DAKOTAS AREA ELECTRICAL APPRENTICESHIP
AND TRAINING FUND
TRUST AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this 1st day of July, 1977, by and between Dakotas Chapter, National Electrical Contractors Association of 509 25th Avenue North, Fargo, North Dakota, (hereinafter referred to as "Employer"), and Local Union Number(s) 714, Minot, North Dakota; 1426, Grand Forks, North Dakota; 1250, Rapid City, South Dakota; and 426, Sioux Falls, South Dakota; of International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, (hereinafter referred to as "Union"),

W I T N E S S E T H :

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have heretofore entered into various collective bargaining agreements, and

WHEREAS, such collective bargaining agreements provide in part and among other things for an educational fund, for a joint apprenticeship and training program, and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto are desirous of creating a Trust by the execution of this Agreement, in a manner which will, in effect, implement and comply with the spirit and intent of the collective bargaining agreements, the applicable federal laws and state laws concerning such agreements, and

WHEREAS, the Employer and Union have taken appropriate steps in their respective organizations to establish a fund and have adopted resolutions authorizing the respective officers of each organization to enter into this Trust Agreement and for

the selection of the Trustees and to set forth the power and duties of the Trustees to administer the Agreement, and

WHEREAS, the Trustees selected have signed their willingness to accept the Trust hereinafter set forth upon the terms and conditions enumerated herein by subscribing their names hereto, and

WHEREAS, the Employer and Union agree that all employers signatory to this Agreement shall pay to the Fund the percentage of their gross monthly labor payroll in accordance with the Collective Bargaining Agreement between Chapter and Local Unions of all their employees who performed work covered by the Collective Bargaining Agreement, or those additional employees of either the Employer or Union who by agreement are covered by this Declaration of Trust, to the Trustees.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter expressed, the parties hereto agree as follows:

I.01. ESTABLISHMENT OF TRUST. The parties hereto agree to establish an Electrical Apprenticeship, Training and Educational Trust Fund (hereinafter called "Trust Fund"), to be known as and administered in the name of the "Dakotas Area Electrical Apprenticeship and Training Trust Fund."

I.02. CONTRIBUTIONS BY EMPLOYER. The individual employers and the Union agree that employers covered by the Collective Bargaining Agreement shall hereafter contribute to the Trust Fund in an amount and manner provided in the Collective Bargaining Agreement entered into by and between the Employer and the Union (hereinafter called the "Collective Bargaining

Agreement"). It shall be the duty of the covered employers to remit to the Trustees sums in accordance with the Collective Bargaining Agreement, beginning with the first payroll period following July 1, 1977, and furnish to the Trustees designated a monthly statement showing the full amount due, based on the payroll of such employers. The Trustees shall have the power to demand, collect or receive employer contribution and to hold the same until applied to the ultimate purposes provided for herein in this Trust, and they may take such steps, including the institution of prosecution of, or the intervention of, in a proceeding at law, in equity, or in bankruptcy, as may be necessary or desirable to affect the collection of such contributions. It is the intention of the parties that the Trust Fund hereby established shall be the sole Trust Fund for the support of apprenticeship, training and education programs for electrical apprentices and journeymen in the area covered by the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

I.03. COLLECTION OF EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS. The Trustees shall have the authority and the responsibility to collect delinquent employer contributions as follows:

- A. An Employer shall be considered "delinquent" for a particular work month if its required report and payment for that month are not postmarked on or before the 15th day of the following month (the "due date"), irrespective of whether such delinquency is willful or otherwise.
- B. The delinquent Employer shall be required to pay all costs of collection actually incurred by the Trustees or corporation, including attorney's fees, service fees, filing fees, court reporter fees and all other fees, costs and disbursements incurred by or on behalf of the Trustees or corporation in

collecting the amount due (the "costs"). It is agreed that the reasonable attorney fees for which a delinquent employer shall be liable shall be determined as follows:

Twenty-five Percent (25%) of the total cumulative amount collected from any one delinquent employer for all assessments remaining due to this fund up to the amount of \$300 collected;

Twenty-three Percent (23%) of the said funds next collected in excess of \$300, up to the amount of \$1,700; and

Eighteen Percent (18%) of all said funds thereafter collected from said delinquent employer.

