MCBW provides a critical bridge between the work of local advocates providing direct services, statewide policy makers, and federal responses to violence against women. Through our statewide membership and regular convening and meetings with member programs, MCBW relays the challenges and successes of local work to the national level, and conveys best practices emerging at the national level to local member programs. The work of the Coalition is informed by the needs and realities of programs working at the local level, serving as a conduit for information to and from the field, informing statewide and national stakeholders on practice-based evidence.
