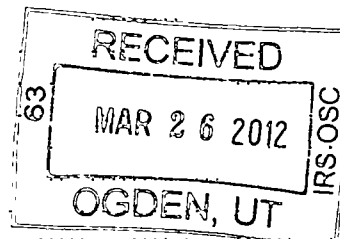




OF**

Reading Fleming Intermediate School PTO
A New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation

ARTICLE 1

OFFICES

Section 1.1 Registered Office. The location and post office address of the registered office of Reading Fleming Intermediate School PTO ("the Corporation") in New Jersey shall be at: Reading Fleming Intermediate School, 50 Court Street, Flemington, NJ 08822.

Section 1.2 Other Offices. The Corporation shall also have offices at such other places within the State of New Jersey as the Board of Directors ("the Board") may from time to time appoint and the business of the Corporation may require.

ARTICLE 2

PURPOSE

Section 2.1 The Corporation is incorporated under the New Jersey Non-Profit Corporation Act (the "Act") under Title 15A of the New Jersey Statutes for the following purpose or purposes:

(a) The Corporation is formed exclusively for charitable, educational and scientific purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of the 1986 (the "Code") (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), and particularly, but not limited, to:

(i) providing cultural and recreational opportunities and activities that enhance the educational experience of all children who attend Reading Fleming Intermediate School;

(ii) engaging in fundraising activities to provide educational resources, including school supplies, classroom and playground equipment, cultural and athletic enrichment programs, after-school programs and financial support programs to families on subsidized lunch programs at Reading Fleming Intermediate School;

(iii) promoting good will and cooperation among administrators, staff, teachers, parents, students and teachers at Reading Fleming Intermediate School; and

(iv) subject to the limitations set forth in paragraphs (b), (c), and (d) of this Article 2, perform all other things and acts and exercise all other powers, rights and privileges which a nonprofit corporation may now or hereafter be organized or authorized to do or to exercise under the Act.

(b) The Corporation does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit, incidental or otherwise. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, any Director, Officer or other private person, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments, contributions and distributions in furtherance of the purposes of the Corporation set forth in the foregoing paragraph (a) of this Article 2.

(c) No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Certificate, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (i) by a Corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), or (ii) by a Corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Code (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

(d) Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors, shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational or scientific purposes, as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any remaining assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as said court shall determine which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes. The use of any surplus funds for private inurnment to any person in the event of a sale or dissolution of the Corporation is prohibited.

ARTICLE 3

MEMBER CORPORATION

Section 3.1 Members. The Corporation shall have Members. The Members of the Corporation shall be dues-paying

- (i) Parents and guardians of Reading Fleming Intermediate School students, and
- (ii) Administrators, faculty and staff of Reading Fleming Intermediate School.

The total Membership shall be calculated on an annual basis, based upon payment of dues by October 15 of that year.

Section 3.2 Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting of the Members of the Corporation shall be held during the month of May of each year, for the purpose of electing Directors and Officers, and such other business as may come before the Membership. Each Annual Meeting shall be held at such place as the Board of Directors may direct.

Section 3.3 Special Meetings. Special Meetings of the Members of the Corporation may be called at any time by the Board of Directors or by a Member. The purpose of any meeting thus called shall be distinctly set forth in the meeting notification.

Section 3.4 Notice. A minimum of ten (10) days notice of any meeting shall be given to the full membership of the Corporation. Such notices shall be in writing and delivered to each Member personally, by regular or express mail, courier service, facsimile or electronic mail. If sent by electronic

mail, it shall be deemed to have been given on receipt of confirmation of "sent". If given by regular or express mail, it shall be deemed to have been given when deposited into the United States mail. If given by courier, it shall be deemed to have been given when given to that person. Notice of meeting shall specify the place, day and hour of the meeting and any other information required by the Act, the Certificate of Incorporation or these Bylaws.

Section 3.5 Quorum. A meeting of the Members duly called shall not be organized for the transaction of business unless a quorum is present. The presence of at least six Members, three of whom shall be Directors, shall constitute a quorum. The Members present at a duly organized meeting can continue to do business until adjournment, notwithstanding the withdrawal of enough Members to leave less than a quorum. If a meeting cannot be organized because a quorum has not attended, those present may, except as otherwise provided in the Act, the Certificate of Incorporation or these Bylaws, adjourn the meeting to such time and place as they may determine.

Section 3.6 Vote. Each Member of the Corporation shall be entitled to one (1) vote.

