By-laws of the Bloomington Amateur Hockey Association

Approved April 18, 2011

ARTICLE I NAME

Section 1.1 Name

The name of the organization shall be the Bloomington Amateur Hockey Association, which shall also be referred to as "BAHA"

Section 1.2 Mission

The Mission of the Bloomington Amateur Hockey Association is to ensure that all youth hockey players in Bloomington have the opportunity for fair access to hockey-related resources in our city. We do this by providing a forum for the Jefferson and Kennedy youth hockey associations to collaborate on areas of mutual interest and manage together the off-ice operations and common resources in our community.

Section 1.3 Vision

We will manage our core operations of Advertising, Concessions and Tournaments at the Bloomington Ice Garden responsibly. Each of these operations will generate income that will be distributed annually to the Jefferson and Kennedy youth hockey associations to support the specific needs of those programs. We will distribute ice time and training resources at the Bloomington Ice Garden equitably, allowing each association to develop their players and improve their hockey programs. We will seek out new opportunities to support our related associations and strive to increase the value we return to them.

Section 1.4 Values

- Cooperation The Jefferson and Kennedy youth hockey associations understand that only by working together will both become stronger
- Collaboration We will take advantage of opportunities that might not be available to the Jefferson and Kennedy youth hockey associations individually
- Fairness We will distribute the resources entrusted to us in a fair, equitable and agreed upon manner
- Stewardship We will manage our resources and operations in a way that returns value to the Jefferson and Kennedy youth hockey associations

Section 1.5 Associations

There are two Minnesota Hockey affiliate associations which are members of BAHA. Their boundaries correspond to the attendance areas of the two public high schools in the City of Bloomington. They each have their own booster club and Board of Directors and govern hockey operations for their association.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

Section 2.1 Admission

A member shall be any:

- Youth who is a member of the Jefferson or Kennedy Hockey Associations
- Parent or guardian of any youth member
- Coach of any Jefferson or Kennedy Hockey Association team
- Any person serving BAHA, as determined by the Board

Section 2.2 Duration

The BAHA year is defined as the period from June 1 to May 31 of the following year. Membership in BAHA ends at the end of every BAHA year. Members who join another Minnesota Hockey affiliated organization other than the two related Associations shall automatically be removed from membership in this organization. The BAHA year shall also be the fiscal year of the organization.

Section 2.3 Dues/Assessments/Fees

The Board shall have the authority to levy dues, assessments, or fees upon the members or related Associations in amounts determined from time to time, and it shall determine the methods of collection.

Section 2.4 Removal and Suspension

The Board has the power to remove or suspend from BAHA any member who disrupts the normal activities of BAHA. Removal or suspension shall occur without any form of refund to the member. Reasons for removal or suspension shall include, but not be limited to, repetitive disruptive actions during any organization sponsored activities, or repetitive disobeying of the game rules related to contact or fair play. The Board shall determine the duration of the suspension.

ARTICLE III ANNUAL MEETING

Section 3.1 Annual Meeting

The regular annual meeting of the members shall be held in May of each year. It shall be at such a time and place as the Board may determine, for the purpose of naming directors, receiving a report on the activities and financial condition of the organization, and for the transaction of such other business as shall come before the meeting.

Section 3.2 Special Meeting

Special meetings of the members shall be held whenever called by three or more members of the Board or the President. A meeting can also be called if at least 10% of the members sign, date and deliver to the President or Treasurer one or more written demands for a meeting describing the purpose for which it is to be held. The Board shall cause a special meeting to be called and held on notice no later than 30 days after receipt of the demand.

Section 3.3 Notice of Annual and/or Special Meetings

Notice of each Annual and/or Special meeting shall be posted on the BAHA website not less than 10 days before the meeting.

Section 3.4 Quorum

A quorum is present when at least seven (7) voting members are present.

Section 3.5 Voting

All members can attend the Annual and Special meetings but only members who are 18 years and older are eligible to vote. Eligible members can vote at Annual or Special meetings. Each eligible member has only one vote. Each eligible member must be present to vote. Proxy voting or voting by mail shall not be permitted.

ARTILE IV BOARD

Section 4.1 General Powers

The property, business and affairs of the organization shall be managed by or under the direction of the Board of Directors. The Board is responsible for overall policy and direction of the organization and may delegate responsibility for day-to-day operations to the President and/or Board-designated committees.