- C. If an Employer becomes delinquent for a particular work month (as provided in ("a") above, he shall be required to pay, in addition to the amount of the delinquency and costs, and interest on the outstanding amount of the delinquency from the due date at the rate of eight percent (8%) per annum.
- D. All employer payments made after the Employer is delinquent shall be applied first to reduce any outstanding interest and thereafter to reduce delinquencies in the order in which they were incurred and last to reduce the costs.

I.04. CONTRIBUTIONS FROM EXISTING FUNDS. The Trustees are hereby expressly authorized to accept contributions from existing funds, if any, which were previously established for such apprenticeship, training and educational purposes, and to deposit such contributions to the credit of this Trust Fund.

I.05. FUND SHALL BE NON-PROFIT. The Trust Fund shall be conducted solely as a non-profit organization and exclusively for the purpose of supporting a program for the training and education of electrical apprentices, journeymen, and others and for programs in furtherance of the electrical apprenticeship and training program and the electrical industry. The Fund shall be used solely to defray the cost of the apprenticeship and training programs established

under the provisions of the Collective Bargaining Agreement and the Area-Wide Joint Apprenticeship and Training Agreement including, but not limited to, payment of the cost of establishing and maintenance of apprenticeship and other training programs, including sufficient personnel, salaries, supplies, facilities, tools, equipment, textbooks, and other instructional materials and such other items directly related to the education and training of apprentices and journeymen by the Area-Wide Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee as established by the Collective Bargaining Agreement (hereinafter "Area-Wide Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee") may deem practical and desirable.

II.01. BOARD OF TRUSTEES. The Trust Fund shall be controlled and administered by a Board of Trustees, (hereinafter called the "Trustees"), which shall consist of sixteen (16) members, eight (8) appointed by the Employer and eight (8) appointed by the Unions. Each Trustee, one (1) member representing the Chapter and one (1) member representing the Local Union, shall be selected from each trade area having a subcommittee as established by the Collective Bargaining Agreement, and shall continue to serve as a Trustee only as long as he remains a member of the subcommittee. The wage or trade area shall be as follows: (1) Minot, North Dakota; (2) Bismarck, North Dakota; (3) Williston, North Dakota; (4) Grand Forks, North Dakota; (5) Fargo, North Dakota; (6) Fergus Falls-Breckenridge, Minnesota; (7) Sioux Falls, South Dakota; (8) Rapid City, South Dakota. The Trustees appointed by the Employer

shall at all times have eight (8) votes and the Trustees appointed by the Union shall at all times have eight (8) votes, the eight votes to be allocated equally among the respective Trustees in attendance.

II.02. RESIGNATION AND VACANCIES OF TRUSTEES. Any Trustee may resign by instrument in writing, executed for that purpose and delivered to the remaining Trustees and to the parties which appointed him. In the event of termination or resignation, death, disqualification or disability or refusal to act of any Trustee appointed by the parties hereto, a successor Trustee may be named and appointed by the parties which named and appointed the retiring Trustee. No vacancy or vacancies in the office of the Trustee shall impair the power of the remaining Trustees acting in the manner hereinabove provided, to administer the affairs of the Trust, pending the filling of such vacancy or vacancies.

II.03. ELECTION OF OFFICERS. The Trustees shall elect from among their number a Chairman and Vice-Chairman. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Trustees. In absence of the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman shall serve as Chairman of all meetings. The Secretary-Treasurer of the Board of Trustees shall be the Secretary-Manager of Dakotas Chapter, National Electrical Contractors Association as hereinafter provided. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive all payments and contributions to the Trust, shall allocate, apportion and disburse same as directed by the Trustees to accomplish the purpose of this Trust and shall account to the Trustees.

II.04. QUORUM AT TRUSTEE MEETINGS. A quorum at meetings of the Trustees shall be five Trustees appointed by the Union and five Trustees appointed by the Employer. Votes may be made in writing by absentee Trustees, but such votes shall not increase the total vote of either Union or Employer Trustees, nor be counted for the establishing of a quorum at any meeting.

II.05. TRUSTEES TO SERVE WITHOUT PAY. The Trustees shall not receive any payment for their services as such. They may, however, be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the performance of their duties under this Trust Agreement. Any payments made under provisions of this Article shall be an expense of administration of the Trust Fund.

III.01. MONIES RECEIVED BY TRUSTEES. Any and all monies received by the Trustees hereunder shall be deposited in the name of this Trust Fund in such bank or banks as the Trustees may agree upon and designate as the trust depository. Any and all withdrawals of monies from such account or accounts shall be by check bearing the signature of one Employer Trustee and one Union Trustee, except as provided in Section III.03 hereafter.

