### Reg. §53,4945-4(d)(1) Disclosure Statement of Individual Grant-Making Procedures

Pursuant to IRC §4945(g), Reg. §53.4945-4(d)(1) and Rev. Rul. 86-77, 1986-1 C.B. 334, the Hawaii Emergency Physicians Education Foundation (the "Foundation") hereby submits the following disclosure of its individual grant-making procedures and hereby requests advance approval thereof.

#### 1. The Selection Process - Candidates for Grants.

#### (a) Goal.

The Foundation's goal is to reorient students and young adults from certain geographic areas in the State of Hawaii away from future non-productive and potentially criminal lives and create productive citizens by providing financial aid and supportive services to individual students to encourage their college or trade school education. The Foundation is seeking high risk students, fully realizing that some of these students will not complete their undergraduate studies, but hoping to realize multiple benefits to society from those who succeed (off welfare, out of criminal activities and generally non-productive lives, etc.), and believing that such potential benefits far outweigh the financial cost to the Foundation of those students who do not complete their undergraduate studies. The Foundation's objective is to "break the cycle", to take men and women whose future appears limited, who would probably be on welfare or end up in jail and to hopefully turn them into productive taxpaying citizens.

#### (b) Criteria.

- (i) For each school year, the Foundation intends to make \$1,000 per year scholarship grants to students beginning his or her university, college or community college studies that school year, and who is a graduate from a high school in each of the geographical areas served by the following three hospitals:
  - (A) Castle Medical Center, Kailua, Hawaii;
  - (B) Wahiawa General Hospital, Wahiawa, Hawaii; and
  - (C) Hilo Hospital, Hilo, Hawaii.
- (ii) Students selected must be those who without this assistance would not attend college and whose families would otherwise be unable to

financially support them through college. The Foundation is not seeking "A" students or even good students who would otherwise attend college or community college, but students who without this assistance would find themselves on welfare, in criminal activities or in generally non-productive lives.

#### (c) How Solicited.

The Foundation or the selection committee chosen by the Administrative Committee from each of the above-listed hospitals, will request that each area high school recommend students or former students meeting the above criteria.

#### (d) How Selected.

The Foundation's Board of Directors, or a selection committee chosen by the Administrative Committee from each of the above-listed hospitals, will select the students or former students from each of the three above-mentioned geographic areas to receive a \$1,000 scholarship grant for the following school year.

#### 2. Terms and Conditions under which the Foundation Makes Individual Grants.

The terms and conditions of each scholarship grant will be contained in a letter sent to each recipient. The recipient will be required to communicate his or her acceptance thereof by a letter to the Foundation or the Administrative Committee of the specific hospital. The terms and conditions include:

- (a) Each recipient will have made living arrangements away from home acceptable to his or her college counselor. For example, in the case of a student attending the University of Hawaii, it is anticipated that the student will live in University housing.
- (b) Each recipient must take the equivalent of not less than 15 credits per semester with all courses to be approved by his or her college counselor. It is anticipated that courses selected, especially during the first year, will be those in which the recipient can reasonably expect to receive passing grades. In special cases the Foundation may allow the student to take less than 15 credits.
- (c) With exceptions for illness and other emergencies, each recipient must agree to attend all classes, complete all papers on timely basis, and sit for all exams.
- (d) Payment of the scholarship grants will be made out to both the student and the particular educational institution.

#### 3. Procedure for Exercising Supervision over Individual Grants.

With respect to individual scholarship grants, the Foundation will arrange to receive a transcript of the recipient's courses taken and grades received for each academic period. Such transcript will be verified by the educational institution attended and will be obtained at least once a year, and prior to renewing any recipient's grant for the following academic year. Upon completion of a recipient's study at an educational institution, a final transcript will also be obtained.

## 4. Procedures for Investigation Where Diversion of Grant Funds from their Specified Purposes is Indicated, and for Recovery of Diverted Grant Funds.

Where reports to the Foundation or other information (including failure to submit reports after a reasonable time has elapsed from their due date) indicates that all or any part of individual scholarship grant funds are not being used for the purposes of such grant, the Foundation will initiate an investigation. While conducting the investigation, the Foundation will withhold further payments to the extent possible until it has determined that no part of the grant has been used for improper purposes and until any delinquent reports have been submitted.

If the Foundation determines that any part of a grant has been used for improper purposes, the Foundation will take all reasonable and appropriate steps to recover diverted grant funds or to insure the restoration of diverted funds and the dedication of any remaining grants funds being held for the recipient to new scholarships being funded by the Foundation. These steps will include legal action unless such action would in all probability not result in the satisfaction of execution of a judgment.

If the Foundation determines that any part of the grant has been used for improper purposes and the recipient has not previously diverted grant funds to any use not in furtherance of a purpose specified in the grant, the Foundation will withhold further payments on the particular grant until:

- (i) it has received the recipient's assurances that future diversions will not occur:
- (ii) any delinquent reports have been submitted; and
- (iii) it has required the recipient to take extraordinary precaution to prevent future diversions from occurring.

If the Foundation determines that any part of the grant has been used for improper purposes and the recipient has previously diverted Foundation grant funds, the Foundation will withhold further payment until all three conditions of the preceding sentence are met and the diverted funds are in fact recovered and restored.
