BLAKEMORE FOUNDATION CHARTER

ARTICLE 1. NAME OF FOUNDATION

The name of the Foundation is and shall be the BLAKEMORE FOUNDATION (the "Foundation").

ARTICLE 2. FOUNDATION PROPERTY

Property transferred to and accepted by Griffith Way, as Trustee ("Trustee"), together with all proceeds, investments, reinvestments and income therefrom, shall constitute "Foundation Property."

ARTICLE 3. PURPOSES; BENEFICIARIES; DISTRIBUTIONS

3.1 Purposes. The Foundation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"). The Foundation Property shall be used exclusively for those purposes. The Foundation shall do nothing prohibited by the Code, its regulations, or other applicable legislation governing tax-exempt charitable organizations and organizations which receive tax-deductible donations.

Within these limitations, the specific purposes of the Foundation in order of priority shall be:

(a) To develop grant programs for the study of Asian languages at an advanced level by American citizens or permanent residents, and

(b) To make grants and develop grant programs that will help to improve the understanding of Asian fine arts in the United States.

The terms "grant" or "grants" as used herein shall have the meaning given to them in § 4945 of the Code or the regulations thereto.

Cited sections of the Code refer to existing sections and are intended to apply to corresponding provisions of any future law.

3.2 Beneficiaries. The term "Beneficiary" or "Beneficiaries" as used in this instrument shall mean the following, and shall be limited to the following:

3.2.1 An individual to whom the Foundation makes a scholarship or fellowship grant which is subject to the provisions of § 117(a) of the Code and is to be used for study at any educational organization described in § 170(b)(1)(A)(ii) of the Code, if the requirements relating to individual grants of § 4945(g) of the Code are satisfied;

3.2.2 An individual selected from the general public to whom the Foundation gives a prize or award which is subject to the provisions of § 74(b) of the Code (without regard to paragraph (3) thereof), if the requirements relating to individual grants of § 4945(g) of the Code are satisfied;

3.2.3 An individual to whom the Foundation makes a grant for the purpose of achieving a specific objective, producing a report or other similar product, or improving or enhancing a literary, artistic, musical, scientific, teaching, or other similar capacity, skill, or talent of the grantee, if the requirements relating to individual grants of § 4945(g) of the Code are satisfied; or

3.2.4 An organization described in Code § 509(a)(1), (2), or (3) ("public charities") which is not obligated to exercise expenditure responsibility pursuant to Code § 4945(h).

3.3 Distributions to Beneficiaries.

3.3.1 As Directed by Board. The Foundation Property shall be distributed by Trustee to Beneficiaries upon written instructions from the Board of Managers (the "Board"). Trustee shall not make any distribution requested by the Board if Trustee, with reasonable cause, believes that the recipient is not, or may not be, a Beneficiary.

3.3.2 As Directed by Trustee. If the Board fails to direct the distribution of Foundation Property in accordance with Article 4.4, Trustee shall have the right to distribute amounts sufficient to avoid any taxes on undistributed income as imposed by § 4942 of the Code. This distribution of Foundation Property shall be to the Beneficiary or Beneficiaries selected by Trustee.

3.4 Disqualified Persons. Grants shall not be made to disqualified persons within the meaning of Code Section 4946(a).

ARTICLE 4. BOARD OF MANAGERS

4.1 Membership of Board. The Board shall consist of eight persons. Members of the Board, other than the Trustee, shall serve terms of three years, or initially for such shorter terms as necessary to stagger the terms of Board members over a three-year period, as determined by the Board. If at any time a vacancy occurs on the Board, the other Board members shall select the person who is to fill the vacancy. Persons serving on the Board, other than the Trustee, who have completed their terms may not be re-elected to the Board for a period of at least one year. The Trustee shall serve on the board ex officio.

4.2 Executive Committee. The Board may designate three of its members, one of whom shall be the Trustee, to act as an Executive Committee of the Board. The Executive Committee may act by unanimous vote of its members on any matter which is within the powers of the Board as set forth in Article 4.4 and arises in the regular course of the Foundation's activities between Board meetings. The Executive Committee may meet in person or by telephone, or may communicate and vote by email.

