990PF, PART IX-A: SUMMARY OF DIRECT CHARITABLE EXPENSESFYE 6-30-2011

The Foundation fulfills its mission to improve the health and health care of Chicago's most vulnerable populations through two major activities; grantmaking and convening. The Michael Reese Health Trust disburses grants through three grant programs: Responsive, Proactive and Community Response. The second activity, Convening, is closely and purposely connected to all areas of our grantmaking. This involves systematic information dissemination and educational activities to achieve the goals of enhancing networking and the effective use of resources and "best practice" information.

In addition to ongoing meetings with foundations, public health, medical, social service, and research colleagues, the foundation sponsored several events during the 2010-11 fiscal year. These included the following:

- 1) Two grantee meeting breakfasts, which served to recognize and inform grant recipients of grants awarded through the Responsive grant program, provides opportunities to learn from selected experts in the field as well as about the activities and services of other grantee recipients.
- 2) Five (half-day) Proactive grant project peer reviews sessions were held: 1) summarizing and reviewing the findings from the Evaluation of Chicago's Plan to End Homelessness study; 2) reducing gang violence through effective hospital-based interventions involving violence interrupters; 3) addressing and improving health related services between Chicago's deaf community and health care organizations; 4) improving pediatric patient safety by establishing pediatric quality measures and practices; and, 5) building a continuum of services between Mt. Sinai and Access Community Health Care with a special focus on the integration of specialty care services. The majority of these peer review meetings involved bringing in local and national experts to interact and share information with local stakeholders.
- 3) Four (half-day) Health Care Issues Roundtable sessions were held, involving fourteen of Chicago's health care leaders, along with invited local and national experts brought in by the Health Trust. These discussions focused on current and innovative strategies and processes for improving health care quality and access.

Convening activities are also used for pre-planning of multi-year, multi-agency, Proactive grants.

Our website, www.healthtrust.net, which was significantly redesigned this past year to improve easy access to information, tools and support, is a mechanism for disseminating reports, papers and articles from supported projects and relevant activities. It provides searchable information about past and current grants, agencies and programs, and information on how to apply for grants through an on-line grant application process for Responsive grants.
