Note 1. Organization and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Organization

Methodist Rehabilitation Center, Inc and Subsidiaries (the "Hospital") was organized as a not-for-profit corporation under the laws of the State of Mississippi for the purpose of constructing and equipping a comprehensive rehabilitation hospital. The Hospital, located in Jackson, Mississippi is sponsored by the United Methodist Church in cooperation with the Vocational Rehabilitation Division, Mississippi State Department of Education and the University of Mississippi Medical Center

The Hospital provides comprehensive medical rehabilitation programs for people with spinal cord and brain injuries, stroke and other neurological and orthopedic disorders and treats patients from all of Mississippi's 82 counties and from neighboring states

The Hospital operates Methodist Specialty Care Center (the "Center"), a department of the Hospital, located in Flowood, Mississippi, which provides long-term specialized care for severely disabled patients whose medical needs are too complex for traditional nursing homes

Effective June 1, 2010, the Hospital began operating Pain Management Center ("Pain") as a department of the Hospital Pain is a clinic that provides a goal oriented approach to the management of chronic pain through physical, occupational and behavioral therapies combined with non-surgical intervention

Principles of Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements of the Hospital include the accounts of

- Select Physician Management Services, Inc ("Select") a wholly-owned subsidiary, is a for profit corporation whose purpose is managing certain physician practices
- Pain Management Center, LLC ("Pain") a wholly-owned subsidiary as of June 30, 2009, which was converted to a department of the Hospital effective June 1, 2010
- The Wilson Research Foundation (the "Foundation") a not-for-profit organization created and operated exclusively to assist in the advancement of clinical, educational and medical rehabilitation research by solicitation of gifts for the benefit of Methodist Rehabilitation Center, Inc. and other healthcare organizations located in the State of Mississippi Effective July 1, 2009, the Foundation is consolidated into the consolidated financial statements of the Hospital

All significant intercompany accounts and transactions have been eliminated in consolidation

Acquisition of Pain Management Center, LLC

An 85 percent ownership interest in Pain was acquired by the Hospital as of January 1, 2007. The acquisition was completed through a purchase of interest from the remaining members for

cash consideration totaling \$1,680,000 and assumption of certain Pain liabilities On July 31, 2008, the Hospital purchased the remaining 15 percent of Pain from the former members for cash consideration totaling \$420,000 The acquisition was accounted for as a purchase under the requirements of Accounting Principles Board Opinion No 16, *Business Combinations* The results of Pain's operations are included in the consolidated financial statements for 2010 Effective June 1, 2010, Pain was converted to an operational department of the Hospital

Goodwill

The excess of purchase price over the fair values of assets acquired, \$1,667,090, was assigned to goodwill. The goodwill is accounted for under Accounting Principles Board Opinion No 17 ("APB 17"), *Intangible Assets*, and is being amortized on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful life of 40 years. Goodwill is tested for impairment as circumstances arise. At June 30, 2010, management evaluated goodwill for impairment. Due to the loss of key personnel, Pain experienced significant operating losses. The loss of key personnel is significant enough that management does not believe the goodwill is recoverable and therefore has determined that the recorded goodwill is fully impaired. As a result, there was a charge to the Hospital's consolidated statements of operations in the amount of \$1,581,975 for the year ended June 30, 2010.

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of Preparation

The accompanying consolidated financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period Actual results could differ from those estimates

The most sensitive estimates included in these consolidated financial statements relate to contractual discounts under third-party payor arrangements and the allowance for doubtful accounts receivable. In particular, laws and regulations governing the Medicare and Medicaid programs are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. As a result, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates related to these programs will change by a material amount in the near term.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include investments in liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less, that are not limited as to use by the Board of Trustees or third parties. The carrying value of cash and cash equivalents approximates market value

Patient Accounts Receivable

Patient accounts receivable are reported at net realizable value, after deduction of allowances for estimated uncollectible accounts. The estimated allowance for uncollectible accounts is based on historical losses and an analysis of currently outstanding amounts. This account is generally increased by charges to a provision for uncollectible accounts and decreased by write-offs of accounts determined by management to be uncollectible.

Investments

Investments in marketable equity and debt securities are measured at fair value. Investments in non-consolidated entities are recorded based on the equity method. Investment income or loss (including realized gains and losses on investments, interest and dividends), is included in the excess of revenues over expenses unless the income or loss is restricted by donor or by law. Unrealized gains and losses on investments are excluded from the excess of revenues over expenses unless the investments are trading securities. Management considers all investments to be trading securities.