4.3 Meetings of Board. Meetings of the Board must be held at least once in the first six months and once in the last six months of every calendar year. The meetings may be held when notice has been given to all members of the Board and a majority of the members are in attendance. To make any action taken at a meeting effective a majority of those present must assent. Any member may vote by letter as well as personally, but the letter must clearly state the action upon which the vote is cast and the vote. A member wishing to dissent from a decision may do so in writing within thirty days of the decision. The written dissent must be mailed or delivered to the chairperson, who shall place it in the Foundation files.

4.4 Powers of Board. The Board shall have the power and authority to determine the distribution of the Foundation Property, including the determination of all Beneficiaries. The Board shall distribute Foundation Property to accomplish the purposes set forth in Article 3.1 and to avoid subjecting the Foundation to the tax on undistributed income imposed by § 4942 of the Code. The Board shall have the power to amend this instrument at any time if necessary or desirable for the more convenient or efficient administration of the Foundation or to enable Trustee to carry out its purposes more effectively. No such amendment shall change the Foundation in any way which might

(a) alter or enlarge the purposes of the Foundation as set forth in Article 3.1 in a manner not consistent with the requirements applicable to a tax exempt charitable organization under § 501(c)(3) of the Code,

- (b) affect the status of the Foundation as an organization exempt from federal income taxation,
- (c) subject to any excise taxes under §§ 4941 through 4945 of the Code,
- (d) render transfers to the Foundation nondeductible for federal income, estate or gift tax purposes, or
- (e) make any of the income of the Foundation includable in the taxable income of Trustee or the Foundation.

4.5 Good Faith Action by Board. Any and every action taken in good faith by the Board in the exercise of any power, authority, judgment or discretion conferred upon it shall be conclusive and binding upon all persons interested in the Foundation or the Foundation Property.

4.6 Compensation and Expenses. The amount of compensation paid to any member shall not exceed that which is reasonable and necessary to carry out the exempt purposes of the Foundation. Trustee shall set compensation for members for the first three years of the Foundation. Thereafter, the Board shall fix the compensation of the members of the Board. The Board shall fix the compensation of all persons engaged or employed by the Foundation.

4.7 Accounting and Reports. The Board shall make a report annually of its administration of the Foundation. The Board may, but need not, publish the same in an appropriate newspaper in the State of Washington and distribute copies to interested persons, to community service organizations, and to religious, educational, artistic, medical, welfare, and other similar charitable organizations. The Board shall comply with the provisions of § 6104 of the Code to the extent required.

ARTICLE 5. DUTIES OF TRUSTEE AND LIMITATIONS ON POWERS

5.1 Records and Reports. Trustee shall keep accurate and detailed accounts of all investments, receipts, disbursements and distributions, and other transactions of the Foundation. At all reasonable times, the accounts, books and records relating to the Foundation Property shall be open to inspection and audit by the Board or any person designated by it. Trustee shall also furnish to the Board such information as it may reasonably request in regard to the operation and investment of the Foundation Property. Trustee shall, in any event, furnish to the Board, within sixty days after the end of each income tax year, a statement showing total property of the Foundation, income, expenses

and distributions for the preceding tax year, and all related transactions. Trustee shall not be required to comply with the requirements or provisions of the uniform trustees' accounting act or any amendment or amendments, or with any similar act of Washington or any other jurisdiction.

5.2 Investments. In acquiring, investing, reinvesting, exchanging, selling and managing Foundation Property, Trustee shall exercise the judgment and care under the circumstances then prevailing which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not in regard to speculation but in regard to the permanent disposition of their funds, considering the probable income as well as the probable safety of their capital. Within the limitations of this standard, Trustee may acquire and retain every kind of property, real or personal, and every kind of investment.

5.3 Powers. In administering the Foundation Property, Trustee shall, subject only to the limitations on powers contained in this instrument, have and exercise all of the power, authority and discretion which the absolute owner of the Foundation Property could exercise. Trustee shall also have all of the power, authority and discretion given a trustee under the laws of the State of Washington, including without limitation the Washington Trust Act, Ch. 11.98 RCW. The provisions of all such laws are incorporated in this instrument.