Section 4.2 Responsibilities

Cooperate with the policies and functions of the City of Bloomington.

Provide a single point of contact for the related Association with the City of Bloomington regarding operational issues within the Bloomington Ice Garden

Financial Planning and Policies. This shall include any fund raising done within the confines of the Bloomington Ice Garden.

Scheduling of Ice Time. Ice time shall be divided proportionately as approved by the Executive Committee.

Operation of the Midwest Regional Holiday Tournaments, the Bloomington Squirt Tournament, the Bloomington Girls Tournament, the Bloomington Classic C Tournament, the Bloomington Mite Jamboree and all other tournaments operated for the benefit of BAHA members.

Operate the concession stands at the Bloomington Ice Garden.

Contractual authority as necessary to operate BAHA.

The selling of Advertising space in the Bloomington Ice Garden.

Distribution of excess profits from BAHAs business operations to the two related associations after assuring that an appropriate reserve fund exists for future operations. Distributions will be approved by the Executive Committee and ratified by the full Board of Directors.

Section 4.3 Size

The Board shall have 12 members. An equal number will be from each of the two associations. This balance shall be maintained at all times. The Board shall include, the President/Chief Executive Officer, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, Ice Coordinator, Concessions Director, Kennedy President and Vice President, Jefferson President and Vice President, and Director of Tournaments.

Section 4.4 Compensation

The members of the Board shall receive no compensation other than for reimbursement of reasonable expenses directly incurred for the benefit of BAHA.

Section 4.5 Meetings

The Board shall meet one a month, at an agreed upon time and place. A meeting may be canceled if the President determines that a majority of the Board members support the cancellation or it determined a quorum is not available. Business of the Board may be conducted electronically via e-mail, subject to ratification at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting.

Section 4.6 Quorum

A quorum at each Board meeting is satisfied by a simple majority of the Board members in attendance before business can be transacted or motions made or passed

Section 4.7 Notice

Each Board member shall be notified at least 2 days in advance of a meeting

Section 4.8 Special Meetings

Special meetings of the Board may be called upon the request of the President or one-third of the members of the Board. Notices of special meetings must be given in writing or electronically via e-mail to each Board member at least 7 days in advance, unless waived by all Board members.

Section 4.9 Appointments

Appointment of Board members will occur at the May annual meeting. The new Board will serve for the following BAHA year. BAHA Board members are appointed on behalf of the two related Associations by their President. Prior to the start of the BAHA year, each President shall appoint four (4) BAHA representatives from their general membership. These positions will include either the President or the Vice President (1), either the Treasurer or the Secretary (2) and two of the following positions; Ice Coordinator, Concessions Coordinator, Advertising Coordinator or Tournament Director (3 and 4). The position of BAHA President will alternate annually between the two related Associations. The equal balance between Kennedy and Jefferson members must be maintained at all times.

Section 1.10 Qualifications

Board members are expected to act in one of the following capacities: Board Officer (President, Vice President, Secretary or Treasurer) chair a committee defined by the President, act in a capacity designated by the President or act in a capacity defined by a resolution of the Board.

Section 4.11 Terms

All Board members shall serve one year. Board members can serve more than one term.

Section 4.12 Resignation

A Board member may resign at any time by giving notice to the President and the President of their home association.

Section 4.13 Absences

A Board member shall be dropped from the board if s/he has four absences from Board meetings within a twelve month period. The Board member can petition the Board to not be dropped by identifying reasons for the absences. A majority of the Board must approve the absences in order to keep from dropping the Board member.

Section 4.14 Termination

A Board member may be removed at any time by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Board members

Section 4.15 Vacancies

A majority of Board members may appoint a new Board member at any Board meeting.

ARTICLE V OFFICERS

Section 5.1 Officers and Duties

The officers of the organization shall be a President/Chief Executive Officer, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary and such other officers as may be appointed by the Board.

Section 5.2 Election and Term of Office

Officers shall be appointed by the Presidents of the related Associations and shall hold office for one year or until the expiration of their Board member term, whichever is less. Officers can resign by notification to the Board and the President of their home association.. An officer can be removed by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Board members.