Section 3.7 Adjournments. Adjournments of any meeting of the Members may be taken, but any meeting at which Directors are to be elected shall be adjourned only from day to day, or for such longer periods not exceeding fifteen (15) days each, as the Members present entitled to cast at least a majority of the votes which the Members present and voting is entitled to cast shall direct, until such Directors have been elected. When a meeting of the members is adjourned, it shall not be necessary to give any notice of the adjourned meeting or of the business to be transacted at an adjourned meeting, other than by announcement at the meeting at which the adjournment is taken, unless the Board fixes a new record date for the adjourned meeting or the Act, the Certificate of Incorporation or these Bylaws require notice of the business to be transacted and such notice has not previously been given.

Section 3.9 Actions by Written Consent. Any action which may be taken at a meeting of the members may be taken without a meeting, if a consent or consents in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by the Member who would be entitled to vote at a meeting for such purpose and shall be filed with the Secretary of the Corporation.

ARTICLE 4

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 4.1 Number of Directors. The Board of Directors shall consist of at least four (4) Directors, or such other number as established by the Board of Directors from time to time.

Section 4.2 Election. Directors will be elected by the Members at the Annual Meeting of the Members or such other meeting of the Members designated for such election. At such meeting, or at such prior meeting as the Board of Directors may designate for acceptance of nominations, the members of the corporation present and entitled to vote at such meeting shall be entitled to nominate candidates for Directors up to the number of Directors to be elected. Neither nominations nor voting shall be by ballot unless a motion requesting a ballot is made and approved by a majority of Members present and entitled to vote. The candidates receiving the highest number of votes, up to the number of Directors to be elected, shall be elected.

Section 4.3 Term. The term of each elected Director shall commence on July 1st following his or her election and continue for one year and until a successor shall have been elected and qualified. An elected Director may resign by delivering a written resignation to the President or Secretary of the Corporation.

Section 4.4 Succession. A Director may serve an unlimited number of concurrent terms in office.

Section 4.5 Vacancies. Vacancies in the Board of Directors, including vacancies resulting from an increase in the authorized number of Directors, shall be filled by a majority of the remaining Directors, though less than a quorum, and each person so elected shall be a Director until his or her successor is elected and qualified.

Section 4.6 Powers. The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors which may exercise all powers of the Corporation.

Section 4.7 Meetings. The Board of Directors may hold meeting either within or outside the State of New Jersey.

Section 4.8 Annual and Regular Meetings. An Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors will be held immediately following the Annual Meeting of the Members. Other regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at such time and at such place as shall from time to time be designated by the Directors. If such designation is by standing resolution of the Board of Directors, no notice other than such resolution shall be required. If such designation is by resolution or consensus adopted at a duly convened meeting of the Board of Directors with respect to the next meeting of the Board of Directors, further notice need be given only to those Directors not present at such duly convened meeting. In all other cases, notice shall be given to all Directors at least ten (10) days prior to such regular meeting. All meeting notices shall be given to Directors in the manner specified in Section 3.4 hereof.

Section 4.9 Special Meetings. Special Meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the President on twenty-four hours notice to each Director, given in accordance with Section 3.4. Special meetings shall be called by the President or the Secretary in like manner and on like notice on the written request of a majority of the Members of the Board of Directors.

Section 4.10 Purpose of Meetings. Notice of a Board of Directors meeting shall specify the general purpose of the meeting if (a) the purpose of such meeting is to amend the Bylaws, or (b) the meeting is a special meeting of the Directors.

Section 4.11 Quorum and Action. Except as otherwise provided in Section 4.4, at all meetings of the Board of Directors, a majority of the Directors then in office shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and the acts of a majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the acts of the Board of Directors. Each Director shall be entitled to one (1) vote. If a quorum shall not be present at any meeting of Directors, the Directors present thereat may adjourn the meeting for no more than ten (10) days, without notice other than by announcement at the meeting, until a quorum shall be present.

Section 4.12 Conference Telephone. One or more Directors may participate in a meeting of the Board of Directors, or a committee thereof, by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this section shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.

Section 4.13 Informal Action. Any action which may be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors or any Committee thereof may be taken without a meeting if a consent or consents in writing setting forth the action so taken shall be signed by all the Directors or the members of the Committee, as the case may be, and shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors or Committee.

Section 4.14 Removal. The entire Board of Directors or any individual Director may be removed from office without assigning any cause by the vote of Members entitled to cast at least a majority of the votes which all Members present would be entitled to cast at any annual meeting or other regular election of the Directors. New Directors may be elected at the same meeting.

