(1) Organization

Alegent Health—Bergan Mercy Health System and Affiliates (Health System) is a not-for-profit organization that operates a health care delivery system in eastern Nebraska and western Iowa. The sole corporate member of the Health System is Catholic Health Initiatives (CHI). The mission of CHI is to nurture the healing ministry of the Church, bringing it new life, energy, and viability in the 21st century CHI is committed to fidelity to the Gospel, with emphasis on human dignity and social justice in the creation of healthier communities. CHI is sponsored by a lay-religious partnership, calling on other Catholic sponsors and systems to unite to ensure the future of Catholic health care.

The consolidated financial statements include the accounts of the following entities or operating divisions

Alegent Health—Bergan Mercy Health System and Affiliates (which includes)
The Archbishop Bergan Mercy Medical Center. Omaha, Nebraska
Alegent Health—Mercy Hospital, Council Bluffs, Iowa
Avantas, LLC
Alegent Health—Mercy Hospital, Corning, Iowa

Significant intercorporate accounts and transactions have been eliminated in the consolidation

As discussed in note 3, the Health System has entered into a Joint Operating Agreement with Alegent Health—Immanuel Medical Center (Immanuel) forming the Alegent Health system (Alegent)

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies of the Health System. These policies are in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles

(a) Use of Estimates

The preparation of consolidated financial statements in conformity with U S generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the consolidated financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include highly liquid investments with original maturities of 12 months or less

(c) Investments

At June 30, 2011 and 2010, over 99% of the Health System's investment portfolio is invested in the CHI investment limited partnership, respectively. (note 4) Investments in partnerships are recorded using the equity method of accounting with the related equity in losses reported as other income in the accompanying consolidated financial statements

(d) Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost or market Cost is determined principally using the first-in, first-out method

(e) Property and Equipment

Property and equipment acquisitions are recorded at cost. Depreciation is provided over the estimated useful life of each class of depreciable asset and is computed using the straight-line method based on the following useful lives.

Land improvements	10-40 years
Buildings and improvements	5-40 years
Equipment	3-20 years

Interest cost incurred on borrowed funds during the period of construction of capital assets is capitalized as a component of the cost of acquiring those assets. During the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, the Health System capitalized approximately \$1,270 and \$3,767, respectively, of interest

Gifts of long-lived assets, such as land, buildings, or equipment, are reported as unrestricted support and are excluded from the excess of revenues over expenses unless explicit donor stipulations specify how the donated assets must be used. Gifts of long-lived assets with explicit restrictions that specify how the assets are to be used and gifts of cash or other assets that must be used to acquire long-lived assets are reported as restricted support. Absent explicit donor stipulations about how those long-lived assets must be maintained, expirations of donor restrictions are reported when the donated or acquired long-lived assets are placed in service.

(f) Investment in Joint Ventures

The Health System has invested in certain joint ventures and accounts for such investments using either the cost or the equity method of accounting based on the relative percentage of ownership and the level of influence over the investee

(g) Long-Lived Assets

Long-lived assets, such as property, plant, and equipment, are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount of an asset may not be recoverable. If circumstances require a long-lived asset or asset group to be tested for possible impairment, the Health System first compares undiscounted cash flows expected to be generated by that asset or asset group to its carrying value. If the carrying value of the long-lived asset or asset group is not recoverable on an undiscounted cash flow basis, an impairment is recognized to the extent that the carrying value exceeds its fair value. Fair value is determined through various valuation techniques including discounted cash flow models, quoted market values, and third-party independent appraisals, as considered necessary.

(h) Temporarily and Permanently Restricted Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use is limited by donors to a specific time period or purpose. Permanently restricted net assets have been restricted by donors to be maintained by the Health System in perpetuity.

Temporarily and permanently restricted net assets held by the Health System are recorded and accounted for in accordance with the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA) and Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Subtopic 958-205. Endowments of Not-For-Profit Organizations Net Asset Classification of Funds Subject to an Enacted Version of the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act and Enhanced Disclosures for All Endowment Funds

The Health System holds endowment funds for support of its programs and operations. As required by U.S. generally accepted accounting principles, net assets and the changes therein associated with endowment funds are classified and reported based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

The Health System has interpreted UPMIFA as requiring the preservation of the whole dollar value of the original gift as of the gift date of donor-restricted endowment funds absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary. As a result of this interpretation, the Health System classifies as permanently restricted net assets the original value of gifts donated to the permanent endowment and the original value of subsequent gifts to the permanent endowment. Interest, dividends, and net appreciation of the donor-restricted endowment funds are classified according to donor stipulations. Absent any donor-imposed restrictions, interest, dividends, and net appreciation are deemed appropriated for expenditure when earned. In accordance with UPMIFA, the Health System considers the following factors in making a determination to appropriate or accumulate donor-restricted endowment funds.