III.02. DESIGNATION OF SIGNATOR TRUSTEES. The Employer Trustees shall designate in writing the name or names of the Employer Trustees who are authorized to sign checks in the manner above stated. The Union Trustees shall designate the name or names of the Union Trustees who are authorized to sign checks in the manner above stated. The Board of Trustees shall furnish notice to the bank or banks in which any account or accounts are maintained

and the name of the Trust Fund, giving the names and specimen signatures of the Trustees who are authorized to sign checks which are drawn on such account or accounts.

III.03. SECRETARY-TREASURER MAY SIGN. The Board of Trustees may authorize the Secretary-Treasurer of the Trustees to sign checks drawn on an account or accounts deposited in the bank or banks in the name of this Trust Fund. In all such instances, the bonding provisions of Section III.04 and notice provisions of Section III.02 shall apply to the Secretary-Treasurer so designated.

III.04. SURETY BOND FOR TRUSTEES AND SIGNATORS TO ACCOUNT. The Trustees shall immediately obtain a bond issued by a duly authorized surety company and maintain a position bond for faithful performance of duty which at all times cover each of the Trustees and any designated employee referred to in Section III.03 hereof. Such bond shall be maintained in the amount of not less than ten percent (10%) of the monies handled by the Trust Fund during the preceding fiscal year or if there is no preceding fiscal year, - then an amount not less than Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00). The cost of the premium of such bond shall be an administrative expense of the Trust Fund.

IV.01. FISCAL YEAR. For the purpose of this Trust Fund, the fiscal year shall terminate on each December 31.

IV.02. BOOKS OF ACCOUNT. The Trustees shall maintain true and accurate books of account and records of all transactions in the administration of this Trust Fund. The Trustees shall provide for an annual audit of such books of account and records

by a certified public accountant. A statement of the results of the audit shall be furnished to the Employer and the Union and made available for inspection by interested persons at the principal office of the Trust Fund which is presently 509 25th Avenue North, Fargo, North Dakota 58102.

V. LIABILITY FOR ACTS. Each Trustee shall be liable for only those acts or omissions occasioned by his own willful misconduct, badfaith or gross negligence.

VI. PROMULGATION OF RULES. The Trustees shall promulgate such rules and regulations as they deem necessary or appropriate for the effective administration of this Trust Fund. Rules and regulations so promulgated shall be consistent with its purpose, including the business to be conducted at regular or special meetings or otherwise.

VII. AMENDMENT TO TRUST AGREEMENT. This Trust Fund Agreement may be amended at any time by the mutual consent of the Employer and the Union, but no amendment shall be made which will in any manner divert the Trust Fund as then constituted to any purpose other than as contemplated herein, or in any manner which will conflict with the applicable federal or state legislation or rules or regulations promulgated under such legislation, covering such funds.

VIII. FUND TO BE ADMINISTERED WITHIN APPLICABLE LAW. It is the intention of the parties hereto to conduct all of the affairs of this Trust Agreement in accordance with all applicable

legislation. In the event that any of the provisions of this Trust Agreement are held to be invalid or illegal for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Trust Agreement unless such illegality or invalidity prevents the accomplishments of the purposes and objectives of this Trust Fund Agreement.

IX. LAWS APPLICABLE. This Trust Fund Agreement is entered into within the State of North Dakota and its terms and conditions shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of such state.

X. TERM OF AGREEMENT. This Trust Fund Agreement shall continue in effect for the period provided for in the current and other subsequent Collective Bargaining Agreements and for the period of any renewal or extension thereof. In the event of the termination of the Collective Bargaining Agreement, or the apprenticeship and training provisions thereof, the Trustees shall pay all of the indebtedness of the Trust Fund and shall use all the remaining monies of the Trust Fund, if any, for the continuance of apprenticeship, training and electrical education programs then operating and for the type herein contemplated, under the guidance of the Area-Wide Joint Apprenticeship Training Committee until such remaining monies have been exhausted.

XI. DIRECTOR OF APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING. The Dakotas Chapter, National Electrical Contractors Association will furnish the Director of Apprenticeship and Training. The Director of Appren-

ticeship and Training shall perform such duties and acts as delegated to him by the Trustees and the Area-Wide Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee.

