 Recreation/Youth Development Program: The department offers year-round, after-school and summer activities that teach at-risk children such skills as teamwork, commitment, discipline, sportsmanship and respect. Relationships with staff and volunteers are the key to success. Ultimately the children and youth gain self-confidence while experiencing what it means to be winners in life. Typical attendance during the school year varies from 75 to 125 a day; during the summer, 125 to 150 a day. Programs include: arts; crafts; music; drama; dance; outdoor recreation; camping; sports and games; leadership development; hobbies; clubs; and special events.

 Family Services and Counseling: Individual and family behavioral counseling and support groups, plus life and social skills development classes teach youth how to make positive choices. Emergency assistance is offered to low-income families, but a strong emphasis is placed on helping families break the cycle of poverty through commitment to intensive, long-term case management. Family Services highlights include providing Christmas baskets (food and gifts) to over 85 families and back-to-school supplies to over 100 children. Counseling includes group-counseling sessions (5-10 children/youth per group) and individual counseling sessions with clients in case management.

 Educational Opportunities: The program is divided into two major components: school-age programs and the College Scholars program. Elementary, middle and high school programs include tutoring, homework help, computer lab, and an emphasis on reading and math readiness. The College Scholars program includes preparatory activities as well as financial aid and counseling support to capable, motivated youth who desire a higher education but are limited by family hardships. For the academic year ending May 2011, there were 19 partial scholarships and young people attending such colleges as Asbury, Jefferson Community College, Marietta College, Western Kentucky, University of Louisville, and University of Kentucky.