Assets Limited as to Use

Assets limited as to use principally include amounts held by trustees under indenture agreements and designated assets set aside by the Board of Trustees (the "Board") for future capital improvements or operating activities, over which the Board retains control and may at its discretion subsequently use for other purposes. The portion of the assets held by the bond trustee, which will be used to pay current liabilities, is classified as a current asset.

Inventories

Inventories, which consist primarily of medical supplies and drugs, are valued at the lower of cost or market. Cost is determined using the first-in, first-out and average cost methods. Inventories are included in other current assets on the consolidated statements of financial position.

Prepaid Expenses and Deferred Charges

Prepaid expenses are amortized over the estimated period of future benefit, generally on a straight-line basis Deferred financing costs and bond discounts are amortized over the term of

the related debt on the interest method The unamortized amount of bond discounts is included in the balance of the outstanding debt

Bequests

The Hospital recognizes bequests as support when the wills have passed probate and the amount is certain

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment acquisitions are recorded at cost or, if donated, at fair value at the date of receipt Costs incurred which do not substantially increase the useful life of an asset are expensed as repair and maintenance expense Depreciation is provided over the estimated useful life of each class of depreciable asset and is computed using the straight-line method Interest cost incurred on borrowed funds during the period of construction of capital assets is capitalized as a component of the cost of acquiring those assets There was no capitalization of such costs for the years ended June 30, 2011 or 2010, respectively

Impairment of Long-Lived Assets

Long-lived assets and certain identifiable intangibles are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount of an asset may not be recoverable. Recoverability of assets to be held and used is measured by a comparison of the carrying amount of an asset to future net cash flows expected to be generated by the asset. If such assets are considered to be impaired, the impairment to be recognized is measured by the amount by which the carrying amount of the assets exceeds the fair value of the assets. Assets to be disposed of are reported at the lower of the carrying amount of fair value less costs to sell

Compensated Absences

Hospital policy is to compensate employees for absences due to earned vacation and sick leave Accumulated vacation pay is accrued at the balance sheet date because it accumulates and is payable after one year of service upon termination of employment. Sick pay accrues but is not reflected as a liability because it is not payable upon termination of employment.

Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use by the Hospital has been limited by donors to a specific time period or for a specific purpose Uncollected unrestricted contributions are reflected in temporarily restricted net assets

Pledges receivable are recorded as other assets, with the current portion recorded in other current assets

Net Patient Service Revenue

The Hospital has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the Hospital at amounts different from its established rates. Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payors and others for services rendered, including estimated retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payors. Retroactive adjustments are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted in future periods as final settlements are determined

The primary third-party programs include Medicare and Medicaid, which account for a significant amount of the Hospital's revenue. The laws and regulations under which Medicare and Medicaid programs operate are complex, and are subject to interpretation and frequent changes. As part of operating under these programs, there is a possibility that government authorities may review the Hospital's compliance with these laws and regulations. Such review may result in adjustments to program reimbursement previously received and subject the Hospital to fines and penalties. Although no assurance can be given, management believes it has complied with the requirements of these programs.

Financial Assistance

The Hospital provides health care without charge or at amounts significantly less than its established rates to patients who meet certain criteria under its financial assistance policy

Because the Hospital does not pursue collection of these amounts, the Hospital does not report these amounts as revenue or accounts receivable in the accompanying consolidated financial statements

Donor-Restricted Gifts

Unconditional promises to give cash and other assets are reported at fair value at the date the promise is received. Conditional promises to give and indications of intentions to give are reported at fair value at the date the gift is received. The gifts are reported as temporarily restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified as unrestricted net assets and reported in the statements of operations and changes in unrestricted net assets as net assets released from restrictions. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met within the same year as received are reflected as unrestricted contributions in the accompanying consolidated financial statements.

