

- C. promote scholarship and appreciation of the human spirit in achieving and maintaining freedom under adverse circumstances;
- D. hire and supervise a qualified curator or bibliographer to achieve these purposes;
- E. provide direction and consultation to Kistler-Ritso Museum, and travel to Tallinn annually by the curator or bibliographer as well as other relevant officers of the Stanford University Libraries;
- F. coordinate programs with, benefit from and therefore establish and maintain cordial working relationships with the officers and staff of the Kistler-Ritso Museum and relevant Estonian officials. The Stanford University Librarian will serve as Stanford representative on the board of Kistler-Ritso Foundation in Estonia. In addition,
- G. the endowment is meant to fund aspects of this program, including preservation and processing of materials gathered for the Stanford University Library collections that would be used in the exhibits;

An advisory committee will be established at Stanford consisting of at least one Hoover Fellow, several Stanford faculty whose specialties are relevant to the principal subjects of the Museum, and such external advisors as the University Librarian shall designate (including also heirs of the Kistlers);
 - i. The advisory committee will be appointed by the University Librarian and will submit its advice to him/her periodically.

If, in the opinion of the Board, changed circumstances should occur in the future such that one or more of the above purposes is no longer appropriate, then the Board shall consult with the President Sylvia Kistler Thompson and trustees of the Kistler-Ritso Foundation, Seattle, as to an appropriate alternative purpose. If the Foundation is no longer in existence, then Sylvia Kistler Thompson or, if she is deceased or is not otherwise available, one of Sylvia Kistler Thompson's children, designated by her, shall

be consulted as to the alternative purpose. The Foundation and Sylvia Kistler Thompson understand that this provision is common in gift agreements with the Board but is rarely employed because, as is anticipated in this instance, the original purpose is usually appropriate for a long time. It is expected that the person to be consulted in case of a change of circumstances will update the Board from time to time as to contact information so proper consultation can be made, if needed.

Although we certainly intend to make gifts in full payment of this pledge by the time indicated above, this pledge is not to be considered legally binding on us, our estate(s), or our heirs.
