#### **2011 EDUCATION GRANT GUIDELINES**

As of January, 2011 the Fleishhacker Foundation is implementing a new framework for the Precollegiate Education grantmaking program. The only program area that will be funded for the next three years is a **Literacy Initiative** for elementary school students (grades K-5). Grants will be awarded only to Bay Area-based programs whose work is primarily focused on providing literacy services to students.

For the first grant round in 2011, a core group of prior grantees was invited to submit materials for new grant consideration. The application form includes general organizational and financial information; a supplemental narrative description of the literacy program(s) is also required. The applications do not need to be framed in a project-specific manner beyond supporting core literacy activities. A second group of organizations may be invited for the fall grant cycle, depending upon how much funding is available after the spring grants are awarded.

By focusing our limited dollars in one core area, we believe our funding can have more impact on the field. The Foundation will also be able to deepen its expertise in this area and better share knowledge gained through the important work of our grantees.

We are undertaking the Literacy Initiative in recognition of the educational achievement gap of at-risk students, particularly those in large urban school districts with low-income backgrounds. We will be supporting programs that improve early reading readiness, grade-level attainment by the end of third grade, and students leaving 5<sup>th</sup> grade ready for the more challenging work of middle and high school (including college preparatory courses) – all key markers for future success in school and life. This is a difficult time of diminished resources for public education and great stresses on the system. The Foundation's Education Committee believes that the new focus area is the most effective way at this time to help those who are making a long term difference in the educational lives of disadvantaged children in our community.

#### **Priorities for the new Literacy Initiative include:**

- To focus funding on a core competency in elementary school education which affects the future educational and life opportunities of each child;
- To help students who are behind, or in danger of falling behind, improve their reading and writing skills;
- To support disadvantaged students, primarily those attending public schools, in achieving grade-level competency.

## **Grantmaking Criteria:**

- Grants will primarily be made to nonprofit community-based organizations providing direct literacy services to students;
- Priority will be given to school-day, classroom-based programs, and those serving a significant number of students;
- The first round of Literacy Initiative grants will be awarded to organizations that have received prior funding from this Foundation;
- Multi-year grants may be awarded to organizations that demonstrate consistent programmatic strength and the capacity to track efficacy from year-to-year;
- Grants will be awarded to organizations whose primary overall mission is academic support for disadvantaged and/or at-risk students, whose programming is largely concentrated in this area;
- Spring cycle grants will be for the upcoming school year, while fall cycle grants may be used in the current school year.

#### **Exclusions:**

Grants will not be made to individual public, independent, or parochial schools. However, nonprofit organizations which raise funds for and provide literacy services to individual schools (in the public or private sectors) may be considered in future grant cycles.

Grants will not be considered for other types of academic support programs (e.g. math or science), arts education, career-development, homework help, study skills, or general afterschool enrichment programs.

#### **Future Prospects:**

Grants for teacher professional development are not the Foundation's current priority, but may be considered on a case-by-case basis if they are specifically literacy-based and serving a large number of teachers.

While we intend to award 2011 Education Grants to past grantees, we wish to remain open to 501c3 organizations not previously funded and will consider a limited number of these groups for 2012 and 2013 grants.

## ARTS GUIDELINES & APPLICATION PROCEDURES

#### **HISTORY**

In 1988, the Mortimer Fleishhacker Foundation (established in 1947) merged with the Janet and Mortimer Fleishhacker Foundation. The two are now jointly administered as the Fleishhacker Foundation. The two fields the Foundation supports are: **Arts & Culture**, and **Precollegiate Education** (schools and programs at the K-12 level). Assets are approximately \$13 million. Correspondence should be addressed to Christine Elbel, Executive Director.

## **GRANT PROGRAMS IN THE ARTS**

## Eureka Fellowship Program

The Foundation offers an unrestricted fellowship program for visual artists. Artists must be nominated by a local nonprofit arts organization to qualify. Awards of \$25,000 per artist are determined by a review panel of non-Bay Area arts experts. The process of selecting artists for the 2008 – 2010 fellowships has been completed. General applications are not accepted.

## **Special Arts Grants**

Periodically grants which exceed the scope of the Small Grants Program are considered. Applicants must have budgets larger than \$750,000, and be able to clearly demonstrate the project's potential for broad and long-term impact, which might involve: facility access or use; community-wide program initiatives; or exceptional projects of major-budget institutions. Community benefit and enhancement of an arts discipline are primary considerations for grants made in this program. Grants generally do not exceed \$25,000. All potential applicants must contact the Executive Director well in advance of the two annual grant deadlines (see Page 3) to determine the advisability of submitting a proposal. These grant proposals are 4 to 6 pages of narrative, plus attachments (no form is required).