ARTICLE 5

COMMITTEES

Section 5.1 Committees. The Board of Directors may, by resolution adopted by a majority of Directors in office, establish one or more Committees. Any such Committee shall have and exercise the authority of the Board of Directors to the extent provided by resolution of the Board of Directors or in these Bylaws, except that no such Committee shall have any power or authority as to the following:

- (a) The submission to Members of any action requiring approval of the Member under the Act;
- (b) The filling of vacancies in the Board of Directors;
- (c) The adoption, amendment or repeal of these Bylaws;
- (d) The amendment or repeal of any resolution of the Board of Directors;
- (e) Action on matters committed by the Bylaws or resolution of the Board of Directors to another Committee of the Board of Directors;
- (f) The removal of any officer or Director.

Section 5.2 Committee Members. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws or in the resolution creating the Committee, all Committee Members and the Chairperson of each Committee shall be designated by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors. The President may, with the approval of the Board of Directors, designate one or more alternate Members of any Committee, who may replace any absent or disqualified member at any meeting of the Committee. The President shall be an ex officio Member of all Committees, with vote.

Section 5.3 Terms. Members of Committees shall serve for one(1) year terms or for such terms as are set forth in the resolution establishing the Committee. Vacancies in any Committee shall be filled by the President and reported to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting.

Section 5.4 Minutes; Reports. Minutes of the meetings of the Committees shall be recorded and sent to the Board of Directors if required by resolution of the Board of Directors. Chairpersons of Committees shall report regularly to the Board of Directors on the activities of their respective Committees.

Section 5.5 Committee Chairpersons. Committee Chairpersons shall submit any notices, forms, or other correspondence to the PTO Board for review prior to distribution. Committee Chairpersons shall conduct their activities within the limits of the established budget; if expenses are anticipated to exceed the operating budget, approval must be obtained from the Board of Directors in advance.

ARTICLE 6

OFFICERS AND AGENTS

Section 6.1 Titles. The Officers of the Corporation shall be chosen by the Members at their Annual Meeting and shall be a President or Co-Presidents, Vice President or Co-Vice Presidents, Secretary or Co-Secretaries, and Treasurer or Co-Treasurers, or persons who shall act as such regardless of the name or title by which they may be designated. The Corporation may also have such other Officers and Agents as the Members shall from time to time authorize. Officers shall hold their offices for such terms and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as set forth in these Bylaws and as shall be determined from time to time by the Members. Any number of the aforesaid offices may be held by the same person, but no Officer shall execute, acknowledge or verify any instrument in more than one capacity if the instrument is required by law to be executed, acknowledged or verified by two or more Officers. The Officers may, but need not be, Members of the Board of Directors.

Section 6.2 Terms of Office. The term of each elected Officer of the Corporation shall commence on July 1st following his or her election and shall continue for one year and until a successor shall have been elected and qualify. Any Officer elected or appointed may be removed, with or without cause, at any time by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present. Any vacancy occurring in any office of the Corporation shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

Section 6.3 President. Unless provided otherwise by the Board, the President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation; shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors; shall have general and active management of the business of the Corporation; and shall see that all orders and resolutions of the Board of Directors are carried into effect. The President shall execute bonds, mortgages and other contracts requiring a seal, under the seal of the Corporation, except where required by law to be otherwise signed and except where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the Board of Directors to some other Officer or Agent of the Corporation. The President shall also;

- (i) Preside at all regular and special meetings;
- (ii) Appoint all Chairpersons or regular and special Committees and oversee all Committees of the PTO and the Board of Directors;

(iii) Be a Member ex-officio of all Committees, except the Nominating Committee, of which he or she shall be a regular member.

Section 6.4 Vice President. The Vice President shall act as aide and supporter of the President and shall, in the absence or inability of the President, perform the duties of that office. The Vice President shall set the expectations for Committee Chairs and oversee the progress of each Committee, and be responsible for collecting and maintaining all documentation related to said Committees.

Section 6.5 Secretary. The Secretary shall attend all meetings of the Board of Directors and record all the proceedings in a book to be kept for that purpose and shall perform like duties for any duly authorized committee when required. The Secretary shall give, or cause to be given, all required notices of all meeting of the Board of Directors, and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board or the President, under whose supervision he or she shall be. The Secretary shall keep in safe custody the Seal of the Corporation and, when authorized by the Board of Directors, affix the same to any instrument requiring it and, when so affixed, it shall be attested by his or her signature.

