I. PURPOSE

Section 1.01 <u>General Purpose</u>. The purpose of this corporation is as set out in the Articles of Incorporation, as amended.

ARTICLE II. MEMBERS

- Section 2.01 <u>Members</u>. The Articles of Incorporation do not provide for members of this corporation, and accordingly, there are no members nor shall there be any meetings of the members of the corporation.
- Section 2.02 <u>Actions By Members</u>. Any action or approval of the members or shareholders of a corporation which would otherwise be required by the terms of any agreement to which this corporation is a party, or by which this corporation is bound, or by the provisions of any law, rule or regulation to which this corporation is subject, requires only action or approval of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE III. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 3.01 <u>General Powers</u>. The general management of the corporation shall be vested in the Board of Directors, which shall pass upon the acceptance of all gifts, grants, devises, or bequests and shall determine the activities, programs, or projects to be financed or administered by the corporation. The Board of Directors may, from time to time, delegate such authority and responsibility as it may determine to one or more committees or officers.
- **Section 3.02** Number and Election. The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than three (3) persons. A director shall be elected by an affirmative vote of a majority of the directors then in office. Directors shall serve without compensation.
- Section 3.03 Qualifications. Directors shall be of legal age, but need not be residents of Minnesota.
- Section 3.04 <u>Term of Office</u>. Each director shall be elected for a term of three (3) years, or such shorter term as shall be approved by the Board at the time of his or her election. The existing Board shall be designated with staggered terms (1, 2, and 3 years) so that approximately one-third of the incumbent directors are subject to replacement or reappointment each year. Each director shall hold office until his or her successor has been elected and qualified, or until his or her death, resignation, or removal as hereinafter provided.
- **Section 3.05** Board Vacancies. A vacancy on the Board of Directors may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the directors then in office, and the person so elected shall hold office and serve until the next annual meeting of the Board of Directors.

- Section 3.06 <u>Removal of Board Members</u>. Any director may be removed, with or without cause, at any time by an affirmative vote of a majority of the directors. No director shall be removed from office unless the notice of the annual meeting or special meeting of the Board at which removal is to be considered states such purpose. When a director has been removed, a new director may be elected by the affirmative vote of a majority of the directors then in office.
- Section 3.07 Resignation of Board Member. Any director may resign at any time by delivering a written resignation to the President or to the Secretary of the corporation. The resignation of any director shall take effect at the time, if any, specified therein, or if no time is specified therein, immediately upon receipt thereof by the officer of this corporation to whom it is given; and, unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

ARTICLE IV. MEETINGS

- Section 4.01 <u>Annual Meetings</u>. The annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held each year for the purpose of electing the officers of this corporation and for the transaction of such other business as shall come before the meeting. Notice of such meeting shall be given as provided in Section 4.05 hereof, unless excused in accordance with Section 4.06 hereof.
- **Section 4.02** <u>Regular Meetings</u>. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors may be held from time to time at such time and place as the Board may determine by resolution; however the Board may delegate to the President the power to set the meeting dates and times.
- Section 4.03 <u>Special Meetings</u>. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President, and must be called by the President or the Secretary on the written request of not less than two (2) directors or the Secretary. Business at a special meeting shall be limited to the matters specified in the notice of the meeting.
- Section 4.04 <u>Place of Meeting</u>. Meetings shall be held at any place within or without the State of Minnesota designated by the Board of Directors, and in the absence of such designation shall be held at the registered office of the corporation. The Board may delegate to the President the power to designate the place of meetings.
- Section 4.05 <u>Notice of Meetings</u>. Written notice of every annual, regular and special meeting of the Board shall be delivered, mailed, faxed, or sent by means of electronic communications, to each director, addressed to him or her at his or her residence or usual place of business, at least three (3) days or by faxing the same at least one (1) day before the meeting. Each such notice shall state the time and place of the meeting, but need not state the purposes thereof except as otherwise expressly required by the laws of the State of Minnesota, the Articles of Incorporation, or these Bylaws.
- Section 4.06 Notices Excused. Notice of any meeting of the Board of Directors need not be given to any director who shall be present at such meeting; and any meeting of the Board of Directors shall be a legal meeting without any notice thereof having been given if all of the directors of this corporation then in office shall be present thereat or waive such notice in writing before, at, or after such meeting. Appearance at a meeting is deemed a waiver unless it is solely for the purpose of asserting the illegality of the meeting.