Applications for large capital facility projects (campaigns over \$1 million total) are not considered, though smaller renovation or equipment requests are eligible. Endowment requests are not considered.

## **BOARD DISCRETIONARY GRANTS**

Board members may periodically use limited discretionary funds to support programs of special interest. Such grants are not open to application.

#### PRECOLLEGIATE EDUCATION

Separate guidelines are available for this program serving K-12 schools. Please request them before preparing an application.

## **Application Guidelines**

#### **FUNDING PRIORITIES**

The majority of the Foundation's arts grantmaking takes place through this program. The particular emphasis of the Small Grants Program is to support the development and presentation of the work of living Bay Area artists. New work is the first priority, however retrospectives and classical repertory of non-living artists will be considered.

Grants may be awarded for: artists' fees for creative time; production costs for performances or film/video projects; exhibition/installation costs for visual, media, or interdisciplinary arts projects; activities that contribute to overall artistic development; and efforts to strengthen an organization's artistic impact within the community.

The Foundation seeks to fund a broad range of arts groups during the course of each year. It strives to make grants that represent a diversity of arts disciplines, aesthetic sensibilities, and forms of cultural expression. The Foundation generally priorities the proposals that best support working artists. Only nonprofit arts organizations may apply for funding; individual artists are not eligible for grants through this program.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

#### Applicants must be:

- arts and cultural organizations incorporated as not-for-profit [501©(3)];
- organizations residing and offering programming in the greater San Francisco Bay Area;
- able to demonstrate a consistent artistic presence in the Bay Area for at least 3 years;
- of budget size between \$100,000 and \$750,000.

## Not eligible are:

- programs/projects whose fundamental purpose or benefit falls within the social services, health, youth, or community development fields;
- individuals (unless conducting a project under the sponsorship of an eligible nonprofit organization see next page);
- organizations based outside the greater San Francisco Bay Area;
- deficit financing, endowment campaigns, major capital campaign requests (campaigns over \$10 million).

## **REVIEW CRITERIA**

The most important factors considered in making a grant through this category are:

- How would our grant help advance the body of work being developed by the principal artist(s)?
- Is there an audience for this work?
- What is the contribution to the community at large?
- What is the potential impact on the arts discipline involved?
- How viable is the applying organization?
- Does the applicant use its resources efficiently and well, seeking to collaborate and pool resources when appropriate?
- Is there evidence of a strong Board of Directors and community support for the organization?

#### FISCAL SPONSORSHIPS

When using a fiscal sponsor, the applicant must have entered into a written agreement with that sponsor which delineates responsibilities for accounting procedures, fiscal oversight, and grant reporting. To be eligible for a grant, the sponsoring nonprofit organization's mission and ongoing programming must correlate with those of the sponsored project.

A letter of sponsorship summarizing the specific nature of this agreement must accompany the application. The budget figures of the sponsor organization go on the application form. Applicants should also attach a simple financial summary of the activities of the last completed year, if they are available. Also attached should be the sponsor's organizational budget, financial report, and board list as noted in the attachments section of Page 3.

Film applicants: please refer to the additional application instruction sheet provided with our guidelines.

#### **APPLICATION PROCESS**

Grants are between \$1,000 and \$10,000, and normally in the \$2,500 - \$5,000 range. The grant period is one year from the date of Board of Directors approval. The Small Grants in the Arts program is designed to support a variety of organizations over time, rather than to provide annual funding for a specific group of organizations.

In order to review an application, the Foundation needs the following.

- 1) Completed application form.
- 2) Complete project budget with projected income and expenses. (If request is project-specific.)
- 3) Current year's organizational budget, separating grants, board, and other contributions, and itemizing expenses.
- 4) Financial statement for the last completed fiscal year, using the California Cultural Data Project format (www.caculturaldata.org),
- 5) Evidence of tax-exempt status.
- 6) Sample film or video clip required for film proposals (of the work for which funding is being sought), with postage-paid return envelope and optional notation of tape's contents. Film clips of performances are optional.
- 7) Filmography is required for film directors; brief artistic biographies are helpful for other project-related applications.
- 8) Board of Directors list with affiliations.
- 9) Copy of Letter of Agreement with Fiscal Sponsor (if applicable).

