**1. Applicant's educational history, including:** • High School courses taken • ACT and/or SAT scores • Rank in class (If no rank, either a rank estimate or decile in which the student falls) • Grades received (9th grade up to and including the spring semester of senior year, should include mid-semester grades) • Regents marks, when available. Junior college transfer applicants must include a complete community/junior college transcript • Graduate School scholarship applicants must supply all undergraduate transcripts (up to and including mid-semester grades for spring semester of senior year, if still an active undergraduate student)

2. Award money will be deposited with the college to cover tuition, college expenses, fees, books, instructional supplies, and living expenses. Living expenses for non-resident students must be validated by the institution.
3. The student must remain fully matriculated at a college or university in New York, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, Vermont, Connecticut, or New Hampshire to retain the award. • The Four-Year \$8,000 scholarships will be paid at the rate of \$2,000 per year, directly to the four-year college or university. • The Two-Year \$2,000 scholarships will be paid at the rate of \$1,000 per year, directly to the junior or community college. • The Junior College \$4,000 scholarship will be paid at the rate of \$2,000 per year, directly to the four year college or university. • The Graduate or Professional School \$4,000 scholarship will be paid at the rate of \$2,000 directly to the graduate college or university.