5.4 Limitation on Powers. In creating the Foundation, it is intended that any transferor shall obtain the full benefit of any income tax charitable contribution deduction to which the transferor may be entitled under the Code, and any estate tax charitable contribution deduction to which the transferor's estate may be entitled under the Code. It is further intended that a transfer to the Foundation qualify for the charitable contribution deduction available under Code §§ 170, 2055, and 2522 and the regulations thereunder. Accordingly, the Foundation shall be interpreted, valued, managed and invested consistent with this intent.

5.5 Agents and Attorneys. Trustee may employ such agents and attorneys as Trustee may find necessary or advisable for the proper administration of the Foundation or in connection with any uncertainty, controversy or litigation which may arise. Trustee shall pay reasonable compensation to such agents and attorneys for their services.

5.6 Compensation; Expenses. The amount of compensation paid to Trustee shall not exceed that which is reasonable and necessary to carry out the exempt purposes of the Foundation. The Board shall fix the compensation of the Trustee. Trustee shall be entitled to reimbursement out of Foundation Property for payments and distributions Trustee makes and for all special costs and reasonable administrative expenses. All costs

and expenses shall be charged to the income of the Foundation to the extent allowed by § 4942 of the Code.

5.7 Resignation of Trustee; Appointment of Successor Trustee. Trustee shall have the right to resign as Trustee without court proceedings by giving written notice to that effect to the Board. Trustee shall have the right, without court proceedings, to appoint a successor Trustee, subject to the approval of the Board. No successor Trustee shall be liable for the acts or omissions of any prior Trustee. If a Trustee shall resign, die or otherwise, as determined by the Board, be unable to discharge the responsibilities of the Trustee without having named a successor Trustee, the successor Trustee shall be designated by the Board.

ARTICLE 6. MISCELLANEOUS

6.1 Reliance on Agents and Attorneys. Trustee and the Board shall be fully protected in relying upon the advice of legal counsel on questions of law. Trustee and the Board shall not be liable for loss or damage caused by any agent or attorney selected, if reasonable care was exercised in selecting and retaining such agent or attorney.

6.2 Contributions from Others. If any person or persons at any time desire to make gifts, bequests or devises to the Foundation, power and authority is conferred upon the Trustee to receive such gifts, bequests or devises. The Board shall apply the principal and income of such gifts to the purposes of the Foundation. Such gifts, bequests or devises shall not, however, be made upon any terms or conditions that would conflict with the uses or purposes of the Foundation or the provisions of this instrument. Restrictions in such gifts, bequests or devises may be agreed to by the Trustee in conjunction with the Board.

6.3 Creation of Corporation. The Board is authorized and empowered, if it so desires, to form and organize a corporation for the uses and purposes of the Foundation. Such corporation, if organized, shall be named the BLAKEMORE FOUNDATION. Upon the creation and organization of such corporation, the Board, as well as Trustee, is authorized and empowered to convey, transfer and deliver to such corporation all the property and assets to which the Foundation may be or become entitled. The powers and duties of, and the restrictions and prohibitions applicable to, the Board and Trustee under this instrument shall apply to such corporation and its board of directors.

6.4 Law Governing; Savings Clause. The provisions of this instrument shall be governed by the law of the State of Washington. Any provision which is prohibited by

law or is unenforceable shall be inoperative. All of the remaining provisions shall, nevertheless, be carried into effect.

6.5 Bond Waiver. No bond, surety or other security shall be required of Trustee or any Board member in any jurisdiction for any purpose.

6.6 Extent of Liability. Trustee and the Board members shall have the duty to act in good faith and with reasonable care, and in the absence of affirmative evidence to the contrary, shall be deemed to have so acted.

