#### Women's Law Project

#### Mission and Accomplishments 2010-2011

Organization's Mission: The Women's Law Project creates a more just and equitable society by advancing the rights and status of all women throughout their lives. To this end, we engage in high-impact litigation, advocacy and education. The core values of the Women's Law Project are a belief in the right of all women to bodily integrity and personal autonomy; dedication to listening to women and being guided by their experiences; and commitment to fairness, equality and justice.

## **Equality for Women and Girls**

#### **Gender Equity in Athletics**

- 1. We distributed almost 1,000 copies of the publication, *Are Schools Giving Female Athletes a Sporting Chance: A Guide to Gender Equity in Athletics in Pennsylvania Schools*, to athletic directors in secondary schools, parents, and the public; it has been accessed by many more than 1,000 people on our website.
- 2. WLP monitored the athletic disclosure bills introduced in the Pennsylvania legislature in the last session; although they made progress, neither was passed. Both bills have been reintroduced in the current session and our work continues.
- 3. WLP pressed forward on two OCR athletic equity complaints during this grant period, using data obtained from the school districts pursuant to the PA. Right to Know Law to gauge Title IX compliance.
- 4. WLP has continued to monitor implementation of the third settlement agreement with Slippery Rock University in Choike v. Slippery Rock University. In March, 2010, WLP filed a class action Title IX lawsuit seeking reinstatement of the Delaware State University equestrian team, equal athletic opportunities and equal recruiting resources for the women's athletic program. A full settlement was reached and approved by the Court on December 20, 2010.

#### **Pregnancy Discrimination**

In 2010, we represented one woman in an administrative proceeding related to pregnancy discrimination. We settled her case.

#### **Reproductive Justice and Health**

- 1. <u>Education Campaign</u>. We have distributed our "Understanding Abortion Care in Pennsylvania" manual to the freestanding abortion providers in Pennsylvania and discussed the project at an annual meeting of the providers' association on October 27. We have also distributed it to clergy.
- 2. <u>Clinic Protection</u>. The WLP achieved a major victory when a federal judge threw out a First Amendment lawsuit that three anti-abortion protesters brought against the Allentown Women's Center three years ago.

3. Incarcerated Pregnant Women. We have developed a civil legal assessment form to determine the needs of incarcerated women in Pennsylvania. This survey of incarcerated women's civil legal needs covers a wide range of potential issues, including housing, credit, bankruptcy, employment, child care, education, violence, and health. We have researched new developments in prison litigation related to reproductive health care and pregnancy.

In July, we celebrated with our coalition advocates when Governor Rendell signed a statewide shackling ban into law. This law bans the shackling of pregnant inmates in transit to a medical facility, in labor and for a reasonable time following labor, and allows for exceptions to the rule only in extraordinary circumstances.

#### **Violence Against Women**

#### Family and Sexual Violence

- 1. <u>Domestic Violence Law Enforcement Committee</u>. WLP Executive Director Carol Tracy continues to co-chair the Domestic Violence Law Enforcement Committee (DVLEC), through which we have continued significant collaboration with the Philadelphia Police Department. The most significant outcome of the collaboration is a major reorganization of the Philadelphia Police Department's (PPD) response to domestic violence.
- 2. Annual Review of SVU Cases. WLP, with representatives of Support Center for Child Advocates (SCCA), Philadelphia Children's Alliance (PCA) and Women Organized Against Rape, conducted the annual review of approximately 400+ case files at the Philadelphia Police Special Victims Unit (SVU). In addition, we received national attention as a result of U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee hearings in subcommittee on (1) the failure of local police across the country to properly investigate allegations of sexual assault and (2) the FBI's continued use of an antiquated definition of rape.
- 3. <u>Integration of DV Awareness into Child Welfare</u>. WLP co-chaired a committee in the Prevention Division of the Department of Human Services, to develop policies and protocols for identifying and appropriately intervening when domestic violence and child welfare intersect. Policies have been drafted and are currently under consideration.

#### **Family Law and Family Court Reform**

- 1. <u>New Family Courthouse</u>. Our unique work in this area focused on troubleshooting behind the scenes to facilitate communication and maintain delicate relationships. We are happy to report that, as of this writing, construction has begun on a new courthouse.
- 2. <u>Domestic Violence Assistance Project</u>. During the current reporting period, DVAP was staffed by a total of 72 volunteers, who provided a total of 936 volunteer hours. In this reporting period, our volunteers distributed our materials to 714 people and met with 276 individuals who requested follow-up support from the WLP Telephone Counseling Service.

Health Care Reform: Women Care About Health Care.

We are nearing completion of this health report, which will be an examination of the impact that discrimination, violence and the social status of women has on their health.

#### **Economic Justice: Increasing Cash Assistance.**

We have developed a briefing book, "Women and Welfare in Pennsylvania," on which we worked closely with Community Legal Services. We have reached out to local and state organizations, renewing and strengthening our alliances and welcoming like-minded people in our goal of raising awareness about the shamefully low cash assistance levels in Pennsylvania.

### **Telephone Counseling and Consumer Education.**

This year, we had an exceptionally strong cadre of volunteers and interns, who responded to 4,591 problems expressed by over 1,500 callers. Over 5,000 other individuals utilized the resource page of our website.

#### WomenVote PA (WVPA)

WVPA, the civic engagement initiative of the WLP, worked with various coalitions to tackle emerging issues affecting women's access to health care at the state and federal levels. A number of bills emerged in the General Assembly attempting to further restrict or outright ban abortion access in Pennsylvania. We shifted our goals from planning a conference aimed at discussing the future of health care exchanges to defending women's access to abortion and reproductive health services across the board. WVPA continues to work with the *Coalition for Healthy Families and Workplaces* to pass a paid sick leave bill currently before Philadelphia City Council.