- (1) the duration and preservation of the endowment fund.
- (2) the purposes of the Health System and the donor-restricted endowment fund.
- (3) general economic conditions.
- (4) the possible effect of inflation or deflation.
- (5) the expected total return from income and the appreciation of investments.
- (6) other resources of the Health System, and
- (7) the investment policies of the Health System

Endowment assets are invested in the CHI investment limited partnership (note 4)

(i) Donor-Restricted Gifts

Unconditional promises to give cash and other assets are reported at fair value at the date the promise is received. Conditional promises to give and indications of intentions to give are reported at fair value at the date the gift is received. The gifts are reported as either temporarily or permanently restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified as unrestricted net assets and reported in the consolidated statements of operations as net assets released from restrictions. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met within the same year as received are reported as unrestricted contributions in the accompanying consolidated financial statements.

Unconditional promises to give that are expected to be collected within one year are recorded at net realizable value. Unconditional promises to give that are expected to be collected in future years are recorded at the present value of their estimated future cash flows. The discounts on those amounts are computed using risk-free interest rates applicable to the years in which the promises are received. Amortization of the discounts is included in contribution revenue.

(j) Net Patient Service Revenue

The Health System has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the Health System at amounts different from its established rates. Payment arrangements include prospectively determined rates per discharge, reimbursed costs, discounted charges, and per diem payments. Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payors, and others for services rendered, including estimated retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payors. Retroactive adjustments are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted in future periods as final settlements are determined.

(k) Charity Care – Benefits for the Poor and Underserved

The Health System provides care to patients who meet certain criteria under its charity care policy without charge or at amounts less than its established rates. Because the Health System does not pursue collection of amounts once determined to qualify as charity care, they are not reported as revenue in the consolidated statements of operations. The amount of charges foregone for services and supplies furnished under the Health System's charity policy aggregated approximately \$49.578 and \$45,950 in 2011 and 2010, respectively

(1) Excess of Revenues over Expenses

The consolidated statements of operations include excess of revenues over expenses. Changes in unrestricted net assets, which are excluded from excess of revenues over expenses consistent with industry practice, include unrealized gains and losses on investments other than trading securities, permanent transfers of assets to and from affiliates for other than goods and services, contributions of long-lived assets (including assets acquired using contributions, which by donor restriction were

to be used for the purpose of acquiring such assets), and certain joint operating agreement settlements

(m) Estimated Malpractice Costs

The provision for estimated medical malpractice claims includes estimates of the ultimate costs for both reported claims and claims incurred but not reported

(n) Fair Value of Financial Instruments

The carrying amounts of cash and cash equivalents, accounts receivable, estimated third-party payor settlements, and payables approximate fair value due to the short duration of these instruments. Fair value for investments is based on quoted market prices, if available, or estimated using quoted market prices for similar securities. The carrying amount of the investment in the CHI investment limited partnership is based on the net asset value reported by the limited partnership, which approximates fair value. The fair value of long-term debt as of June 30, 2011 and 2010 is approximately \$186,893 and \$172,064, respectively.

The Health System follows the provisions of ASC Topic 820. Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, for fair value measurements of financial assets and financial liabilities and for fair value measurements of nonfinancial items that are recognized or disclosed at fair value in the consolidated financial statements on a recurring basis. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

(o) Asset Retirement Obligations

The Health System recognizes the fair value of liabilities for legal obligations associated with asset retirements in the period in which it is incurred, if a reasonable estimate of the fair value of the obligation can be made. Over time, the obligation is accreted to its present value each period. Upon settlement of the obligation, any difference between the cost to settle the asset retirement obligation and the liability recorded is recognized as a gain or loss in the consolidated statements of operations. The Health System's obligations relate to estimates of the costs to abate clinical and administrative facilities containing asbestos and to replace underground storage tanks. At June 30, 2011 and 2010, this long-term liability totaled \$1,732 and \$1,756, respectively.

(p) Income Taxes

All affiliated entities (see note 1) have been recognized as not-for-profit corporations by the Internal Revenue Service as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code) and are exempt from federal income taxes on related income pursuant to Section 501(a) of the Code, except Avantas, LLC as a multi-member limited liability company treated as a partnership and therefore is not subject to federal and state income taxes

The Health System recognizes the effect of income tax positions only if those positions are more likely than not of being sustained Such tax positions, which are more than 50% likely of being

realized, are measured at their highest value. Changes in recognition or measurement are reflected in the period in which the change in judgment occurs. During 2011 and 2010, management determined that there are no income tax positions requiring recognition in the consolidated financial statements.