ARTICLE 7. DURATION OF FOUNDATION

7.1 Duration. The term of the Foundation shall be perpetual.

7.2 Termination by Board. If the Board determines that the purposes of the Foundation can no longer be met, or would be better satisfied by other means, the Foundation can be terminated by a unanimous vote. Upon the winding up and dissolution of the Foundation, after payment or adequate provision for the debts and obligations of the Foundation, the Board shall distribute the Foundation Property to such nonprofit funds, foundations or corporations which then are duly qualified tax exempt charitable organizations under § 501(c)(3) of the Code as the Board in its discretion shall select. Determination of Beneficiaries, as well as other steps in the termination, shall comply with § 507 of the Code or the corresponding provisions of any future law so as to avoid any termination taxes.

7.3 Rule Against Perpetuities. If it is determined by a court of law that the Foundation is subject to the rule against perpetuities, the Foundation shall terminate, and the distribution described in Article 7.2 occur, one day earlier than the expiration of the maximum period permitted under applicable law. The lives in being are the children of the partners and associates of the law firm of Perkins Coie, living on the date of the execution of this instrument.

ARTICLE 8. PROHIBITED ACTS AND TRANSACTIONS

Notwithstanding any provision of this instrument, Trustee, Trustee's employees, the Board, the Foundation and Foundation employees are prohibited from

(a) engaging in any act of self-dealing as defined in § 4941(d) of the Code,

(b) retaining any excess business holdings as defined in Code § 4943(c), which would subject the Foundation to tax under Code § 4943,

(c) making any investments which would subject the Foundation to tax under Code § 4944,

(d) making any taxable expenditures as defined in Code § 4945(d),

(e) allowing any part of the Foundation's net earnings to inure or be payable to or for the benefit of any private individual so as to jeopardize the Foundation's exempt status under § 501(c)(3) of the Code,

(f) carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation which would jeopardize the Foundation's exempt status under § 501(c)(3) of the Code, and

(g) participating in, or intervening in (including the publishing or distributing of statements), any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for political office which would jeopardize the Foundation's exempt status under 501(c)(3) of the Code.

ARTICLE 9. INDEMNIFICATION

9.1 Right to Indemnification. The Foundation shall indemnify and hold harmless, to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law as it presently exists or may hereafter be amended, any person who was or is made or is threatened to be made a party or is otherwise involved in any action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (a "Proceeding"), by reason of the fact that such person is or was a Member of the Board or a Trustee of the Foundation (an "Indemnified Person"), against all liability and loss suffered and expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by such Indemnified Person in connection with such Proceeding. Notwithstanding the preceding sentence, except as otherwise provided in Section 9.4 of this Article 9, the Foundation shall be required to indemnify an Indemnified Person in connection with a Proceeding (or part of such Proceeding) commenced by such Indemnified Person only if the commencement of such Proceeding (or part of such Proceeding) by the Indemnified Person was authorized in advance by the Board of Managers.

9.2 Restrictions on Indemnification. The Foundation may not indemnify any Indemnified Person for: (a) acts or omissions of the Indemnified Person finally adjudged

to be intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of law; (b) conduct of the Indemnified Person finally adjudged to be in violation of such Indemnified Person's fiduciary duties; or (c) any transaction with respect to which it was finally adjudged that such Indemnified Person personally received a benefit in money, property or services to which the Indemnified Person was not legally entitled or if the Foundation is otherwise prohibited by applicable law from paying such indemnification.

9.3 Expenses Payable in Advance. The Foundation shall pay the reasonable expenses (including attorneys' fees) incurred by an Indemnified Person in defending any Proceeding in advance of such Proceeding's final disposition (such expenses, "Advanced Expenses"), provided, however, that, to the extent required by law, such payment of Advanced Expenses in advance of the final disposition of the Proceeding shall be made only upon receipt of an undertaking by the Indemnified Person to repay all Advanced Expenses if it should be ultimately determined that the Indemnified Person is not entitled to be indemnified under this Article 9 or otherwise. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing in this Section 9.3, the Foundation shall not be required to pay any Advanced Expenses to a person against whom the Foundation directly brings a claim alleging that the Foundation is not required to indemnify such person under Section 9.2 of this Article 9.

