The metrics must be defined by the institutional performance metrics and the institutional core and strategic objectives. Levels of performance required for "minimum", "target" and "maximum" incentive compensation will be defined by group, sub-group or, where appropriate, at the level of individual employee performance.
Schedule J, Part II	Compensation of Former President	Dr. Raveche served 22 years as Stevens' President, ending on June 30, 2010. All of the elements of his compensation reported in the 2010 IRS Form 990 relate to long-standing contractual obligations. His calendar year 2010 contracted compensation consisted of: base salary as president; auto allowance; and other contractual employee benefits, severance, consulting payments, and the value of a supplemental retirement benefit earned over his 22 years in service. Dr. Raveche had a supplemental retirement benefit beginning with his appointment as president in 1988. On advice of counsel, it was determined that the proceeds of the supplemental retirement benefit be paid in full upon his retirement. In addition, Stevens accelerated Dr. Raveche's repayment of outstanding loans to the University three years ahead of schedule. Dr. Raveche repaid the University in full on 10/31/2011.