(3) Joint Operating Agreement

The Health System has entered into a Joint Operating Agreement (the Agreement) with Immanuel for purposes of creating and operating an integrated health care delivery system

Under the terms of the Agreement, the consolidated operating results and capital expenditures of the Health System and Immanuel are shared on an equal basis. Each entity continues to own its respective assets and is responsible for its own liabilities.

The Agreement provides for, among other things, joint management of the Health System, Immanuel, and Alegent Health, a separate not-for-profit corporation as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code Alegent was established to improve the health status of the community through the development of a network to provide integrated health care services to the Midlands region. Alegent operates certain community health care clinics, Midlands Community Hospital located in Papillion, Nebraska, Lakeside Hospital and Alegent Health Foundation in Omaha, Nebraska, and provides management services to the Health System. The Health System and Immanuel are the sole corporate members of Alegent.

In connection with the activities and events described above, certain administrative functions of the Health System and Immanuel are performed at Alegent. These administrative functions include human resources, information systems, planning and marketing, legal, system management, accounting and finance, and other centralized functions. During 2011 and 2010, approximately \$75,740 and \$86,584, respectively, of such expenses were charged back to the Health System, at cost, and are reflected in operating expenses in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations.

The Agreement contains provisions related to dissolution that generally provide for distribution of the assets based on fair market value. Distribution percentages vary depending upon the manner in which dissolution occurs

In connection with the Agreement, the Health System has recorded an adjustment to excess of revenues over expenses of \$(19.785) and \$(16.837) for the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively, representing the sharing of the operating results of the Health System and Immanuel In addition, \$17.406 and \$(3.868) have been reflected as adjustments to net assets in 2011 and 2010, respectively, which reflect the sharing of capital expenditures for the same periods

The Health System has recorded its 50% share of the loss of Alegent Health and Affiliates of \$(8.278) and \$(9.303) for the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively, which is reflected as equity in operating income and other income of Alegent in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations

At June 30, 2011 and 2010, the Health System had recorded an intercorporate receivable of \$2,585 and \$35,906, respectively, as a result of these transactions

(5) Net Patient Service Revenue

The Health System has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the Health System at amounts different from its established rates. A summary of the payment arrangements with major third-party payors is as follows.

(a) Medicare

Inpatient acute care services and outpatient services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic, and other factors. In addition, Alegent Health—Mercy Hospital, Inc., Corning, Iowa, has been designated a Critical Access Hospital and, accordingly, is reimbursed its cost of providing services to Medicare beneficiaries.

(b) Nebraska and Iowa Medicaid

Nebraska and Iowa inpatient and Iowa outpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are primarily paid at prospectively determined rates per discharge or procedure Certain Nebraska outpatient services are reimbursed based on a percentage rate representing the average ratio of cost to charges discounted by 18% Physician clinic services are paid based on fee schedule amounts. The hospitals designated as Critical Access Hospitals are reimbursed based on their reasonable costs.

Revenue from the Medicare and Medicaid programs accounted for approximately 31% and 10%, respectively, of the Health System's net patient service revenue for the year ended June 30, 2011, and approximately 29% and 10%, respectively, of the Health System's net patient service revenue for the year ended June 30, 2010. Laws and regulations governing the Medicare and Medicaid programs are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. As a result, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates will change by a material amount in the near term. The 2011 and 2010 net patient service revenue increased approximately \$1,137 and \$3,049, respectively, due to the removal of allowances previously estimated that were no longer necessary as a result of final settlements and years that are no longer subject to audits, reviews, and investigations

The Health System, Immanuel, and Alegent have entered into the Alegent Financing Agreement (AFA) with CHI, which provides access to the capital markets. Under the terms of the AFA, the Health System is defined as a Participant and Alegent and Immanuel as Designated Affiliates. These categories define the level of participation and control of CHI. The terms of the AFA require the Alegent system to meet certain

financial covenants and ratios and provide other limits relating to additional indebtedness and transfers of property, among others

On November 10, 2009, Bergan, Immanuel, and Alegent issued additional promissory notes to CHI for \$282 million. During 2010, Bergan received approximately \$100 million of its \$111 million in debt proceeds from CHI, and the remaining \$11 million in debt proceeds was received during 2011 as financed assets were placed into service.

