

These funds are treated as assets and liabilities on the books of the Foundation.

Unrestricted community funds help meet the most pressing and changing needs of the community. Grants from donor advised funds are generally made upon the recommendation of donors, after review and approval by the Foundation. Twice each year the Foundation distributes a list of selected funding requests to fund advisors that includes a broad range of charitable projects. These and other funding ideas are made available on the Foundation's website. Distributions from designated funds are made to carry out the charitable intentions expressed by donors at the time the gifts were made.

Funds not used in the manner specified in the letter agreement, project, may be retained by the Foundation or be approved for reallocation by the Foundation. Grants awarded but unpaid are cancelled. The grant recipient must agree to notify the Foundation of any change in its exempt status and any change that may be proposed by the IRS. Donor advised funds. Foundation staff reviews all grant recommendations and follows additional due diligence procedures to assure that grants are made to qualified charities for proper purposes and impermissible material benefits to donors are not present. Grant recommendations are processed and approved (or denied) in accordance with the Foundation's Donor Advised Fund Guidelines. All grants from donor advised funds are reported to the Board of Trustees on a quarterly basis. Grants to qualified charities made for general operating support are paid once the grant has been approved. Grants to qualified charities made for specific projects are paid after the recipients demonstrate that the funded project was completed and submit paid invoices accompanied by the Foundation's Grant Payment Request Form. Grants awarded but unpaid are cancelled. Designated Funds. Grants from designated funds are paid to qualified charities in accordance with the terms of the applicable gift instruments. Foundation staff confirms the tax-exempt status and legal existence of charitable beneficiaries of grants before grants are paid to them. Grants for scholarships are paid directly to the institution the student is attending. Payment of scholarship awards is conditioned upon proof of enrollment and, where appropriate, receipt of a transcript for the most recently completed semester, as well as satisfaction of any other ongoing qualifications for the scholarship.

Form 990, Part III - The Jewish Community Foundation addresses community needs and fulfills donors' charitable objectives, while building endowments and legacies to support a thriving and vibrant Jewish community in Greater Hartford, Connecticut. It provides philanthropic advisory services to donors and accepts funding requests from qualified charities for programs and projects that further the interests of the Greater Hartford Jewish community and of national and world Jewry. The Foundation also serves as steward of charitable funds for the benefit of the local community. The Foundation's operations, including grantmaking, are governed by its Board of Trustees. The Foundation's grant making programs are governed by guidelines adopted by its Board of Trustees. Grants are made only to organizations that are described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and have been classified as public charities. The Jewish Community Foundation operates a robust donor advised program that offers individuals a simple and flexible way to support their favorite charities, chart the course of their charitable giving according to their own values, and involve their family in hands-on philanthropy. The Foundation keeps donors informed about a variety of funding needs and shares vetted funding requests that match donors' charitable interests throughout the year. The Foundation guides donors through the process of designing charitable gift plans with a focus on making charitable giving most meaningful. It carries out the special mission of promoting personalized and valued based legacy planning through educational sessions, workshops and individual, confidential consultations. Through its Jewish Philanthropy Resource center, the Foundation shares information about contemporary trends and issues in philanthropy with individuals, families and family foundations. The Foundation's staff complement was 8.19 FTEs for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011.

Form 990, Part III (Cont. 4) - In 2010/2011, the Foundation awarded \$2.6 million in grants to 136 charities. These grants covered a broad range of charitable funding areas, including health and human services, education and youth, community building, arts and culture, social justice, synagogues and spiritual development and Israel and International projects.

Form 990, Part III, Line 4a - Support of Community Agencies, Programs and Services (Expenses: \$167,105 including grants of \$167,105) The Foundation awarded a grant to the Jewish Federation of Greater Hartford to support 22 local agencies and programs, meet critical needs for basic human services in the Greater Hartford Jewish community and support core functions in furtherance of the key objectives identified in the community's recently completed long range community plan. The Federation was tasked with funding strategic projects to help shape the community's future and fulfill its central mission.

Form 990, Part III, Line 4b - Leave a Jewish Legacy (Expenses: \$155,515, including grants of \$155,515) Leave a Jewish Legacy ("LAJL") promotes charitable giving through bequests. The Foundation works with 22 local agencies and synagogues to emphasize the importance of bequests and other planned gifts as key components of fundraising and to build future endowments for the Jewish Community. The Foundation provides participants with the tools and motivation to approach long-term annual donors and begin the legacy discussion through workshops, educational sessions, Board presentations, individual consultation and coaching and the provision of marketing materials. LAJL workshops led by national and local experts on topics relating to successful endowment and legacy fundraising were presented through the Foundation's fundraising academy. This year's topics ranged from planned giving strategies in an uncertain financial climate to how to make an integrated "ask". The Foundation also held Brown bag sessions, at which participants discussed topics of common interest and learned from one another. This year, Leave a Jewish Legacy yielded 35 new bequest expectancies and more than \$2.8 million in bequests was realized. A total of 459 individuals and families have stepped up to participate in Leave a Jewish Legacy.

