

# **Artist's Biography**

George McNeil was born February 22, 1910 in New York City. His early studies at the Brooklyn Museum brought him in contact with the "Societe Anonyme" which included such artists as Picasso, Matisse, Duchamp, Picabia and others. With this inspiration, McNeil won a scholarship at the Art Students' League in Manhattan and entered the General Art Program at Pratt Institute, Brooklyn, NY. He first encountered Hans Hofmann at the Art Students' League and served as monitor and teaching assistant in Hofmann's school in 1936-37. This places him at the forefront of the pre-emergent movement of American Abstract Expressionism and thus at the highest echelons of artists working in that most significant and seminal way. McNeil was a founding member of American Abstract Artists which promoted the nascent artistic movement to museums, galleries and critics. As a WPA artist, he worked on the Federal Art Project with Willem deKooning and James Brooks. At the New York World's Fair in 1939 George McNeil was one of only five exhibiting non-objective artists.

McNeil began an illustrious, nearly 50 year career in education with Han Hofmann's school, earned a Doctorate in Education from Columbia University and taught at the university level, culminating in 33 years at Pratt Institute and 15 years at the New York Studio School of Painting, Drawing and Sculpture.

George McNeil worked assiduously in the studio and exhibited in numerous galleries and museums nationwide throughout his career. He participated in the landmark exhibitions "Abstract and Surrealist Art" in 1947 at the Art Institute of Chicago and "Abstract Art in America" in 1951 at the Museum of Modern Art in New York. He was featured in the Charles Egan Gallery in New York which included such Abstract Expressionist artists as Philip Guston, Willem de Kooning, Franz Kline and Robert de Niro, Sr. and continued to exhibit locally in New York as well as nationally and internationally in various galleries and museums. His work has been acquired by numerous corporate and private collections, as well as more than 40 museums, notably the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York; The Museum of Modern Art, New York; The National Gallery of Art, Washington, DC; and The Whitney Museum of American Art, New York.

George McNeil accumulated numerous awards and fellowships for his work including a Ford Foundation Purchase Award in 1963 and a Guggenheim Fellowship in 1969. He was elected to the American Academy of Arts and Letters and received honorary doctorates from Pratt Institute and the Maryland Institute College of Art. He died on January 11, 1995.

# **Comparable and Related Analysis:**

Although the European artist Wallissy Kandinsky is often credited with the earliest non-objective painting, Hans Hofmann was instrumental in an early shift of these abstract ideas to America where the great movement of Abstract Expressionism flourished. George McNeil was already grounded in cubism and early abstraction when he joined Hofmann in extending and developing to the fullest this new style of painting. In the post World War II era of art history the most remarkable strides were made by American artists who developed the Abstract Expressionist style. Jackson Pollock, Franz Kline, and Hans Hofmann are among the most renowned of the practitioners. Directly related is Figurative Expressionism in which McNeil was a pioneer. Willem de Kooning, Philip Guston, Jan Muller and Bob Thompson are among the better known related artists of that style.

The values for the works of these artists rank among the highest in the world. George McNeil was a peer to these painters and knew many of them personally. He participated in some of the earliest and most important exhibitions of abstract art in America and exhibited concurrently with other first generation abstract artists in New York City during the 1950's at the Charles Egan Gallery and various museum shows. The aesthetic quality of his finest work ranks on a par the other leaders of abstract art but for comparable aesthetics there can be a wide range of values. Therefore, while prices for McNeil paintings have been stabilized in the ranges cited, there exists significant growth potential.

"Penance", 1964, oil on linen 56" x 52" was painted during a peak in George McNeil's life. He was hitting his stride as a painter, and his facility with his medium enabled him to give free reign to his creativity. Just as his early work with non-objective abstraction helped lay the foundation for the Abstract Expressionist movement, so too did the figurative expressionist style enable a whole generation of figurative expressionists of the 1980's. While comparable paintings of similar style, size and period have fetched higher prices, "Penance" lacks an exhibition record and shows a few minor conservation problems. Therefore the value is diminished somewhat. In excellent condition, this painting would be valued in the \$60-65,000 range but current conditions warrant a slight down-grade. However, it remains a strongly successful work of art and with the added provenance of it's inclusion in the collection of The University of Wyoming, Art Museum, Laramie, WY and the necessary conservation work it should easily hold its value and potentially grow in the future.