Under the terms of the AFA, each party has issued promissory notes to CHI. The obligations issued under the AFA represent the individual obligations of the issuer. In the unlikely event that CHI would have insufficient funds to make required payments on its financial obligations, the Health System, Immanuel, Alegent, and all other Participants and Designated Affiliates of CHI may be required to contribute funds to CHI to enable it to meet its obligations.

(7) Retirement Plans

(a) Alegent Health Retirement 403(b) Plan

Beginning January 1, 2010, the Health System participates in the Alegent 403(b) savings plan Participating employees can contribute a portion of their salary to the plan, subject to IRS regulations. The Health System makes matching contributions up to a maximum of 3% based on salary and a fixed contribution up to 6% based on years of service. Pension expense related to this plan for the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010 was \$6,370 and \$3,216, respectively.

(b) Alegent Health Multioptional Pension Plan

The Health System participates in the Alegent multioptional pension plan covering substantially all of the Health System's employees During 2009. Alegent's board of directors approved a resolution to freeze the plan effective January 1, 2010. Generally, employees were eligible for participation after completing one year of service in which the employee completes 1,000 hours or more of service and had attained the age of 19. This Plan covered eligible employees as of January 1, 2010. For each plan year, a retirement benefit was provided for as a percentage of the eligible participant's annual compensation. Employee contributions to the plan were not permitted except for certain rollover provisions. Benefits earned under the plan are available to participants at a normal retirement age of

(8) Fair Value Measurements

(10) Insurance Programs

The Health System participates in a centralized risk management program sponsored by Alegent for its hospital professional and general liability insurance coverage. The program provides for a deductible of \$2,000 per occurrence, with annual aggregates of \$4,000 for general liability and \$6,000 for hospital professional liability. In addition, the program has excess coverage purchased from the commercial insurance market providing for \$30,000 per occurrence and in the aggregate. In the event that the current policy is not renewed or replaced with equivalent insurance, claims based on occurrences during its term but reported subsequently will be uninsured. The Health System has established reserves for possible losses on both asserted and unasserted claims based upon an independent actuarial study.

The Health System participates with Alegent in a workers' compensation self-insurance program, which provides coverage for all workers' compensation claims. Coverage is provided through a self-insurance program with a fronting policy whereby the responsibility for the initial \$400 and \$450, for Nebraska and Iowa, respectively, of each claim resides with the workers' compensation self-insurance program. A specific stop-loss agreement covers claims amounts in excess of \$400 and \$450 up to each state's statutory requirements. The Health System has established reserves for possible losses on both asserted and unasserted claims based upon an independent actuarial study.

The Health System is also self-insured under its employee group health and dental programs up to certain limits. Included in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations is a provision for premiums for excess coverage and payments for claims including estimates of the ultimate costs for both reported claims and claims incurred but not yet reported at year-end related to such claims.

Management of the Health System is presently not aware of any unasserted general and professional liability or group health, dental, or workers' compensation claims that would have a material adverse impact on the accompanying consolidated financial statements

(11) Laws and Regulations

The health care industry is subject to numerous laws and regulations of federal, state, and local governments. These laws and regulations include, but are not necessarily limited to, matters such as licensure, accreditation, government health care program participation requirements, reimbursements for patient services, and Medicare and Medicaid fraud and abuse. Violations of these laws and regulations could result in expulsion from government health care programs, together with the imposition of significant fines and penalties, as well as significant repayments for patient services previously billed. Management believes that the Health System is in compliance with fraud and abuse, as well as other applicable government laws and regulations.

(13) Facility Plan

Alegent has developed an overall framework for integrating the elements of its facility plan referred to as Generation Patient Successful implementation of all elements of Generation Patient will enable the enhancement and innovation of clinical services, facilities, and hospital campuses across the Alegent system. The investments in plant and equipment are funded through a combination of operating cash flow, investments, long-term debt, and philanthropy. Total Generation Patient expenditures are projected to approximate \$400,000 of which the Health System would fund 50% as a result of either direct acquisition for the Health System or through the equalization of expenditures provided by the Joint Operating Agreement Expenditures are expected to conclude in 2012. As of June 30, 2011 and 2010, total costs incurred relating to Generation Patient projects for all Alegent entities approximated \$337,927 and \$317,379, respectively.

(14) Subsequent Events

The Health System has evaluated subsequent events from the consolidated balance sheet date through September 8, 2011, the date at which the consolidated financial statements were available to be issued, and determined there are no other items to disclose