9.4 Written Statement Required and Right of Indemnified Person to Bring Suit. An Indemnified Person seeking indemnification pursuant to Section 9.1 or Advanced Expenses pursuant to Section 9.3 must first submit to the Board of Managers a sworn statement requesting indemnification or Advanced Expenses, as the case may be, and reasonable evidence of all such amounts requested by such Indemnified Person (such statement, a "Claim"). If (a) a Claim pursuant to Section 9.1 above is not paid in full by the Foundation within 60 days after such Claim has been received by the Foundation, or (b) a Claim pursuant to Section 9.3 above is not paid in full by the Foundation within 30 days after such Claim has been received by the Foundation, then the Indemnified Person may at any time after the expiration of the applicable period bring suit against the Foundation to recover the unpaid amount of such Claim. If an Indemnified Person succeeds in whole or in part in any such suit or in a suit brought by the Foundation to recover Advanced Expenses pursuant to the terms of an undertaking, then such Indemnified Person is also entitled to receive reimbursement from the Foundation for the expense of prosecuting or defending such suit. The Indemnified Person shall be presumed to be entitled to indemnification under this Article 9 upon submission of a Claim (and, in an action brought to enforce a Claim for Advanced Expenses, where the required undertaking has been delivered to the Foundation), and, thereafter, the Foundation shall have the burden of proof to overcome the presumption that the Indemnified Person is so entitled.

9.5 Nonexclusivity of Rights. The right to indemnification and Advanced Expenses conferred by this Article 9 shall not be exclusive of any other right that any person may have or acquire after the effective date of this Charter under (a) any statute, (b) common law, (c) provision of this Charter, (d) by general or specific action of the Board of Managers, (e) by contract or (f) otherwise.

9.6 Insurance, Contracts and Funding. The Foundation may maintain insurance, at its expense, to protect itself and any director, officer, partner, trustee, employee or agent of the Foundation or Another Enterprise against any expense, liability or loss. The Foundation may enter into contracts with any Board Member, officer, partner, trustee, employee or agent of the Foundation in furtherance of the provisions of this Article 9 and may create a trust fund, grant a security interest or use other means (including, without limitation, a letter of credit) to ensure the payment of such amounts as may be necessary to effect indemnification and Advanced Expenses as provided in this Article 9.

9.7 Indemnification of Employees and Agents of the Foundation. The Foundation may, by action of the Board of Managers, grant rights to indemnification and advancement of expenses to employees and agents or any class or group of employees and agents of the Foundation (a) with the same scope and effect as the provisions of this Article 9 with respect to the indemnification and Advanced Expenses of Board Members and officers of the Foundation or (b) as are otherwise consistent with law.

Blakemore Freeman Fellowships 2011 Grant Guidelines

Blakemore Freeman Fellowships are awarded for one year of advanced level language study in East or Southeast Asia in approved language programs. For grants to be awarded in spring 2011, study must start between June 2011 and May 2012.

Grants are *highly* competitive. Last year we were able to fund less than 9% of applicants.

Selection Criteria

- A focused, well-defined career objective involving Asia in which regular use of the language is an important aspect
- The potential to make a significant contribution to a field of study or area of professional or business activity in an Asian country
- Prior experience in the Asian country or involvement or participation in activities related to the country
- Good academic, professional or business background, appropriate to the career program

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for a grant, an applicant must:

- Be pursuing an academic, professional or business career that involves the regular use of a modern East or Southeast Asian language
- Have a college undergraduate degree
- Be at or near an advanced level in the language as defined below in "Definition of Advanced Level" (minimum requirement is fluency equivalent to 3 years of college-level study of the language)
- Be able to devote oneself exclusively to language study during the term of the grant; grants are not made for part-time study or research
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident of the United States

"Professional or business career" includes, but is not limited to, careers in computer science, engineering, international business, journalism, law, medicine, NGO work, and teaching.