The Secretary shall prepare an agenda for each meeting, and provide regular and periodic updates to the Membership on PTO events and activities, via electronic or paper communication.

Section 6.6 Treasurer. The Treasurer shall have the custody of the Corporate funds and securities and shall keep full and accurate accounts of all receipts and disbursements in books belonging to the Corporation and shall deposit all moneys and other valuable effects in the name and to the credit of the Corporation in such depositories as may be designated by the Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall disburse the funds of the Corporation as may be ordered by the Board of Directors, taking proper vouchers for such disbursements, and shall render to the President and the Board of Directors, at its regular meetings, or when the Board of Directors so requests, an account of all the transactions as Treasurer and of the financial condition of the Corporation. The Treasurer shall ensure that all annual Federal and State tax-related forms are filed in a timely manner.

ARTICLE 7

FINANCE

Section 7.1 Fees and Profits. The Corporation may charge fees or prices for services or products it renders within its lawful authority, and may receive such income and make an incidental profit thereon. All such incidental profits shall be applied to the maintenance and operation of the charitable activities of the Corporation, and in no case shall be divided or distributed in any manner whatsoever among the Directors or Officers of the Corporation.

Section 7.2 Financial Reports. The Board of Directors shall present at the Annual Meeting of the Membership a report, verified by the President and Treasure, which report shall indicate in appropriate detail:

(a) The assets and liabilities of the Corporation as of the end of the fiscal year immediately preceding the date of the Annual Report;

(b) The principal changes in assets and liabilities during the year immediately preceding the date of the Annual Report;

- (c) The revenue or receipts of the Corporation, both unrestricted and restricted to particular purposes, for the year immediately preceding the date of the report;
- (d) The expenses or disbursements of the Corporation, for both general and restricted purposes, during the year immediately preceding the date of the report, and,
- (e) The number of Members of the Corporation as of the date of the report, together with a statement of increase or decrease in such number during the year immediately preceding the date of the report, and a statement of the place where the names and addresses of the current Members may be found.

Such Annual Report shall be filed with the Minutes of the meetings of the Members.

ARTICLE 8

FUNDS, CONDUCT OF BUSINESS

Section 8.1 Funds. Funds of the Corporation shall be held and invested as determined by the Board of Directors.

Section 8.2 Conduct of Business. The Board shall have the authority to receive for the use of the Corporation, gifts of real or personal property pertaining to the objectives of the Corporation.

ARTICLE 9

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY, INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

Section 9.1 Limitation of Liability. To the fullest extent permitted by the Act and other applicable law, a Director of this Corporation shall not be personally liable for monetary damages as such for any action taken, or any failure to take action, unless the Director has breached or failed to perform the duties of his or her office under Title 15A:6-14 of the Act, or any successor provisions thereto, and the breach or failure to perform constitutes self-dealing, willful misconduct or recklessness. This provision shall not apply to the responsibility or liability of a Director pursuant to any criminal statute or the liability of a Director for the payment of taxes pursuant to local, state or federal law.

Section 9.2 Scope of Indemnification – Third-Party Actions. The Corporation shall indemnify any current or former Director or Officer of the Corporation, and may indemnify any other current or former employee or Agent of the Corporations, who was or is a party, or is threatened to be made a party, to any threatened, pending or completed action or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (other than an action by or in the right of the Corporation) by reason of the fact that the person is or was a Director, Officer, employee or Agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a Director, Officer, employee or Agent of another Corporation, limited liability company, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise (each, an "Indemnified Person:), against expenses (including attorney's fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by the Indemnified Person in connection with such threatened, pending or completed action or proceeding if such Indemnified Person acted in good faith and in a manner the Indemnified Person reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best

interests of the Corporation and, with respect to any criminal proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful. The termination of any action or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement or conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not of itself create a presumption that the Indemnified Person did not act in good faith and in a manner that the Indemnified Person reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interest of the Corporation and, with respect to any criminal proceeding, had reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful.

Section 9.3 Scope of Indemnification – Derivative and Corporate Actions. The Corporation shall indemnify any current or former Director or Officer of the Corporation, and may indemnify any other current or former employee or Agent of the Corporation, who was or is a party, or is threatened to be made a party, to any threatened, pending or completed action by or in the right of the Corporation to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that the person is or was a Director, Officer, employee or Agent of the Corporation (each, a “Company Indemnified Person”), or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a Director, Officer, employee or Agent of another Corporation, limited liability company, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorney fees) actually and reasonably incurred by such Company Indemnified Person in connection with the defense or settlement of the action if such Company Indemnified Person acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the corporation. Indemnification shall not be made under this section in respect of any claim, issue or matter as to which the Company Indemnified Person has been adjudged to be liable to the Corporation unless and only to the extent that the court of common pleas of the judicial district embracing the county in which the registered office of the Corporation is located or the court in which the action was brought determines upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability but in view of all the circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for such expenses that the court of common pleas or other court shall deem proper.

