Section 1.509(a)-3(c)(3) of the Treasury Regulations provides that a contribution may be excluded as an "unusual grant" from the denominator and the numerator of the public support test based on a facts and circumstances review. The exclusion generally applies to substantial contributions and bequests from disinterested parties which, contributions or bequests:

- (i) Are attracted by reason of the publicly supported nature of the organization;
- (ii) Are unusual or unexpected with respect to the amount thereof; and
- (iii) Would by reason of their size, adversely affect the status of the organization as normally meeting the one-third support test.

These three factors are an initial inquiry to be made before the actual determination of whether the grant is an unusual grant.

Although generally unusual grants come from disinterest persons, that is not always the case and that is not mandatory for a grant to be classified as unusual. Indeed, the Regulation uses the word "generally" because there are situations where a party related to the organization may be the one providing the unusual grant, as is this case. In December 2008, the Foundation received a contribution of land that is of such substantial size and nature that it is an unusual grant within the intent and spirit of the applicable Regulations.

The contribution was of a large number of acres that are necessary to protect the view shed around Roden Crater, which is a substantial public art project being built and created by James Turrell. The Foundation was created, in part, to serve as an information center for and to inform the public about Roden Crater and the art project, and to house the works of artist James Turrell during his lifetime and following his death. The contribution of the land was made to the Foundation because it is a public charity serving the noted purposes. The contribution was unusual because of its size, just over \$1.6 million in value and 37 parcels of property all at a single time, and because its size will adversely affect the status of the organization in meeting its one-third support test. This grant is unusual because the need was for specific pieces of real estate and there will never be such a specific need again. The grant was also unexpected because the land could have been held by the Turrells in their personal capacity, but they decided to give the property to the Foundation so that the Foundation would control the property, not the Turrells. Even if that can be construed as expected because of their involvement with the Foundation, the test is unusual with respect to size or amount or unexpected, as alternative tests. Certainly this was unusual with respect to size.

Section 1.509(a)-3(c)(4) of the regulations sets forth additional facts and circumstances in determining whether a particular grant may be considered an "unusual grant" and, therefore, excluded in determining public support. Section 1.170A-9(e)(6)(iii) provides that all pertinent factors will be taken into consideration in making an unusual grant determination and states, further, that no single factor will necessarily be determinative. Among the factors to be considered are:

- (a) Whether the contribution was made by any person who created the organization, previously contributed a substantial part of its support or endowment, or stood in position of authority, with respect to the organization;
 - (b) Whether the contribution was a bequest or an inter vivos transfer;
- (c) Whether the contribution was in the form of cash, readily marketable securities, or assets which further the exempt purposes of the organization;
- (d) Whether, prior to the receipt of the particular contribution, the organization (1) has carried on an actual program of public solicitation and exempt activities and (2) has been able to attract a significant amount of public support;
- (e) Whether the organization may reasonably be expected to attract a significant amount of public support subsequent to the particular contribution;
- (f) Whether, prior to the year in which the particular contribution was received, the organization met the one-third support test without the benefit of any exclusions of grants;
- (g) Whether neither the contributor nor any person standing in a relationship to such contributor (family members, business owners, etc.) continues directly or indirectly to exercise control over the organization;
- (h) Whether the organization has a representative governing body (one independent from the contributor or those related to him); and
- (i) Whether material restrictions or conditions have been imposed by the transferor upon the transferee in connection with such transfer.

In the case at hand, although the contribution was made by the two founders who are also two current board members of the Foundation (James and Kyung Turrell), and those donors are still living, the other factors dictate in favor of this being an unusual grant.

First, the contribution is one of vital importance to the Roden Crater project being undertaken by the artist James Turrell and the Foundation. The contribution of the 1,300+ acres of land was made of assets specifically for furthering the exempt purpose of the Foundation. Protecting the "view shed" of the Roden Crater is critical to the successful completion of the project and preserving it for future generations. (See rodencrater.com). Any light pollution from development of the acreage around Roden Crater will destroy the efficacy of the project, so the acreage surrounding the crater has been either purchased or leased on long-term contracts so that no development can be undertaken. The work involves explorations in light and space that speak to viewers without words, impacting the eye, body, and mind to heighten awareness. Turrell is the recipient of several prestigious art awards such as Guggenheim and MacArthur Fellowships.