Definition of Advanced Level

An applicant for a Blakemore Freeman Fellowship must have:

- A minimum of three academic years of regular language study at the college level (example: completed 3rd year Chinese); or
- A minimum of one academic year of full-time intensive language study at the college-level

For **Korean**, we recommend study at Seoul National University (<http://lei.snu.ac.kr/site/en/klec/main/main.jsp>), Yonsei University (<http://www.yskli.com/index.asp>) or Sogang University (<http://klec.sogang.ac.kr/>). We will consider study at other Korean language programs on a case-by-case basis during the application review process.

Approval of language programs for study of languages of SE Asia will be considered on an individual basis during the application review process.

Application and Acceptance by Language Program

It is the applicant's individual responsibility to apply to the language program which he or she lists on the Blakemore Freeman Fellowship application. The Foundation does not apply for the applicant. Applicants may list only one language program on the application.

Blakemore Freeman Fellowships are awarded contingent upon the applicant's unconditional acceptance by the language program for which the fellowship is awarded. Example. an applicant applying to the IUP-Tsinghua program must successfully pass the IUP's oral exam and not be required by the IUP to complete a summer program as a prerequisite to academic year admission.

No grants are available for study in the United States.

Private Tutorial Programs

If there is no approved advanced-level language program available in a country, an applicant may propose a program combining study in an ordinary language program supplemented by private tutorials. If no language program exists at all in the country, an applicant may propose a program of full-time tutorials

Length of Program

Blakemore Freeman Fellowships are made for one year of full-time language study. This may include study in the summer immediately preceding or following an academic year program. The Foundation encourages applicants who are applying for an academic year program to include a summer term in their application. The inclusion of a summer term does not affect the selection process.

Extensions of Grants

Under normal economic conditions, the Foundation is open to reasonable requests for a grant extension. A request can be made at any time during the course of a grant, explaining the reasons for the extension and accompanied by evidence of good standing in the applicant's current language program. The request may be submitted by email and should be directed to Griffith Way, Trustee.

Please note that we cannot guarantee that funding for grant extensions will be available for the 2011-2012 year.

Applicants who wish to attend a summer term preceding or following their academic year should include the summer term in their application in order to guarantee funding

Dates of Study and Deferral Policy

Study must start between June of the year of award and May of the following year. No deferrals of grants will be permitted.

Residency Requirement

Blakemore Freeman Fellows are expected to remain in the study country during the entire period of their grant, except in the event of an emergency. Therefore, a Blakemore Freeman Fellow should not plan to return to the United States for Christmas or other holiday periods.

We encourage Blakemore Freeman Fellows to use holidays and school breaks for modest travel within their study country and to use these opportunities to expand their language usage outside the classroom.

Conflicting Activities

Blakemore Freeman Fellows must devote full-time to language study and not engage in any conflicting activities during the period covered by their grant.

Part-time employment, teaching English, extensive research on a dissertation or involvement in other projects which could hamper full-time study are not permitted.

Recreational, educational or cultural activities which do not interfere with full-time study are encouraged, particularly during school and holiday breaks

U.S. Income Tax Liability

All grant funds from the Blakemore Foundation are taxable for U.S. income tax purposes unless the recipient qualifies for some type of exclusion or deduction.

The treatment of Blakemore language grants for tax purposes is the recipient's individual responsibility. No income tax is withheld from the stipend and grant recipients are responsible for making any required estimated tax payments. Please see IRS Publication 970 *Tax Benefits for Education* and Form 1040-ES for more information. Because of the variety of individual situations, we recommend applicants discuss their own individual case with a qualified tax advisor.

Amount of Grant

Blakemore Freeman Fellowships are intended to cover basic expenses at a graduate student level necessary to pursue a year of full-time language study in Asia, including tuition or tutoring fees, plus a stipend for travel, living and study expenses

The stipend for Blakemore Freeman Fellowships is paid periodically over the course of the grant and may be used for the following types of expenses:

- Round-trip airfare, economy class
- Books and study materials related to language program
- Housing/utilities
- Food and ordinary daily living expenses
- Local commuting
- Travel within country during holidays and school breaks
- Health insurance/medical evacuation insurance
- Immunizations appropriate for country
- Visa application fees

- Income taxes due on taxable portion of grant
- Other fees or expenses required by language program or approved by the Trustee

It is up to each Blakemore Freeman Fellow to budget the stipend funds to cover necessary costs. Thus it is to his or her advantage to obtain as low an airfare as possible in order to have more funds for travel, books, etc. Stipend funds may not be used to cover expenses of an accompanying dependent.