Section 9.4 Expenses. The Corporation shall pay expenses incurred by a current or former Director or Officer of the Corporation, and may pay expenses incurred by any other Indemnified Person or Company Indemnified Person, in defending an action or proceeding, who may be indemnified under Section 9.2 or 9.3 hereof in advance of the final disposition of any action or proceeding upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of such person to repay such amount if it shall ultimately be determined that he or she is not entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation.

Section 9.5 Successor Rights to Indemnification. The indemnification and advancement of expenses provided by or granted pursuant to these Bylaws shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a Director, Officer, employee or Agent of the Corporation and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such person.

Section 9.6 Insurance. The Corporation shall have the authority to procure insurance or to create a fund of any nature, which may, but need not be, under the control of an independent party, or otherwise secure or insecure in any manner any indemnification obligation undertaken by the Corporations. The authority granted by this Section 9.6 shall be exercised by the Board of Directors of the Corporation.

Section 9.7 Amendment or Repeal. Any repeal, amendment or modification of this Article 9 shall be prospective only and shall not affect any rights or obligations then existing or arising under this Article 9.

ARTICLE 10

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Section 10.1 Purpose. The purpose of the conflict of interest policy is to protect the Corporation's interest when it is contemplating entering into a transaction or arrangement that might benefit the private interest of an officer or director of the Corporation or might result in a possible excess benefit transaction. This policy is intended to supplement but not replace any applicable state and federal laws governing conflict of interest applicable to nonprofit and charitable organizations.

Section 10.2 Definitions.

INTERESTED PERSON: Any director, principal officer or member of a committee with governing board delegated powers, who has direct or indirect financial interest, as defined below, is an interested person.

FINANCIAL INTEREST: A person has a financial interest if the person has, directly or indirectly, through business, investment or family:

- a) An ownership or investment interest in any entity with which the Corporation has a transaction arrangement.
- b) A compensation arrangement with the Corporation or with any entity or individual with which the Corporation has a transaction or arrangement, or
- c) A potential ownership or investment interest in, or compensation arrangement with, any entity or individual with which the Corporation is negotiating a transaction or arrangement.

Compensation includes direct and indirect remuneration as well as gifts or favors that are not insubstantial.

A financial interest is not necessarily a conflict of interest. Under Section 10.3 b, a person who has a financial interest may have a conflict of interest only if the appropriate governing board or committee decides that a conflict of interest exists.

Section 10.3 (a) Duty to Disclose. In connection with any actual or possible conflict of interest, an interested person must disclose the existence of the financial interest and be given the opportunity to disclose all material facts to the directors and members of the committees with governing board delegated powers considering the proposed transaction or arrangement.

Section 10.3 (b) Determining Whether a Conflict of Interest Exists. After disclosure of the financial interest and all material facts, and after any discussion with the interested person, he/she shall leave the governing board or committee meeting while the determination of a conflict of interest is discussed and voted upon. The remaining board or committee members shall decide if a conflict of interest exists.

Section 10.3 (c) Procedures for Addressing the Conflict of Interest.

(i) An interested person may make a presentation at the governing board or committee meeting, but after the presentation, he/she shall leave the meeting during the discussion of, and the vote on, the transaction or arrangement involving the possible conflict of interest.

(ii) The chairperson of the governing board or committee shall, if appropriate, appoint a disinterested person or committee to investigate alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement.

(iii) After exercising due diligence, the governing board or committee shall determine whether the Organization can obtain with reasonable efforts a more advantageous transaction or arrangement from a person or entity that would not give rise to a conflict of interest.

(iv) If a more advantageous transaction or arrangement is not reasonably possible under circumstances not producing a conflict of interest, the governing board or committee shall determine by a majority vote of the disinterested directors whether the transaction or arrangement is in the Corporation's best interest, for its own benefit, and whether it is fair and reasonable. In conformity with the above determination it shall make its decision as to whether to enter into the transaction or arrangement.

Section 10.3 (d) Violations of the Conflicts of Interest Policy.