Roden Crater is an extinct volcanic cinder cone, situated at an elevation of approximately 5,400 feet in the San Francisco Volcanic Field near Arizona's Painted Desert and the Grand Canyon. The roughly 400,000 year old, 600 foot tall red and black cinder cone is being

turned into a monumental work of art and naked eye observatory. Working with visual phenomena that have interested man since the dawn of civilization, the Roden Crater project will bring the light of the heavens down to earth, linking visitors with the celestial movements of planets, stars and distant galaxies. In addition to exploring the interplay of light and space as art, the project at Roden Crater will be a project for a natural setting that would extend explorations of light and space into the western landscape.

The Skystone Foundation, a private operating foundation, was able to arrange the purchase of Roden Crater in 1977, with funding provided by the Dia Art Foundation, and construction began in 1979. In cooperation between the Foundation and the Skystone Foundation, when complete, the project will contain 20 spaces (some with more than one viewing space). The light within the spaces will come from many sources, and some effects will be familiar to those who have seen the artist's installations and Skyspaces over the years. The relative remoteness of Roden Crater will require a journey and a commitment of time on the part of visitors, deepening the experience of discovery. The Roden Crater has an ideal shape and relatively unobstructed position for capturing east-west light at optimum times. The first major and daunting phase of construction, including the movement of over 1.3 million cubic yards of earth to help shape the Crater Bowl and the construction of the 854' East Tunnel and related spaces, all with minimal impact to the crater's natural appearance, is now complete. Fundraising is underway for phase 2 and the design for the South Space, next to be built, is in final engineering. The two foundations have worked together with the State of Arizona to secure leases or purchases of 26,956 acres of land to secure the view shed around the Crater.

Second, prior to and subsequent to the receipt of the contribution, the Foundation (1) has carried on an actual program of public solicitation and exempt activities, (2) has been able to attract public support, and (3) will continue actively fund raising.

Third, the Foundation reasonably expects to attract a significant amount of public support subsequent to the particular contribution. The Foundation is actively working on all types of fundraising programs and is working to build its base of contributors. The Foundation has 100% public support other than the land contribution.

Fourth, if the contribution of land were excluded from the public support test, the Foundation would meet and has met the one-third support test without the benefit of any other exclusion grant.

Fifth, the Foundation has a representative governing body with other board members independent of James and Kyung Turrell. Michael Govan is unrelated to the Turrells. Mr. Govan joined the Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA) as Chief Executive Officer and Wallis Annenberg Director in 2006. In this role, he oversees all activities of the museum, including art programming and the Transformation campaign, an ambitious, multi-faceted building project that is expanding, upgrading, and unifying the museum's eight-building, twenty-acre campus, most recently including the addition of the Lynda and Stewart Resnick Exhibition Pavilion. Another director on the Foundation's Board, also unrelated to the Turrells, is Richard Andrews. He is president of the Skystone Foundation, the organization responsible for the ultimate realization of the Roden Crater Project. Mr. Andrews was the director of the University

of Washington's Henry Art Gallery for two decades. Andrews is the reason the Henry is a nationally recognized force on the contemporary art scene. Andrews was in charge of public art at the Seattle Arts Commission during its golden years, 1978 to 1984, when Seattle was a national leader in the field. After that, he served for three years as director of the visual arts program at the National Endowment for the Arts. He serves as consultant for public art projects around the country and specializes in creating common ground between contemporary art and the public.

Sixth, there are no material restrictions or conditions imposed on the land by the Turrells as the contribution of the land is solely for the furtherance of the exempt purposes of the Foundation and to benefit the Roden Crater project.

In summary, 1) the Foundation needs the specific parcels of land that were contributed for the successful completion of its exempt purpose; 2) the land was held by the Turrell family and not by the public so public support could not have obtained the land; 3) the Foundation has had, and expects to continue to have, sufficient public support to continue construction and design of the facility and to co-operate it once it is open to the public; and 4) the Foundation will never again need a substantial contribution from a single source in order to fulfill its mission. The Foundation, therefore, is able to demonstrate that it is sufficiently dependent on public support to necessitate that it be responsive to the needs of the general public.

Finally, the donated land represents an asset which is uniquely suited for and specifically critical to the success of the Roden Crater project, making this transaction a once-in-a-lifetime event. Aside from this one, unique transaction, the Foundation has a demonstrated history of attracting sufficient public support to operate. The Foundation will benefit the public by aiding in allowing the public to explore the outside universe in a way that touches the internal universe of perception. Accordingly, the facts and circumstances lead to the conclusion that the contribution of land should be excluded from the support test as an unusual grant. In providing this attachment and analysis, the Foundation is notifying the Service of its determination to amend its public support test. Beginning with the 2010 Form 990 the contribution of land will be treated as an unusual grant and thereby excluded from the public support test.