For contributions of long-lived assets or of cash and other assets restricted to the purchase of long-lived assets, for which donors have not expressly stipulated how long the long-lived asset must be used, the Hospital has adopted an accounting policy of implying time restrictions on the use of such contributed assets that expire over the assets' expected useful lives

Advertising

Advertising and program costs are charged to expense as incurred Advertising expense for the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010 was approximately \$101,000 and \$173,000, respectively

Income Taxes

The Hospital and Foundation are not-for-profit corporations and have been recognized as a tax-exempt organization pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code The Foundation qualifies for the charitable contribution deduction under Section 170(b)(1)(A) and has been classified as an organization that is not a private foundation under Section 509(a)(2)

Select is subject to income taxes, but has historically had cumulative net operating losses During 2010, Pain filed a partnership income tax return whereby the members separately accounted for their prorata share of income, deductions, losses and credits. As a result, no provision for income taxes had been recognized in the accompanying consolidated financial statements

The Hospital had no significant uncertain tax positions at the date of adoption or at June 30, 2010 Accordingly, the adoption did not have a material effect on the Hospital's financial position or changes in net assets If interest and penalties are incurred related to uncertain tax positions, such amounts would be recognized in income tax expense Tax periods for all fiscal years after 2007 remain open to examination by the federal and state taxing jurisdictions to which the Hospital is subject

Functional Expense Classification

Expenses are not identified as program services, management and general and fundraising expenses in these consolidated financial statements because substantially all expenses were incurred for the provision of health care services by the Hospital and are considered program services

Excess of Revenue Over Expenses

The consolidated statement of operations and changes in unrestricted net assets includes excess of revenue over expenses. Changes in unrestricted net assets which are excluded from excess of revenue over expenses, consistent with industry practice, include unrealized and realized gains and losses on investments other than trading securities, permanent transfers of assets to and from affiliates for other than goods and services and contributions of long-lived assets (including assets acquired using contributions which by donor restrictions were to be used for the purposes of acquiring such assets)

Note 2. Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC Topic 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures ("ASC 820") defines fair value, establishes a hierarchal disclosure for measuring fair value and requires expanded disclosures about fair value measurements. The provisions of this statement apply to all financial instruments that are being measured and reported on a fair value basis.

Financial assets and liabilities recorded on the consolidated balance sheets are categorized based on the inputs to the valuation techniques as follows

Level 1 Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities Level 1 assets and liabilities include debt and equity securities and derivative contracts that are traded in an active exchange market

Note 7. Beneficial Interest in Charitable Remainder Trust

During 2011, The Foundation was named as a remainder beneficiary under eight charitable remainder trusts. Under the terms of the trusts, quarterly distributions are paid to income beneficiaries over their lifetimes. Quarterly distributions are 5 percent of the fair market value of the trust assets as of the beginning of each year. Upon the death of the income beneficiaries, 25 percent of the value of the charitable remainder trust account is distributed to the Foundation. The portion of the trust attributable to the present value of the future benefits to be received by the Foundation is recorded in the Statement of Activities and Changes in Net Assets as a temporarily restricted contribution in the period the trust is established and the Foundation is notified of its existence. Contributions of \$453,694 were recorded by the Foundation for the year ended June 30, 2011

Note 8. Line of Credit

In April 2011, the Hospital renewed an unsecured line of credit with a commercial bank with a principal amount of \$2,000,000, maturing March 31, 2012 As of June 30, 2011 and 2010, the Hospital had an outstanding balance of \$2,000,000 and \$800,000, respectively, with quarterly interest payments at varying rates of 2 50 percent plus LIBOR rate As of June 30, 2011 and 2010, the interest rate was 4 0 percent

In June 1993, the Hospital issued \$27,325,000 in tax-exempt hospital revenue bonds The bond issue proceeds were used to defease the Hospital's obligation to pay the Mississippi Hospital Equipment and Facilities Authority Revenue Bonds-1988 Series 1 Interest is due on the 1993 hospital revenue bonds each year on May 1 and November 1 at rates ranging from 3 4 percent to 5 7 percent Principal is due in varying amounts each May 1 until the year 2012

Under the terms of the revenue bond indenture, certain trust funds as described in Note 3 and the future net revenues of the Hospital are pledged as security for payment of the 1993 hospital revenue bonds. The indenture also contains certain affirmative and negative covenants, which among other things, limit additional borrowings and require the maintenance of certain financial ratios. The Hospital was in compliance with all such covenants as of June 30, 2011 and 2010.