Unused stipend funds must be returned to the Foundation at the end of the grant.

Grant Disbursement

Tuition for the language program is covered in full by the grant and is paid directly to the language program by the Blakemore Foundation. Tutoring fees, if applicable, are reimbursed to the Blakemore Freeman Fellow based on monthly expense reports and receipts.

The stipend for travel, living and study expenses is disbursed to the Blakemore Freeman Fellow at intervals over the course of the grant. Adjustments to stipend may be considered if exchange rates or living expenses alter significantly during the period covered by the grant

Required Reports

Blakemore Freeman Fellows must submit a monthly financial report of expenditures of the stipend along with a letter reporting on their activities during the preceding month. They must also submit two longer progress reports to the Foundation during their fellowship, the first report being due at mid-year, and a second report just prior to the end of their grant. A statement regarding the expenditure of the stipend on forms provided by the Foundation must be provided at the end of a Blakemore Freeman Fellowship. The Foundation must be provided with an official transcript from the language program at which the student is enrolled for each academic period covered by a Blakemore Freeman Fellowship. The transcript should list courses taken and grades received or progress made.

Blakemore Refresher Grants 2011 Grant Guidelines

Blakemore Refresher Grants provide funding for short-term language study for periods of six weeks (minimum) or longer (but less than an academic year).

Grants are *highly* competitive. Last year we were able to fund less than 9% of applicants.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for a grant, an applicant must:

- Be a member of one of the following groups:
 - Former Blakemore Freeman Fellows;
 - Professors who are teaching in an Asian field at a university or college in the United States and post-doctoral professionals whose degree is in an Asian field;
 - Graduates of the regular academic-year programs at the Inter-University Center in Yokohama, Japan, the Inter-University Program for Chinese Language Studies at Tsinghua University in Beijing, China, and the International Chinese Language Program at National Taiwan University in Taipei, Taiwan.
- Be pursuing an academic, professional or business career that involves the regular use of a modern East or Southeast Asian language
- Have a college undergraduate degree
- Be at an advanced level in the language
- Be able to devote oneself exclusively to language study during the term of the grant; grants are not made for part-time study or research
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident of the United States

"Professional or business career" includes, but is not limited to, careers in computer science, engineering, international business, journalism, law, medicine, NGO work, and teaching.

Selection Criteria

- A focused, well-defined career objective involving Asia in which regular use of the language is an important aspect
- The potential to make a significant contribution to a field of study or area of professional or business activity in an Asian country
- Prior experience in the Asian country or involvement or participation in activities related to the country
- Good academic, professional or business background, appropriate to the career program

Application to Language Program is Applicant's Responsibility

It is the applicant's individual responsibility to apply to the language program which he or she lists on the Blakemore Refresher Grant application. The Foundation does not apply for the applicant. Applicants may list only one language program on the application.

Approved Language Programs

Blakemore Refresher Grants will be awarded for advanced-level language programs in Asia that are a minimum of six weeks up to a period less than an academic year.

- For Japanese, we award grants for study at the Inter-University Center for Japanese Language Studies in Yokohama, Japan (IUC). We do not fund Japanese language study at other programs.
- For Chinese, we award grants for study at the Inter-University Program for Chinese Language Studies at Tsinghua University (IUP) or the International Chinese Language Program at National Taiwan University (ICLP). We do not fund Chinese language study at other programs.
- Approval of language study programs for Korean and languages of SE Asia will be considered on an individual basis during the application review process.

Private Tutorial Programs

If there is no appropriate advanced-level language program available in a country, an applicant may propose a program combining study in an ordinary language program supplemented by private tutorials. If no language program exists at all in the country, an applicant may propose a program of full-time tutorials.

Dates of Study and Deferral Policy

Study must start between June of the year of award and May of the following year. No deferrals of grants will be permitted.