Note: do not bind or staple application materials, use paper clips, only 12 point type. The Foundation cannot review extensive proposal packets. Additional materials must be limited, and may include: a brochure or newsletter; performance reviews; letters of support; or video clip of performances. These materials are not required to complete the application, except that a film sample is required of film applicants. Work samples will be returned if a stamped mailing envelope is provided (although the Foundation keeps films it funds).

All applicants will receive written confirmation of receipt of their proposal, and of the action taken on the request. Please allow up to four weeks for each notification. When an applicant is using a fiscal sponsor, all communication is sent to the sponsor organization which in turn communicates with the sponsored project.

There are two grant cycles each year:

Application deadline **January 15** for May decisions; Application deadline **July 15** for November decisions.

Note: these are postmark deadlines; please mail applications via regular mail.

Note: If deadline falls on weekend or holiday, next business day postmark is accepted.

## **Application Guidelines**

Due to economic uncertainties, at the current time the Foundation plans to make more limited grants for timely, core needs of arts organizations. Proposals for new programs or expansion activities will not be accepted, unless they are vital to the organization's health (applications from new applicants to the Foundation will be accepted). The main priority for the near future will be mid-sized arts organizations.

Periodically grants which exceed the scope of the Small Grants Program are made to groups with budgets greater than \$750,000. The project must clearly demonstrate potential for broad and long-term impact on the local community and the art form involved. This might involve: facility access or use, community-wide program initiatives, or exceptional artistic projects. Not eligible are capital campaigns over \$1 million and endowment campaigns. Grants normally do not exceed \$25,000.

Applicants to the Special Arts Grants category should sumit the <u>application form</u> and required attachments: project budget, organizational budget, last year's financial statement, board list with affiliations, and brief supporting materials.

To apply, contact the Foundation's Executive Director well in advance of the two annual application deadlines -- January 15 and July 15 - to approve submission of a grant proposal. This contact can be made by phone or email.

As of the July 15, 2009 application deadline, the Fleishhacker Foundation will require applicants to submit financial information through the California Cultural Data Project. Organizations should contact the CCDP at www.caculturaldata.org to register and complete their informational profiles, or call 866 9-CAL-CDP.

# FLEISHHACKER FOUNDATION FILM & VIDEO GRANTS

The Fleishhacker Foundation makes grants to film projects through the Small Grants in the Arts program. The Foundation is more interested in supporting an artist's vision than educational documentaries. The Foundation only funds the post production phase of the project (i.e. principal photography is complete and a rough cut of the current work is available). Most grants are in the range of \$1,000 - \$5,000. Artists may only apply once for any given film project. Expenses to purchase capital equipment should not be included in the project budget.

Artists may apply at any point in their careers; but *film students are not eligible*. Artists must fill out a Small Grants in the Arts Application for funding to complete a current project, and they must have a nonprofit *fiscal sponsor organization*. A letter from the fiscal sponsor stating the terms of its agreement with the artist must be included with the grant application. Artists who keep annual financial records for their own production company should also attach their most recent financial statement. *Filmmakers should answer only the questions on the application form that pertain to their project and ignore questions not relevant* (those that are applicable to organizational applicants). Applicants may *add a brief additional narrative* (see application guidelines).

There are two review cycles per year. Postmark deadlines are January 15 for late April/early May decisions, and July 15 for late October/early November decisions. Be sure to review current application guidelines (available online) before applying.

The required attachments are: a film sample (see below), a filmography, and a complete project budget for the film, with post production expenses broken out. Any income received should also be noted. If the fiscal sponsor organization is not the San Francisco Film Society or the Bay Area Video Coalition, then we need the sponsor's organizational materials: annual organizational budget, last year's financial statement, board of directors list, and tax-exempt status letter. In all cases the letter of project sponsorship must be included. Please note that all the Foundation's communication goes through the fiscal sponsor, which is responsible for informing filmmakers of the status of their grant proposals, and for insuring that final grant reports are completed on time.

The arts review committee will assess the project's artistic clarity and craft from the work sample, a full rough cut of the piece for which funding is sought. A completed past film in a similar style as that of to the proposed project may also be submitted. All work samples should be clearly labeled and identified, with a return postage-paid mailer if the artist wants it returned. Applicants may also include an explanation of the work sample if they wish.