In August 2003, the Hospital issued \$7,500,000 in variable rate revenue bonds The bond issue proceeds were used to assist the construction and installation of the Methodist Specialty Care Center, a long-term care facility of the Hospital Interest on the 2003 variable rate revenue bonds may be calculated using a weekly rate or a term rate mode, as defined Interest is calculated using the weekly rate mode until the borrower has requested mode to be changed to a term rate

Under the weekly rate mode, interest is due on the first business day of each month and on the effective date of conversion from the weekly rate mode to the term rate mode. For the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, the interest on the bonds was calculated using the weekly rate. The interest rate was 1 10 percent and 1 60 percent as of June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively. Principal is due in varying amounts beginning August 1, 2005 until the year 2023, and is collateralized by operating revenues of the Hospital

Note 10. Net Patient Service Revenue

The Hospital has agreements with third-party payors that provide for reimbursement to the Hospital at amounts different from its established rates. Contractual adjustments under third-party reimbursement programs represent the difference between the Hospital's billings at established rates for services and amounts reimbursed by third-party payors. A summary of the basis of reimbursement with major third-party payors follows

Medicare

Substantially all acute care and rehabilitation services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic and other factors. Certain types of exempt services and other defined payments related to Medicare beneficiaries are paid based on cost reimbursement or other retroactive-determination methodologies. The Hospital is reimbursed for other cost reimbursable items at tentative rates with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Hospital and audits by the Medicare fiscal intermediary. The Hospital's cost reports have been audited and settled for all fiscal years through June 30, 2007

Medicaid

Inpatient and outpatient acute care services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are generally reimbursed based upon cost-based reimbursement methodologies established by the State of Mississippi Based upon recent directions from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, the Mississippi Division of Medicaid has been instructed to begin cost settling certain Medicaid outpatient services beginning with reports on October 1, 2005

Long-term care services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are reimbursed using a cost-based method. Certain limits apply to components and may change in the future depending upon other similar providers opening in the State of Mississippi. Medicaid imposed additional limits to the reimbursement rate effective January 1, 2007, which the Hospital appealed to the Supreme Court of Mississippi. On September 24, 2009, the Supreme Court ruled in favor of the Hospital and determined the application of the ceiling by the Department of Medicaid to be null and void as it was improper and in violation of the applicable statutes. A request for reconsideration was filed by the Department of Medicaid, which was denied on December 3, 2009, and the Department of Medicaid was mandated to reimburse the Hospital. During fiscal year 2010, the Hospital was reimbursed \$10,316,938 for the difference between the ceiling and actual cost.

The Hospital participates in the Medicaid Upper Payment Limit Program ("UPL") Under this program, the Hospital receives enhanced reimbursement through a matching mechanism For the fiscal years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively, the Hospital received approximately \$1,156,095 and \$1,887,560 in enhanced reimbursement through the UPL Program

UPL amounts are shown as a reduction of contractual adjustments with related assessments of \$1,302,295 and \$1,199,628 for the fiscal years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively, recorded in operating expenses

Revenue from the Medicare and Medicaid programs accounted for approximately 41 percent and 29 percent, respectively, of the Hospital's gross patient revenue for the year ended June 30, 2011 and 41 percent and 30 percent, respectively, of the Hospital's gross patient revenue for the year ended June 30, 2010

Laws and regulations governing the Medicare and Medicaid programs are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. As a result, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates could change by a material amount in the near term. For the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, net patient service revenue increased approximately \$249,000 and \$116,000, respectively, due to adjustments in excess of amounts previously estimated.

Other

The Hospital has also entered into payment agreements with certain commercial insurance carriers, health maintenance organizations and preferred provider organizations. The basis for payment to the Hospital under these agreements includes prospectively determined rates per discharge, discounts from established charges and prospectively determined daily rates

Note 11. Financial Assistance and Uncompensated Care – Service to the Region

The amount of charges foregone for services and supplies furnished under the Hospital's financial assistance policy aggregated approximately \$500,000 and 200,000 for the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively

The Hospital also provides healthcare services to a significant portion of the uninsured and underinsured population in the surrounding community. While a portion of these patients may ultimately qualify for coverage under the Medicaid program or the financial assistance policy discussed above, the Hospital often admits a number of patients with the expectation/realization that it will likely be unable to collect a significant portion of these accounts. Charges deemed uncollectible during 2011 and 2010 were approximately \$594,000 and \$893,000, respectively

