General Statement – Math Science Nucleus provides science and math curriculum to help educators provide high quality materials free online. Our mission is to increase science and math especially in the elementary grades. We also maintain an environmental center that provides free field trips for schools in Alameda County and we manage the Children's Natural History Museum in Fremont to support public education of science and math.

4A Environmental Efforts working with Alameda County to do programming at Tule Ponds at Tyson Lagoon includes 100 free field trips (1/2 low income) conduct service learning and community service for high school students in the south bay including projects with Irvington HS in their environmental change program (last 10 years), conduct free monthly lectures, special tours, and teacher inservices. Also 2 main events during the year. we also assist the City of Fremont on projects like Sabercat Creek, Duc Island and Mission Creek. Total people about 10,000

4B Developing science and math curriculum using classes and field trips as ways to develop new material, materials are available online including free storybooks and slideshows. We also developed for Fremont Unified School District a new program called Helping Hands Science in 16 schools. continued Dana Ramondi Math Program over 7000 users per day for the curriculum (free online) students in Fremont Unified 15,000

4C The Children's Natural History Museum continues to develop exhibits and lecture series that highlights the Ice Age Fossils of the area. We did about 150 field trips and working with Madera County on their fossils. We developed a Fremont Learning Corridor Concept Plan to include the site of the fossils. Total people impacted 5250 children and parents. We expanded and redid some of the exhibits and rooms at a cost of about \$25,000.00