XII. SECRETARY-TREASURER OF TRUST FUND. The Secretary-Manager of the Dakotas Chapter, National Electrical Contractors Association shall be named as the Secretary-Treasurer of the Trust Fund. He shall perform such duties and acts as delegated by the Trustees. The Secretary-Treasurer shall not be a member of the Local Chapter or any of the Local Unions in the area and shall not have a vote on any matters before the Trustees.

XIII. ADMINISTRATION OF THE TRUST. The Dakotas Chapter, National Electrical Contractors Association shall furnish all secretarial, administrative and related services. The Trustees are hereby authorized to reimburse the Dakotas Chapter, National Electrical Contractors Association for all expenses incurred in conjunction with furnishing necessary administrative, secretarial and related services.

All payments to Dakotas Chapter, National Electrical Contractors Association for administrative, secretarial and related services shall be on itemized invoice directed to the Trustees at least quarterly but not more frequent than monthly.

XIV. TAX EXEMPT STATUS OF TRUST FUND. The Trust Fund shall be held in trust for the payment of all expenses of operating the apprenticeship, training and educational programs as contemplated in the Collective Bargaining Agreement. This Trust is contingent upon and subject to obtaining and retaining approval of the

Commissioner of Internal Revenue as the employers of the employees may find necessary to establish the deductibility for income tax purposes of any and all payments made by the employers to this Trust as being tax exempt under applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. Any modification or amendment of this Agreement may be made retroactively by the employers with the consent of the Union, if necessary, to qualify and maintain the Trust to meet the requirements of applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code, as now in effect or hereafter enacted, provided, however, that the Trust is not materially altered.

XV. APPROVAL BY OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES. The Trustees shall see that approval is obtained for this Trust Agreement and the Trust Fund by any and all appropriate governmental agencies as may be required by applicable legislation of the federal or state governments.

XVI. CONTROVERSY. In the event of a controversy or other dispute, either the Employer Trustees or the Union Trustees shall refer such controversy or dispute to the Council of Industrial Relations for the Electrical Contracting Industry, Washington D.C., which is hereinafter designated by the Trustees as the umpire in the event of controversy or dispute.

XVII. DEADLOCK. In the event of a deadlock, the Council of Industrial Relations for the Electrical Contracting Industry, Washington D.C. is designated as the impartial umpire or failing in this, then either parties hereto may petition the United States

District Court, serving this jurisdiction, for the appointment of such an impartial Trustee, all as made and provided in Section 302(c) of the "Labor-Management Relations Act of 1947."

XVIII. INVESTMENTS. The Trustee shall have the power to invest and re-invest such funds as they do not require for current expenditures in such securities as are legal for the investment of trust funds under the laws of the State of North Dakota.

XIX. MEETINGS OF TRUSTEES. Meetings of the Trustees shall be held from time to time as required, but not less than semiannually.

XX. REPORTS FROM EMPLOYERS. The Trustees shall have the power to require any employer signatory hereto or covered by the Collective Bargaining Agreement to furnish, and an employer when so required shall furnish to the Trustees, such information and reports as they may require in the performance of their duties under this Agreement and Declaration of Trust. The Trustees shall have the right at all reasonable times to enter the premises of the employers and signatory employers to examine and copy such of the books, records, papers and reports of the employers as may be necessary to permit the Trustees to determine whether the employer and signatory employers are making full payments to the Trustees of the amount required.

XXI. SPENDTHRIFT PROVISIONS. No benefit or money payable from this Trust Fund shall be subject to any manner of anticipation, alienation, sale, transfer, assignment, pledge, encumbrance or

charge, and any attempt to so anticipate, alienate, sell, transfer, assign, pledge, encumber, or charge, on the part of any person claiming any benefits under this Trust shall be void. The monies to be paid into this Fund shall not constitute or be deemed wages due to the individual employee, nor shall the monies in any manner be liable for, or subject to, the debts, contracts, liabilities or torts of the parties entitled to such money, that is, the beneficiaries under the Trust under the terms of this Agreement.

XXII. NO BENEFIT TO EMPLOYER OR UNION. In no event shall the Employers covered by this Agreement, or the Union or any members of the Union receive any benefit or refunds for monies paid under this Trust Agreement. This provision shall not, however, prevent the Trustees from employing the Dakotas Chapter, National Electrical Contractors Association to furnish administrative, secretarial and related services and to pay for such services as hereinabove provided.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Employer and the Union have caused this instrument to be signed by their duly authorized officers and agents the date and year first above written, authority of the authorized officers and agents having been heretofore duly given by members of such organizations.
