

Ladies and Gentlemen:

As part of Stanford's comprehensive campaign, The Stanford Challenge, we hereby pledge to give to THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE LELAND STANFORD JUNIOR UNIVERSITY ("the Board"), an educational institution, the sum of Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000). Our gifts in payment of this pledge will be in the form of cash, marketable securities or other property acceptable to the Board.

We intend to make gifts in payment of this pledge totaling Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000) on or before 31 December 2010. These gifts may, for investment purposes, be merged with any of the general investments assets of Stanford University, but they shall be entered in the University's books and records as an endowed fund known as the Kistler Prize, which will recognize original contributions to the understanding of the connection between the human genome and human society. Conditions for the prize and the use of the income from the endowment follow.

1. The Kistler Prize will be awarded either annually or biennially depending upon the qualifications of the nominations made for it;
2. The award will consist of a minimum of US\$100,000.00 cash prize and a specially designed 180-gram gold medallion seated in a leaded glass sculpture;
3. The prize is named for Walter P. Kistler, originator of the prize and benefactor of the endowment that supports it;

4. There shall be an advisory committee consisting of all living former Kistler Prize winners, the holder of The Walter P.  - a. the advisory committee will be staffed by members of the Science and Engineering Resources Group and the Office of Communications and Development, both of the Stanford University Libraries;
 - b. the advisory committee will consider nominees to the Kistler Prize and advise the University Librarian of Stanford University which person or persons should receive the award; the actual decision regarding the recipient of the prize will be made by the University Librarian;



- B. prepare an exhibit each year to be shown in the Kistler-Ritso Museum of Occupations in Tallinn, Estonia;
- C. promote scholarship and appreciation of the human spirit in achieving and maintaining freedom under adverse circumstances;
- D. hire and supervise a qualified curator or bibliographer to achieve these purposes;
- E. provide direction and consultation to Kistler-Ritso Museum, and travel to Tallinn annually by the curator or bibliographer as well as other relevant officers of the Stanford University Libraries;
- F. coordinate programs with, benefit from and therefore establish and maintain cordial working relationships with the officers and staff of the Kistler-Ritso Museum and relevant Estonian officials. The Stanford University Librarian will serve as Stanford representative on the board of Kistler-Ritso Foundation in Estonia. In addition,
- G. the endowment is meant to fund aspects of this program, including preservation and processing of materials gathered for the Stanford University Library collections that would be used in the exhibits;