Note 12. Risk Management

The Hospital's professional liability insurance coverage is provided through a claims-made policy. Should the claims-made policy not be renewed or replaced with equivalent insurance, claims based on occurrences during its term, but reported subsequently, would be uninsured. The Hospital's current coverage expires on April 30, 2012, and management anticipates that such coverage will be renewed or replaced with equivalent insurance at that time

At June 30, 2011 and 2010, there were no material claims asserted or anticipated that were not covered by insurance, and the Hospital has not accrued for any significant losses for malpractice claims or expenses The Hospital is involved in various litigation and potential claims which management believes, based in part upon discussion with counsel, will not have a material

adverse effect on the results of operations or the financial position of the Hospital Nevertheless, the future assertion of claims for occurrences prior to year-end is reasonably possible and may occur, although not anticipated In any event, management believes that any such claims would be substantially covered under its insurance program

Note 13. Employee Benefits

The Hospital sponsors a retirement plan for all employees who work a minimum of 1,000 hours per year and have at least one year of service. All funds of the plan are invested in fixed funds and mutual fund options. The Hospital contributes 3 percent of the participants' annual taxable compensation and matches 50 percent of the participants' contributions up to 7 percent of annual taxable compensation. Employees are vested in the Hospital's contributions after three years of service. The Hospital's contributions to the plan were \$1,007,394 in 2011 and \$928,236 in 2010.

The Hospital provides health insurance coverage to its employees under a self-funded plan A liability for claims reported and not paid and an estimated liability for claims incurred but not reported or paid is included in accrued expenses in the consolidated statements of financial position Commercial insurance is purchased for claims in excess of coverage provided by the Hospital to limit the Hospital's liability for losses under its self-insurance program The estimated claims liability at June 30, 2011 and 2010 was \$94,013 and \$75,907, respectively

Note 14. Operating Leases

As lessor, the Hospital leases a portion of its premises for the operation of a restaurant. The lease term was renewed through August 2015, with an option to extend the lease for one additional five-year period. Base rent of \$75,000 per year is receivable in equal monthly installments of \$6,250 per month. In addition, the Hospital receives contingent rental payments based on restaurant sales in excess of certain levels as defined in the lease agreement.

As lessee, rental expense, including short-term rentals, was approximately \$465,000 in 2011 and \$463,500 in 2010. In most cases management expects that, in the normal course of business, expiring leases will be renewed or replaced by other similar leases. Based on operating leases currently in force, it is expected that lease rental expense for each of the next five years will be approximately \$465,000 per year.

Note 15. Business and Credit Concentrations

The Hospital provides health care services through its inpatient and outpatient care facilities principally located in Jackson, Mississippi The Hospital grants credit to patients, substantially

The Foundation is authorized by the Hospital to solicit contributions to support the Hospital's mission in providing for research for spinal and brain injuries in the State of Mississippi The Foundation uses those contributions to award grants to various healthcare organizations to assist in the advancement of clinical, educational and medical rehabilitation research

As of June 30, 2010, all significant intercompany accounts and transactions have been eliminated in consolidation

Note 17. Accounting Standards Updates Issued Not Yet Adopted

In August 2010, the FASB issued authoritative guidance that will require healthcare entities to measure and disclose their level of charity care based on the direct and indirect costs to provide those services instead of revenue rates. Also in August 2010, the FASB issued authoritative guidance that will preclude healthcare entities from offsetting medical malpractice and similar liabilities with related anticipated insurance recoveries. Both of these accounting standards updates will be effective in fiscal year ending June 30, 2012. The Hospital is currently evaluating the impact of its pending adoption of these updates on the consolidated financial statements.

In July 2011, the FASB issued authoritative guidance that will require healthcare entities to change the presentation and disclosures regarding patient service revenues, provisions for uncollectible accounts and the allowance for doubtful accounts. This update will require the Hospital to change the presentation of its statement of operations by reclassifying the provision for uncollectible accounts from an operating expense to a deduction from net patient service revenue. Additionally, the Hospital will be required to provide enhanced disclosures about its policy for recognizing revenue and assessing bad debts. The update also requires certain disclosures regarding patient service revenue as well as qualitative and quantitative information about the changes in the allowance for doubtful accounts. Unless early adopted, this update will be effective for the year ending June 30, 2013. The Hospital is currently evaluating the impact of its pending adoption of this update on the consolidated financial statements.