Form 990, Part III, Line 4c - Long Range Community Planning (Expenses: \$65,000 including grants of \$65,000) as an outgrowth of the community's long range planning process, the Jewish Community Foundation committed \$65,000 to retain a consultant and project manager to work with committees that were formed in order to implement the recommendations of the Long Range Community Planning Task Force. These committees included Federation Allocations, Federation/Foundation Relations, and Re-envisioning Federation.

Form 990, Part III, Line 4d - Other Programs and Services (Expenses: \$2,960,659 including grants of \$2,225,122) These include the balance of grants awarded through community grantmaking programs, donor advised program and college and Israel experience.

scholarship programs as well as grants administration, management of the charitable funds for local agencies and synagogues, Jewish Philanthropy Resources Center, which provides education and resources for effective and meaningful charitable giving, community workshops, women's giving circle, Israel giving circle and philanthropic advisory services.

Form 990, Part VI, Section B, Line 11b - A draft IRS Form 990 completed by the Foundation's VP Finance, with the assistance of the Treasurer and Audit Chair, was distributed to the Audit Committee and the Foundation's independent auditors for review and comment. Suggested changes were then incorporated in a final Form 990 which was distributed as a pdf document by email to the Board of Trustees for review prior to submission to the IRS.

Form 990, Part VI, Section B, Line 12c - The Foundation has adopted a code of ethics and conflict of interest policy that: (1) defines conflicts of interest; (2) defines individuals within the Foundation covered by the policy; (3) facilitates disclosure of information that may help identify conflicts of interest and potential conflicts; and (4) specifies procedures to be followed in managing conflicts of interest. Each year the Foundation distributes its Code of Ethics and Conflict of Interest Policy to its Board of Trustees, members of its Audit, Budget and Finance, Investment and Grants Committees and staff, along with an annual disclosure statement. The completed statements are collected and kept in a locked file. It is the responsibility of Trustees, committee members, staff and members of their families associated with the Foundation to be alert to situations in which a conflict or potential conflict of interest could arise. The Foundation's conflict of interest policy requires disclosure of financial and other interests prior to any discussion of the matter under consideration and mandates abstention from decision-making actions when a potential for conflict exists. The Board or committee whose member may have a conflict has the right to review and discuss the matter of a conflict or potential without the affected individual being present. Trustees and committee members who believe that someone may have violated the Foundation's conflict of interest policy are directed to express their concern to the Chair of the Audit Committee or to the Chair of the Board of Trustees. Staff would report the issue to the Foundation's President. Steps would then be taken to determine whether a conflict or the potential for conflict exists, and whether to: (1) take no action; (2) assure full disclosure to the Board, committee or others; (3) ask the individual to recuse him/herself from participation in discussions or decision making concerning the matter at hand; or (4) ask the individual to resign from his or her position or, if the individual refuses to resign, become subject to possible removal in accordance with the Foundation's bylaws. The Foundation's President and Vice President Finance monitor proposed and ongoing transactions for conflicts of interest and would disclose them to the Chair of the Audit Committee and Chair of the Board of Trustees in order to deal with potential or actual conflicts, whether discovered before or after the transaction has occurred.

Form 990, Part VI, Section B, Line 15 - The Foundation has adopted a policy for setting the compensation for its chief executive, officers, and "key employees." The policy is designed to ensure that the Foundation's executive compensation arrangements are reasonable. It includes three key components: (1) review and approval of compensation by a committee designated by the Board of Trustees, provided that persons with conflicts of interest are not involved in this review or approval; (2) use of data as to comparable compensation for similarly qualified persons in functionally comparable positions at similarly situated organizations; and (3) contemporaneous documentation and recordkeeping with respect to the deliberations and decisions. The Budget and Finance Committee followed this process in the setting compensation for all employees in the spring of 2010 at the time the fiscal 2011 budget was being prepared.

Form 990, Part VI, Section C, Line 19 - The Foundation publishes its audited statements on its website. The Foundation's Certificate of Incorporation is available through the office of the Secretary of the State of Connecticut. Its code of ethics and conflict of interest policy and bylaws are available upon request.
