NOTE 1 - NATURE OF OPERATIONS AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

NATURE OF OPERATIONS

Research for Action, Inc. (the "Organization"), a non-profit Organization formed in February 1993, is engaged in research to ensure equitable educational opportunities and outcomes for all learners. The Organization's revenue is primarily from local and national contracts with not-for-profit organizations and school districts and research grants from foundations involved in public education.

BASIS OF PRESENTATION

The Organization's financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The Organization reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

Permanently restricted net assets result from contributions which are restricted by donor imposed stipulations that neither expire by the passage of time nor can be removed by the Board of Directors.

Temporarily restricted net assets include contributions which are restricted as to use by the donor. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported as net assets released from restrictions in the statements of activities.

Unrestricted net assets include all other operating activities of the Organization.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Contributions, including unconditional promises to give, are recognized in the period received. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending upon the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose of the restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are transferred to unrestricted net assets. Generally, restrictions on net assets are considered to have been met evenly over the grant period to approximate the period when services are provided.

PROMISES TO GIVE (FOUNDATION GRANTS RECEIVABLE AND CONTRACTS RECEIVABLE)

Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a promise to give to the Organization that is, in substance, unconditional. Unconditional promises to give are recognized as assets and revenues in the period received. Promises to give are recorded at net realizable value if expected to be collected in one year and at fair value if expected to be collected in more than one year. As of June 30, 2011 and 2010, all promises to give are due within one year. Conditional promises to give are recognized when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met. Management provides an allowance for uncollectible promises to give based on its assessment of the current status of individuals' promises to give. When collection efforts have been exhausted, the accounts are written off. As of June 30, 2011 and 2010, an allowance was not warranted.

CONTRACTS RECEIVABLE

Contracts receivable are stated at the amount management expects to collect from outstanding balances. The Company considers contracts receivable to be fully collectible. Accordingly, no allowance for doubtful accounts is required. If amounts become uncollectible they will be charged to operations when that determination is made.

FURNITURE, EQUIPMENT AND LEASEHOLD IMPROVEMENTS

Furniture, equipment and leasehold improvements are carried at cost. Depreciation and amortization are computed using the straight-line method over an estimated useful life of three to seven years. When assets are retired or otherwise disposed of, the cost and the related accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts and any resulting gain or loss is recognized in income for the period. The cost of maintenance and repairs is charged to expense as incurred; significant renewals and betterments are capitalized. Minor equipment purchases are expensed in the period they are acquired.

CONTRACT REVENUE RECOGNITION

Contract revenue is recognized on the percentage of completion method, measured by the percentage of total costs incurred to date, to estimated total costs for each contract. This method is used because management considers total costs to be the best measure of progress for these contracts. All billings in excess of costs are shown on the statements of financial position as deferred revenue, net of costs in excess of billings.

FUNCTIONAL EXPENSES

Expenses are charged to each program based on direct expenditures incurred. Expenditures not directly chargeable to programs are allocated to a program based primarily on related personnel time incurred.

INCOME TAXES

The Organization is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) except for income taxes pertaining to unrelated business income. There was no unrelated business income for fiscal years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010. Therefore, no provision for income taxes is reflected in these financial statements.

Generally accepted accounting principles required tax effects from an uncertain tax position to be recognized in the financial statements only if the position is more likely than not to be sustained if the position were to be challenged by a taxing authority. The assessment of the tax position is based solely on the technical merits of the position, without regard to the likelihood that the tax position may be challenged. If an uncertain tax position meets the more-likely-than-not threshold, the largest amount of tax benefit that is greater than 50% likely to be recognized upon ultimate settlement with the taxing authority is recorded. The Organization primary tax positions relate to its status as a not-for-profit entity exempt from income taxes and classification of activities related to its exempt purpose. Management has evaluated the tax positions reflected in the Organization's tax filings and does not believe that any material uncertain tax positions exist.

The Organization federal exempt organization tax returns for the years ended June 30, 2008, 2009 and 2010 are subject to examination by the Internal Revenue Service, generally for three years after they are filed.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The presentation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

CONTRACTUAL ADJUSTMENTS

Certain contracts and grants that fund the Organization's programs contain provisions defining costs that are allowable and reimbursable for the program. These program billings are subject to audit by various governmental funding sources. The audit of these billings may result in adjustments for expense disallowances. It is the Organization's practice to provide for such adjustments at the time that they are reasonably estimable.

NOTE 2 - CONCENTRATIONS

CREDIT RISK

Financial instruments that potentially subject the Company to concentrations of credit risk consist primarily of cash. The Company maintains cash and cash equivalents in one bank account that at times exceed applicable insurance limits. Accounts are guaranteed by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to certain limits. The Company reduces its exposure to credit risk by maintaining such deposits with high quality financial institutions. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts.

SIGNIFICANT CONTRACTS

A significant portion of the Organization's revenue and accounts receivable are to a limited number of contractors and foundation grantors. NOTE 4 - NOTE PAYABLE, BANK

The Organization has available a line of credit of \$100,000, which expires September 2011, with a bank that bears interest at 1% above the bank's prime rate. As of June 30, 2011, there was an outstanding borrowing of \$100,000. As of June 30, 2010, there were no outstanding borrowings.

NOTE 5 - COMMITMENTS

The Organization conducts its operations from a facility that is leased under an operating lease that started in July 2011, and expires in June 2014, with minimum monthly payments of \$4,519 in 2010 and \$4,857 in 2011. The previous lease expired June 2011 and had a monthly payment of \$3,565. The Organization also leases equipment under an agreement that expires in 2015. The minimum monthly payment is \$1,191.

Rent expense totaled approximately \$64,000 in 2011 and \$62,000 in 2010.

NOTE 6 - TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Temporarily restricted net assets are restricted by the donors for ongoing research projects and a summer fellowship.

NOTE 7 - RELATED PARTIES

One board member is an employee of the Organization as of June 30, 2011 and 2010.

NOTE 8 - EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT PLAN

The Organization has a 403(b) plan for its employees who may contribute a percentage of their salary, up to federal limits. The Organization matching contributions are 50% of an employee's contribution and, after two years of service, 2% of an employee's salary. The maximum matching contribution is 4% of an employee's salary. The approximate total contribution in 2011 and 2010 was \$25,500 and \$24,500, respectively.