Section 5.3 President/Chief Executive Officer

The President/Chief Executive Officer shall:

- enforce all policies, rules and resolutions of the organization
- sign and deliver in the name of the organization deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts or other instruments pertaining to the business of the organization except in which authority to sign and deliver is required by law to be exercised by another person or is expressly delegated by the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws to another officer or agent of the organization
- be responsible for overall operation control of the organization
- have general active management of the business of the organization
- call, convene and preside over Board and annual meetings
- make appointments to all committees subject to the approval of the Board
- be a member ex-officio of all committees
- perform other duties prescribed by the Board

Section 5.4 Vice President

The Vice President shall:

- succeed to the powers and duties of the President in the event of the absence of the President
- Oversee management of the Bloomington Ice Garden Concession operations
- Coordinate team pictures and Blade Day
- Oversee tournament planning and operation
- Assist the President with special projects
- Oversee advertising sales and operations at the Bloomington Ice Garden

Section 5.5 Treasurer

The Treasurer shall:

- Keep accurate financial records of the organization
- Deposit money, endorse and deposit drafts and checks in the name of and to the credit of the organization in the banks and depositories designated by the Board
- Disburse corporate funds and issue checks and drafts in the name of the organization
- Prepare detailed financial statements for the year to date at each meeting of the Board and at the Annual meeting
- Monitor performance to budget for the organization
- Suggest an appropriate amount for an annual distribution to the related Associations after assuring an adequate reserve fund for BAHAs future business needs
- Perform other duties as requested by the President
- Succeed to the powers and duties of the President in the event of the absence of the President and Vice President

Section 5.6 Secretary

The Secretary shall:

- Keep the minutes of the annual, special and monthly meetings of the organization and the Board
- Maintain records of the organization
- Maintain the organizations website
- Distribute communications to the organizations members
- Send out meeting announcements
- Distribute copies of minutes and the agenda toe each board member
- Perform other duties as requested by the President

 Succeed to the powers and duties of the President in the event of the absence of the President, Vice President and Treasurer

Section 5.7 Other Officers

The Board may identify other officers as deemed necessary for the operation and management of the organization, each of whom has the powers, rights, duties, responsibilities and terms as may be determined by resolution of the Board.

Section 5.8 Delegation

Unless prohibited by a resolution adopted by the Board, an officer may, with approval of the Board delegate some or all of the duties and powers of an office to other persons.

ARTICLE VI COMMITTEES

Section 6.1 Committees

Committees may be appointed by the President or by resolutions passed by the Board. Committees are subject at all times to the direction and control of the Board.

Section 6.2 Executive Committee

An Executive Committee made up of the Jefferson and Kennedy Presidents along with the BAHA President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer is empowered to act for the Board between regularly scheduled meetings. A minimum of 5 members of the Executive committee must be present for any action to be taken.

The Executive Committee, shall annually recommend for ratification at the June BAHA board of directors meeting:

- an agreed upon fund reserved for future BAHA operations
- an agreed upon division of the previous years distribution of profits from BAHA operations
- an agreed upon manner in which ice is to be proportionately divided between the two associations for the upcoming season

ARTICLE VII GAMING

This Article was deleted effective June 21, 2009, and is reserved for future use.

Section 7.1 Gaming

A separate gambling bank account and separate gambling records shall be maintained. All gambling activities shall be supervised by the Gambling Manager. The organization Treasurer shall have no authority or control over gambling operations, funds, bank accounts or reporting.

All members may vote on gambling issues with any fund request raised from the floor being automatically tabled until the next month meeting. All Minnesota statutes and rules for gambling operations shall be adhered to.

Section 7.2 Audit Committee

An Audit Committee consisting of the Committee Chairman, Vice President and other Board members as selected by the President is created for the purpose of overseeing the charitable gambling operations conducted by the Organization to assure compliance with State rules and regulations.

ARTICLE VIII BOOKS OF RECORD

Section 8.1 Organizational Records

The organization shall keep at both its designated office and/or on the website correct and complete copies of its

- Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws
- Minutes of meetings of the Board and Annual and Special meetings

Copies of the Accounting records will be kept only at its designated office.

ARTICLE IX INDEMNIFICATION

Section 9.1 Indemnification

The organization shall indemnify Board Members and persons acting on BAHAs behalf to the full extent permitted by the Minnesota Nonprofit Organization Act, and shall have the power otherwise to indemnify Board Members and persons acting on BAHAs behalf for such expenses and liabilities, in such manner, under such circumstances, and to such extent as permitted by applicable law.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

Section 10.1 Amendments

Amendments to the Articles of Incorporation and these Bylaws must be approved by a two thirds majority of all Board Members currently holding office.

April 18, 2011.