Residency Requirement

Blakemore Refresher Grant Fellows are expected to remain in the study country during the entire period of their grant, except in the event of an emergency.

We encourage Blakemore Refresher Grant Fellows to use holidays and school breaks for modest travel within their study country and to use these opportunities to expand their language usage outside the classroom.

Conflicting Activities

Blakemore Refresher Grant Fellows must devote full-time to language study and not engage in any conflicting activities during the period covered by their grant.

Part-time employment, teaching English, extensive research on a dissertation and involvement in other projects which could hamper full-time study are not permitted.

Recreational, educational or cultural activities which do not interfere with full-time study are encouraged, particularly during school and holiday breaks.

U.S. Income Tax Liability

All grant funds from the Blakemore Foundation are taxable for U.S. income tax purposes unless the recipient qualifies for some type of exclusion or deduction.

The treatment of Blakemore language grants for tax purposes is the recipient's individual responsibility. No income tax is withheld from the stipend and grant recipients are responsible for making any required estimated tax payments. Please see IRS Publication 970 *Tax Benefits for Education* and Form 1040-ES for more information. Because of the variety of individual situations, we recommend applicants discuss their own individual case with a qualified tax advisor.

Amount of Grant

Blakemore Refresher Grants are intended to cover basic expenses at a graduate student level necessary to pursue full-time language study in Asia, including tuition or tutoring fees, plus a stipend for travel, living and study expenses

The stipend for Blakemore Refresher Grants is paid periodically over the course of the grant and may be used for the following types of expenses:

- Round-trip airfare, economy class
- Books and study materials related to language program
- Housing/utilities
- Food and ordinary daily living expenses
- Local commuting
- Travel within country during holidays and school breaks
- Health insurance/medical evacuation insurance
- Immunizations appropriate for country
- Visa application fees
- Income taxes due on taxable portion of grant
- Other fees or expenses required by language program or approved by the Trustee

It is up to each Blakemore Refresher Grant Fellow to budget the stipend funds to cover necessary costs. Thus it is to his or her advantage to obtain as low an airfare as possible in

order to have more funds for travel, books, etc. Stipend funds may not be used to cover expenses of an accompanying dependent.

Unused stipend funds must be returned to the Foundation at the end of the grant.

Grant Disbursement

Tuition for the language program is covered in full by the grant and is paid directly to the language program by the Blakemore Foundation. Tutoring fees, if applicable, are reimbursed to the Blakemore Refresher Grant Fellow based on monthly expense reports and receipts.

Required Reports

A Blakemore Refresher Grant Fellow must submit a monthly financial report of expenditures of the stipend, along with a letter reporting on activities during the preceding month. One or more longer progress reports will also be required during the grant period. A statement regarding the expenditure of the stipend on forms provided by the Foundation must be provided at the end of the grant. The Foundation must be provided with an official transcript from the language program at which the Fellow is enrolled for each academic period covered by a Blakemore Refresher Grant. The transcript should list courses taken and grades received or progress made.

Frances Blakemore Asian Art Grants

The Frances Blakemore Asian Art Grant program has been temporarily suspended. The Foundation is not accepting unsolicited applications for funding at this time.

The Blakemore Foundation is continuing its annual grants to the Seattle Art Museum for the museum's internship program for University of Washington art history graduate students in East Asian art.

When the Frances Blakemore Asian Art Grant program is reinstated, grants will be made only to tax-exempt organizations in the United States such as museums, universities and other educational or art-related institutions for programs, exhibits or publications that improve the understanding of Asian fine arts in the United States. No art grants will be made to individuals.

For purposes of the art grant program, "Asian" is limited to the countries of China, Japan, Korea, Burma, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Thailand, Malaysia, Vietnam, Philippines, Mongolia and Tibet. "Fine arts" refers to paintings, graphic arts, ceramics, sculpture, textiles and photography.

The Blakemore Foundation will not make grants for:

- Endowment purposes
- General operating or regular curriculum expenses
- Capital projects, including the acquisition or collection of art
- General administrative or overhead expenses of the applicant