(i) If the governing board or committee has reasonable cause to believe a member has failed to disclose actual or possible conflicts of interest, it shall inform the member of the basis for such belief and afford the member an opportunity to explain the alleged failure to disclose.

(ii) If, after hearing the member's response and after making further investigation as warranted by the circumstances, the governing board or committee determines the member has failed to disclose an actual or possible conflict of interest, it shall take appropriate disciplinary and corrective action.

Section 10.4 Records of Proceedings. The minutes of the governing board and all committees with board delegated powers shall contain:

(i) The names of the persons who disclosed or otherwise were found to have a financial interest in connection with an actual or possible conflict of interest, the nature of the financial interest, any action taken to determine whether a conflict of interest was present, and the governing board's or committee's decision as to whether a conflict of interest in fact existed.

(ii) The names of the persons who were present for discussions and votes relating to the transaction or arrangement, the content of the discussion, including any alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement, and a record of any votes taken in connection with the proceedings.

Section 10.5 Compensation. A voting member of the governing board who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from the Corporation for services is precluded from voting on matters pertaining to that member's compensation. A voting member of any committee whose jurisdiction includes compensation matters and who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from the Corporation for services is precluded from voting on matters pertaining to that member's compensation. No voting member of the governing board or any committee whose jurisdiction includes compensation matters and who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from the Corporation, either individually or collectively, is prohibited from providing information to any committee regarding compensation.

Section 10.6 Annual Statements. Each director, principal officer and member of a committee with governing board delegated powers shall annually sign a statement which affirms such person; Has received a copy of the conflicts of interest policy, Has read and understands the policy; Has agreed to comply with the policy and; Understands the Corporation is charitable and in order to maintain its

federal tax exemption it much engage primarily in activities which accomplish one or more of its tax-exempt purposes.

Section 10.7 Periodic Reviews. To ensure the Corporation operates in a manner consistent with charitable purposes and does not engage in activities that could jeopardize its tax-exempt status, periodic reviews shall be conducted. The periodic reviews shall, at a minimum, include the following subjects:

(i) Whether compensation arrangements and benefits are reasonable, based on competent survey information, and the result of arm's length bargaining.

(ii) Whether partnerships, joint ventures, and arrangements with management organizations conform to the Organization's written policies, are properly recorded, reflect reasonable investment or payments for goods and services, further charitable purposes and do not result in inurement, impermissible private benefit or in an excess benefit transaction.

Section 10.8 Use of Outside Experts. When conducting the periodic reviews as provided for in Section 10.7, the Corporation may, but need not, use outside advisors. If outside experts are used, their use shall not relieve the governing board of its responsibility for ensuring periodic reviews are conducted.

ARTICLE 11

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 11.1 Construction of Powers. Unless these Bylaws expressly or by clear construction or implication so provide, nothing contained in these Bylaws is intended to or shall limit, qualify, or restrict any powers or authority granted or permitted to nonprofit corporations by the Act.

Section 11.2 Corporate Seal. The Board of Directors shall prescribe the form of a suitable Corporate Seal, which shall contain the full name of the Corporation and the year and state of incorporation.

Section 11.3 Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Corporation shall end on the 30th day of June of each year.

Section 11.4 Checks. All checks or demands for money and notes of the Corporation shall be signed by such officer or officers or such other person or persons as the Board of Directors may from time to time designate.

Section 11.5 Waiver of Notice. Whenever any notice is required to be given under the provisions of the Act, the Certificate or these Bylaws, a waiver thereof in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to said notice whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice. Attendance of a person, either in person or by proxy, at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting.

Section 11.6 Records. An original or duplicate record of the proceedings of the Directors and other bodies, the books or records of account and the Bylaws, shall be kept at the registered office or principal place of business.

ARTICLE 12

AMENDMENTS

Section 12.1 Amendment of Certificate of Incorporation. The Certificate of Incorporation may be amended at an annual meeting of the Members or a special meeting of the Members called for such purpose by a majority vote of the Members then present, provided that: (a) the proposed amendment shall have been prepared in writing, been approved by the Board of Directors, and so recorded in the Minutes of the Board of Directors' meeting; and (b) the proposed amendment shall have been provided in the notice of such meeting to the Member in accordance with the provisions of Section 3.4 hereof.

Section 12.2 Amendment of Bylaws. These Bylaws may be altered or amended at an annual meeting of the Directors or a special meeting of the Directors called for such purpose by a Director, provided that the proposed amendment shall have been provided in the notice of such meeting to the Directors in accordance with the provisions of Section 4.9 and 4.10 hereof.
