Eligibility:

Three year fellowships will be awarded on a competitive basis to graduates of medical schools and graduate schools in the biological sciences holding M.D. or Ph D degrees. Awards will be based solely on the quality of the individual applicant's previous accomplishments and on the merit of his/her proposal for postdoctoral research. All U.S. citizens are eligible to apply with no restrictions on the laboratory of their choice. Foreign applicants will be eligible for study in U.S. laboratories. We are especially interested in supporting individuals who wish to change their field of research by bringing new ideas and methods from one area of biology to another. This might be carried out during a second postdoctoral term or as in independent research associate.

a. **Purpose of Grants:**

The Life Sciences Research Foundation (LSRF) was founded to provide an alternative to the usual forms of corporate support for research in academic institutions. Most companies have primarily supported research projects with some prospects for short term commercial application. Now, by means of its Peer Review Committee and the overview provided by its Founding Board, the Foundation offers donors an inexpensive and professionally grounded means for directing aid to individuals based solely on their merit. The sponsors have no say in choosing the fellows nor in targeting their research project. A sponsor will receive no patent rights or rights on refusal from the work of fellows bearing the sponsor's name, though recipients will be invited to visit company facilities and report early results of research at annual meetings of the Foundation's fellows. The Foundation's goal is to strengthen research and training in all areas of the life sciences.

b. <u>How Solicited</u>:

In the spring of each year, an application notice is sent to every graduate school in biology and every medical school in the U.S. This list is obtained from the "Graduate Programs and Admissions Manual, Volume A" put out by the Graduate Record Examination Board. This same application sheet is sent to all applicants who write or call LSRF. The deadline for applications is October of each year for funding beginning as early as summer of the following year.

c. How Selected:

Application: (to be submitted in 3 copies) - The front page of the application must include name, date of birth, citizenship, present address, telephone number, position, location and name of supervisor of proposed research, title of project and a one paragraph summary of the project. The front page should be followed by a curriculum vitae and description of the research project. In addition, the candidate is responsible for having three letters of commendation from faculty members familiar with the candidate's research sent to LSRF. The proposed advisor must acknowledge acceptance of the candidate and the willingness of the institution to administer the award. This letter should indicate the role expected of the candidate in the broad framework of the advisor's research noting the size of the research group and the degree of independence that the candidate will have. 2. Terms and Conditions Under Which the Foundation Makes Individual Grants

The grant constitutes a fellowship grant which is to be used by the recipients at the U.S Laboratory of their choice. Each awardee is given a topic of research in the life sciences. The purpose of the grant is to train and support high quality young scientists in the very best research environments.

A fellowship of \$56,000 per year is used to pay salary, fringe benefits, travel to the laboratory and annual meeting. It is also expected to support the fellow's research expenses.