- **Section 4.07 Quorum.** Except as otherwise provided by statute or by these Bylaws, a majority of the Board is necessary and sufficient to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and the act of a majority of the Board members present is the act of the Board. If at any meeting there is less than a quorum present, a majority of those present may adjourn the meeting without further notice.
- **Section 4.08** <u>Voting</u>. Each Board member shall have one vote. There shall be no cumulative voting. Directors may vote by voice or by ballot.
- Section 4.09 <u>Electronic Conference Meetings</u>. A conference among directors, or among members of any committee designated by the Board of Directors, by any means of communication through which the participants may simultaneously hear each other during the conference, constitutes a meeting of the Board or the committee if the same notice is given of the conference as would be required for a meeting and if the number of persons participating in the conference would be sufficient to constitute a quorum at the meeting. Participation in a meeting by this means constitutes personal presence at the meeting.
- Section 4.10 <u>Electronic Communications</u>. This corporation recognizes that authenticated electronic communications ("electronic communications") may legally satisfy written record and signature requirements necessary for valid records, signatures, and contracts. Authenticated communications are those communications that set forth information from which the corporation can reasonably conclude that the communication was sent by the purported sender and are delivered to the principal place of business of the corporation, or to an officer or agent of the corporation who is authorized by the corporation to receive the communication. Electronic communications are records that are created, generated, sent, communicated, received or stored by electrical, digital, magnetic, wireless, optical, electromagnetic, or similar technologies. Valid electronic signatures are those signatures that are expressed through an electronic sound, symbol, or process, and that are logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person with intent to sign the record.
- Section 4.11 <u>Action Without a Meeting</u>. Any action that may be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors may be taken without a meeting as set forth in the Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS

- **Section 5.01** <u>Number</u>. The officers of the corporation shall be a President, a Vice President, a Secretary and a Treasurer, and such other officers as may be determined by the Board of Directors. A person may hold more than one office at the same time.
- Section 5.02 <u>Election and Term of Office</u>. The officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors at the annual meeting of the Board in each calendar year. Any officer so elected shall hold office until the annual meeting of the Board of Directors in the next calendar year and until the election and qualification of his or her successor, except in cases of resignation or removal.
- Section 5.03 Qualifications. Officers shall be of legal age, but need not be directors of the corporation. The same person may hold any two offices at the same time.

- **Section 5.04** <u>Compensation</u>. The compensation of the officers of the corporation is subject to review and approval by the Board and must be reasonable in amount for the services rendered. Unless the Board of Directors determines otherwise, the officers of the corporation shall serve without any compensation.
- Section 5.05 Resignation. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice of his or her resignation to the Board of Directors or the President or to the Secretary of this corporation. The resignation of any officer shall take effect at the time, if any specified therein, or if no time is specified therein, immediately upon receipt thereof by the officer of this Corporation to whom it is given; and, unless otherwise specified therein, acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.
- **Section 5.06** Removal. Any officer may be removed, either with or without cause, by a vote of the majority of the total number of directors at any annual or special meeting at which a quorum is present.
- Section 5.07 <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy in any office of the corporation shall be filled by the affirmative vote or action of a majority of the Board members then in office, and the officer so elected shall hold office and serve until the next annual meeting of the Board.
- **Section 5.08** <u>President.</u> The President shall be the chief officer of the corporation and shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. The President shall have and exercise general charge and supervision over the affairs of the corporation; shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the Board of Directors. The President shall be a member of the Executive Committee, if any, and an ex officio member of all other committees.
- Section 5.09 <u>Vice President</u>. In the event of absence or disability of the President, the Vice President shall succeed to the powers and duties of the President. The Vice President shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him or her by the Board of Directors.
- **Section 5.10** Secretary. The Secretary shall be responsible for the maintenance of books and records of the corporation, and shall in general perform all the duties incident to the office of secretary, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, and shall do and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him or her by the Board of Directors.
- **Section 5.11** <u>Treasurer</u>. The Treasurer shall be responsible for all funds and property of the corporation and shall in general perform all the duties incident to the office of treasurer, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, and shall do and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him or her by the Board of Directors.
- Section 5.12 Other Officers, Agents, and Employees. The corporation may have such other officers, agents, and employees as may be deemed necessary by the Board of Directors. Such other officers, agents, and employees shall be appointed in such manner, have such duties, and hold their offices for such terms as may be designated by resolution of the Board of Directors.
- Section 5.13 <u>Bond</u>. The Board of Directors of this corporation shall from time to time determine which, if any, officers, agents and employees of this corporation shall be bonded and the amount of each bond.

ARTICLE VI. COMMITTEES

Section 6.01 Appointment. The Board of Directors may appoint committees as necessary. Committee membership is not limited to directors unless specified in the committee description provided, however, that at least one member of the committee be a director. Committees shall have the powers, duties, and responsibilities and shall be organized as specified in their appointment. Committees are subject to the direction and control of the Board of Directors.

Section 6.02 Executive Committee. The Board of Directors may designate two (2) or more of its directors, at least one of whom shall be the President of the corporation, to constitute an Executive Committee. Only persons who are directors of this corporation shall be eligible for appointment to the Executive Committee. When a member of the Executive Committee ceases to be a director of the corporation, such person shall automatically cease to be a member of the Executive Committee.

Section 6.03 <u>Powers of the Executive Committee</u>. The Executive Committee shall at all times be subject to the direction and control of the Board of Directors. The Executive Committee shall have all the powers and authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the business of the corporation in the interval between meetings of the Board of Directors, except the Executive Committee shall have no authority:

- (1) to elect Directors;
- (2) to elect officers;
- (3) to amend the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws;
- (4) to dissolve the corporation; or
- (5) to act with respect to any other matters specifically reserved by the Board of Directors for itself.

