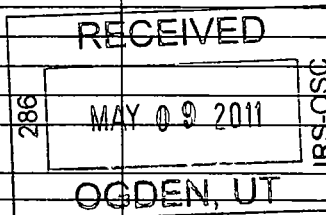

SUMMARY OF DIRECT CHARITABLE ACTIVITIES FOR 2010

ELEVEN DISABLED ANIMALS ARRIVED IN 2010 FROM ACROSS THE COUNTRY. FIVE WERE BLIND, THREE WERE BLIND AND DEAF, AND THREE WERE MISSING LIMBS. THEY CAME FROM MICHIGAN, NEW YORK, VERMONT, PENNSYLVANIA AND LOUISIANA - IN FACT, SIX OF THEM CAME FROM LOUISIANA. IT SEEMS THAT CERTAIN RESCUE GROUPS IN SHREVEPORT AND NEW ORLEANS HAD US ON THEIR SPEED-DIAL LISTS LAST YEAR!

WE HAPPILY ADOPTED OUT 9 OF OUR SPECIAL ANIMALS DURING THE YEAR TO LOVING NEW FAMILIES. WONDERFUL LONG-TIME VOLUNTEERS OF OURS ADOPTED TWO OF THEM, BLIND MOOSE THE LAB AND TIMMY THE THREE-LEGGED SHEPHERD MIX. THE OTHERS WENT TO HOMES IN CALIFORNIA, MICHIGAN, WASHINGTON, COLORADO, CONNECTICUT AND NEW HAMPSHIRE. ONE COUPLE IN CALIFORNIA ADOPTED BLIND AND DEAF GABE FROM US IN MAY AND THEN ADDED THREE-LEGGED ELLA TO THEIR FAMILY IN SEPTEMBER!

ANOTHER OF OUR NOTABLE ADOPTIONS WAS A TINY CHIHUAHUA NAMED ROO WHO WAS BORN WITHOUT FRONT LEGS; SHE WAS WITH US FOR JUST A WEEK BEFORE ONE OF OUR SUPPORTERS IN NEW HAMPSHIRE ADOPTED HER. ROO WASN'T OUR ONLY "INSTANT ADOPTION" - A BLIND COCKER SPANIEL NAMED SUZI WAS HERE FOR JUST ONE WEEK, TOO, BEFORE BEING SCOOPED UP BY A WONDERFUL FAMILY IN CONNECTICUT. ANOTHER COCKER SPANIEL, ONE-EYED SNUGGLES, CAME TO US FROM A NEW YORK HUMANE SOCIETY AND WAS QUICKLY ADOPTED BY A VETERINARY INTERNAL MEDICINE SPECIALIST IN COLORADO!

IN ALL, WE CARED FOR AN AVERAGE OF FIFTY DISABLED ANIMALS DURING THE YEAR, MOST OF WHOM ARE BLIND. EACH OF THEM ENJOYS LIFE TO THE FULLEST, AND NONE OF THEM LETS HIS OR HER DISABILITY GET IN THE WAY.

EVEN AS WE CONTINUED NORMAL SANCTUARY OPERATIONS DURING 2010, WE MADE A MOMENTOUS DECISION TO MOVE FROM THE 160-ACRE RANCH IN MONTANA TO A NEW LOCATION IN NEW HAMPSHIRE. FOR A FULL DISCUSSION OF WHY WE MOVED TO NEW HAMPSHIRE AFTER 10 YEARS IN MONTANA, AND HOW WE CAME TO CHOOSE THIS NEW SPOT, PLEASE SEE OUR BLOG POST FOR APRIL 4, 2010 (BLOG.ROLLINGDOGRANCH.ORG). BUT HERE'S A KEY POINT FROM THAT POST: "TO UNDERSTAND SOME OF OUR THINKING ON THIS, YOU NEED TO KNOW THAT WE BELIEVE GAS PRICES WILL CONTINUE TO RISE SIGNIFICANTLY OVER THE NEXT DECADE OR TWO SIMPLY DUE TO GLOBAL SUPPLY AND DEMAND DYNAMICS. AND BECAUSE OF OUR CURRENT DISTANCE FROM SERVICES - WE'RE 70 MILES FROM VET CLINICS, GROCERY STORES, BANKS, ETC., SO IT'S A 140-MILE ROUND TRIP TO DO ANYTHING - THE COST TO OPERATE THE SANCTUARY FROM THIS REMOTE LOCATION WILL ESCALATE A LOT AS A RESULT. (IT'S GONE UP A LOT ALREADY IN THE 10 YEARS WE'VE BEEN HERE.)"

THUS THE PRIMARY REASON FOR THE MOVE WAS TO BE CLOSER TO SERVICES, WHICH WOULD REDUCE BOTH OUR OPERATING COSTS AND THE TIME SPENT ON THE ROAD. BEING CLOSER TO POPULATION CENTERS HAS PLENTY OF OTHER BENEFITS, TOO, INCLUDING MAKING IT EASIER TO FIND AND RETAIN GOOD EMPLOYEES, WHICH WAS HARD TO DO BECAUSE OF OUR REMOTE LOCATION IN MONTANA.

AND SINCE WE WERE LOOKING FOR NEW PROPERTY, WE WANTED TO END UP IN A PLACE WHERE WE COULD SHIFT FROM A "HOME-STYLE" ENVIRONMENT FOR THE DOGS - WHERE THEY LIVED

IN MULTIPLE COTTAGES AT THE MONTANA RANCH - TO A TRUE "IN-HOME" ENVIRONMENT WHERE THEY COULD LIVE UNDER THE SAME ROOF AS US. NOT ONLY WOULD THAT ADD TO THEIR QUALITY OF LIFE, BUT IT WOULD ALSO SHRINK OUR COST STRUCTURE FURTHER BY ELIMINATING SEVERAL ADDITIONAL BUILDINGS TO HEAT AND MAINTAIN.

ANOTHER GOAL WAS TO FIND A PROPERTY THAT GAVE US THE OPPORTUNITY TO BECOME MORE SELF-SUFFICIENT IN TERMS OF RAISING FOOD FOR THE ANIMALS AND PROVIDING OUR OWN WOOD TO HEAT THE BUILDINGS.

AFTER SEARCHING PROPERTY LISTINGS ACROSS THE COUNTRY, WE FOCUSED ON NORTHERN NEW ENGLAND BECAUSE REAL ESTATE VALUES WERE BY FAR THE MOST REASONABLE WE FOUND. AND THEN WE DISCOVERED JUST THE RIGHT PLACE HERE IN NEW HAMPSHIRE, WHERE THE 120-ACRE PROPERTY SITS AT THE END OF A ROAD, ONLY THREE MILES FROM THE CENTER OF THE BEAUTIFUL TOWN OF LANCASTER. IF "DISTANCE= MONEY + TIME," YOU CAN IMAGINE THE DIFFERENCE WE'RE SEEING IN BEING THREE MILES FROM TOWN, RATHER THAN SEVENTY!

ALTHOUGH WE'VE BEEN KNOWN AS THE ROLLING DOG RANCH ANIMAL SANCTUARY FOR THE PAST TEN YEARS, ONCE WE GOT SETTLED IN LANCASTER WE DECIDED TO CHANGE THE NAME TO ROLLING DOG FARM - IT SEEMED A MUCH BETTER FIT FOR NEW ENGLAND, AND EVERYONE HERE CALLS US A FARM ANYWAY!
