Located in Plano, Texas, for almost 20 years, Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital Plano (THP) operates 366 beds. The city of Plano is a suburban city north of Dallas. THP offers a broad range of medical services with specialized capabilities in both inpatient and outpatient care. Focused inpatient services include those in the areas of women's services, orthopedics, back and spine, oncology, digestive health, cardiovascular, and pediatric services. THP's freestanding adolescent inpatient psychiatric unit offers inpatient and outpatient psychiatric services to both adolescents and adults. THP also provides a variety of outpatient services including emergency care, ambulatory surgery, diagnostic and rehabilitation services. THP is the market leader in orthopedic services. From injury prevention to advanced surgical procedures, orthopedic and spinal surgeons on the medical staff at THP provide a wide array of treatment options some of which include joint replacement surgery, scoliosis, spinal deformities and spine tumors. Many orthopedic procedures, such as hip and knee replacement, are now performed using minimally invasive techniques, resulting in shorter hospital stays and reduce recovery time. The Margot Perot Center for Women and Infants at THP offers comprehensive services for women including 17 Labor Delivery & Recovery Suites, two dedicated C-Section rooms, a 56 bed postpartum unit, a 20 bed high-risk obstetrics unit and a 45 bed Level III neonatal intensive care unit. Also offered are infertility services (ARTS). The ARTS Program is a member of the Society for Assisted reproductive Technology (SART) and has on-site reproductive laboratories certified by the College of American Pathologists. In addition, THP offers an array of comprehensive services for breast and gynecological cancers. THP has received numerous significant awards and recognition during the past several years. The most recent of which includes designation as an advanced Level III Trauma Facility by the Texas Department of State Health Services. Additionally the hospital has received Magnet designation from the American Nurse Credentialing Center in 2007 and distinction as a 2008 recipient of the prestigious Texas Award for Performance Excellence from Quality Texas Foundation. THP was the first healthcare facility in Collin County to receive this preeminent award and the fourth in the state. Other recent awards include accreditation of its oncology program as an American College of Surgeons Commission on Cancer approved cancer program and recognition for its bariatric surgery program by the American Society for Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery Center of Excellence. Another accolade for the hospital is the recent recipient of the Ivy Award, a national award given by Restaurants and Institutions magazine to a select group of restaurants, hotels and noncommercial food operators that exemplify the highest standards of excellence in food service.