Section 6.04 Meetings of the Executive Committee. If an Executive Committee is established, it shall hold such regular or other periodic meetings, at such times and places, and upon such notice as may from time to time be fixed by resolution adopted by a majority of the members of the Executive Committee. In addition, special meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held whenever called by the President or by one other member of the Executive Committee, upon the same notice as provided for in Section 3.05 hereof, unless excused in accordance with Section 3.06 hereof.

Section 6.05 Quorum. A majority of the total number of members of the Executive Committee (but not less than two) shall be required to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting, and the act of a majority of the members of the Executive Committee present at any meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Executive Committee.

Section 6.06 <u>Additional Committees</u>. The Board of Directors may appoint additional committees including ad hoc committees as necessary.

ARTICLE VII. FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

Section 7.01 <u>Books and Records</u>. The Board of Directors of the corporation shall cause to be kept:

- (1) records of all proceedings of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee, if any; and
- (2) such other records and books of account as shall be necessary and appropriate to the conduct of the corporate business.
- Section 7.02 <u>Documents Kept at Registered Office</u>. The Board of Directors shall cause to be kept at the registered office of the corporation originals or copies of:
 - (1) records of all proceedings of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee, if any; and
 - (2) all financial statements and tax returns of the corporation; and
 - (3) the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the corporation, and all amendments and restatements thereof.
- Section 7.03 <u>Contracts</u>. The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation to enter into any contract or to execute and deliver any instrument in the name of or on behalf of the corporation. This authority may be general or confined to specific instances.
- Section 7.04 <u>Checks and Drafts</u>. All checks, drafts, or orders for payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the corporation, must be signed by the officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation, and in the manner specified by the Board of Directors. In the absence of a determination by the Board of Directors, the instruments must be signed by the Treasurer or the President of the corporation.
- **Section 7.05** <u>Fiscal Year</u>. The fiscal year of the corporation shall be as determined from time to time by the Board of Directors; provided, however, that until such time as the Board of Directors may otherwise direct, the corporation's fiscal year shall commence on the first of January of each year and end on the thirty-first of December.
- Section 7.06 Authority to Borrow, Encumber Assets. No director, officer, agent, or employee of this corporation shall have the power or authority to borrow on its behalf, to pledge its credit, or to mortgage or pledge its property except within the scope and to the extent of the authority delegated by resolutions adopted from time to time by the Board of Directors. The authority may be given by the Board of Directors for any of the above purposes and may be general or limited to specific instances.
- Section 7.07 <u>Application of Funds</u>. No donation, gift or grant made by the corporation shall be used to pay for the overhead expenses of the recipient of the donation, gift or grant.

ARTICLE VIII. INDEMNIFICATION

Section 8.01 General. The corporation shall indemnify its officers, directors, committee members, employees, and agents in the manner set forth in Minnesota Statutes Section 317A.521 (or successor provision), provided the corporation has made such determination or determinations, if any, as it may reasonably require to establish that the standards set forth in Minnesota Statutes Section 317A.521, subd. 2, have been met. In addition, the corporation may, in the sole discretion of its Board of Directors, indemnify such persons or any other person under such circumstances or different circumstances as the Board of Directors shall deem appropriate as long as the Board of Directors reasonably believes such indemnification to be in the best interests of the corporation.

Section 8.02 Advancement of Expenses. If a person is made or threatened to be made a party to a civil, criminal, administrative, arbitration, or investigative proceeding, including a proceeding by or in the right of the corporation, the person is entitled, upon written request to the corporation, to payment or reimbursement by the corporation of reasonable expenses, including attorneys' fees and disbursements, incurred by the person in advance of the final disposition of the proceeding. Prior to any payment or reimbursement, the corporation shall receive a written affirmation by the person of a good faith belief that the criteria for indemnification described in Section 8.01 above have been satisfied and a written undertaking by the person to repay the amounts paid or reimbursed by the corporation if it is determined that the criteria for indemnification have not been satisfied; and the corporation shall make a determination that the facts then known to those making the determination would not preclude indemnification under this section. The written undertaking is an unlimited general obligation of the person making it but need not be secured and must be accepted without reference to a financial ability to make the repayment.

Section 8.03 <u>Rights Not Exclusive</u>. The indemnification provided by this article shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a director, officer, employee, or agent and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, and administrators of such a person. Nothing contained in this article shall affect any rights to indemnification to which the corporation's personnel, other than directors and officers, may be entitled by contract or otherwise under law.

Section 8.04 <u>Insurance</u>. The corporation may buy and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the corporation or who is or was serving at the request of the corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise against any liability asserted against him or her and incurred by him or her in any such capacity.

Section 8.05 <u>Standard of Conduct</u>. Each director and officer shall discharge his or her duties as a director or officer in good faith in a manner which the director or officer reasonably believes to be in the best interests of the corporation and with the care an ordinary prudent person in a like position would exercise under similar circumstances.

ARTICLE X. MISCELLANEOUS

Section 10.01 Corporate Seal. The corporation shall have no corporate seal.

Section 10.02 <u>Amendments</u>. The Bylaws may be amended at any time or from time to time in the same manner as provided in the Articles of Incorporation for amendment of the Articles of Incorporation.
