RESTATED BYLAWS OF PIEDMONT HEALTHCARE FOUNDATION, INC.

ARTICLE I PREFACE

- Section 1. Sole Member. The sole member of Piedmont Healthcare Foundation, Inc. (PHCF) (the "Corporation") is Piedmont Healthcare, Inc. ("PHC"), a Georgia nonprofit corporation.
- Section 2. Bylaws Modification. In accordance with Article XI of these Bylaws, restatement or amendment of these Bylaws must be approved by majority vote of the Board of Directors of PHC (the "PHC Board").
- Section 3 Supplements and Conflicts. These Bylaws are supplemented by PHC Bylaws, and may be supplemented by and PHCF policies or governance protocols. If there is a conflict between these Bylaws and said policies and governance protocols, these Bylaws take precedence. If there is a conflict between these Bylaws and the Bylaws of PHC, the latter take precedence.

ARTICLE II CORPORATE NAME

The name of the Corporation is Piedmont Healthcare Foundation, Inc.

ARTICLE III PURPOSE & POWERS

Section 1. <u>Purpose</u>. Realizing that Piedmont Healthcare relies upon the generosity and vision of community-minded citizens, The Piedmont Healthcare Foundation provides the volunteer leadership that assures Piedmont's philanthropic support is generated, stewarded and transformed into valuable gifts meeting the immediate and future healthcare needs of the region.

The Piedmont Healthcare Foundation is organized exclusively for the scientific, charitable, and educational purposes for the benefit of Piedmont Healthcare and its subsidiary organizations (collectively "the entities").

Section 2 <u>Limitations</u>. No part of the property of the Corporation and no part of its net earnings or profits shall ever at any time inure to the benefit of or be distributable to any private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Section 1 of this Article III. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be devoted to attempting to influence legislation by propaganda or otherwise within the meaning of the proscriptive provisions of the Code. The Corporation shall not directly or indirectly participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision in these Bylaws, it is intended that the Corporation will

qualify at all times as an organization exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(a) of the Code by qualification as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Code, that it will qualify at all times as an organization to which deductible contributions may be made pursuant to sections 170, 642, 2055, and 2522 of the Code, and that it will qualify as other than a private foundation pursuant to section 509(a) of the Code; therefore, the Corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(a) and 501(c)(3) of the Code or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Code. Moreover, notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws, to the extent that the following provisions of the Code are applicable, the Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing which would subject the Corporation to tax under section 4941 of the Code, shall not retain any excess business holding which would subject the Corporation to tax under section 4943 of the Code, shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject the Corporation to tax under section 4944 of the Code. shall not make any taxable expenditures which would subject the Corporation to tax under section 4945 of the Code, and shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to subject the Corporation to tax under section 4942 of the Code.

- Section 2. <u>Powers</u>. The Corporation shall have all powers necessary to carry out its purposes, including those now or hereinafter enumerated in the Georgia Nonprofit Corporation Code, or any successor legislation.
- Section 3 Fulfillment of General Purposes. Subject to the provisions of the articles of incorporation and of these bylaws, the PHCF Board shall invest and administer the funds of the Corporation for the exclusive benefit of the entities, invest and manage the investment of the assets of the Corporation both to produce current income and to enhance the value of those assets, and shall distribute periodically income from or the corpus of the assets of the Corporation, as the PHCF Board shall see fit, to or for the benefit of the entities.

ARTICLE IV BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1 Board of Directors. The affairs of the Corporation are governed by a Board of Directors (the "PHCF Board"), predominately composed of and led by community directors.
- Section 2 Obligation and Responsibilities. Subject to PHC Board Bylaws, policies and governance protocols, the PHCF Board directs and oversees the affairs of the Corporation. The obligation of the PHCF Board is to ensure the resources and capacities of PHCF are deployed in a manner that benefits the operations of the entities for scientific, charitable, or educational purposes and the promotion of community benefit and health status. In order to meet this obligation, the PHCF Board is responsible for providing oversight of all fundraising operations for all current entities and future entities and respective auxiliaries that are under the governance of PHC and providing strategic, managerial, operational, and financial oversight of PHCF.
- Section 3 Composition. The PHCF Board shall consist of not fewer than thirty (30) nor more than forty-five (45) directors; the exact number of which shall be as determined by vote or resolution of the directors then in office. The Chairman of the PHC Board will be a director on the PHCF Board ex-officio with vote during his/her tenure. The other members of the PHCF Board shall be appointed by the PHC Board, at the regular quarterly meeting of the PHC Board closest to the end of a term of service of a director or the occurrence of a vacancy on the PHCF Board.

- Section 4. Terms and Limitations. Except as provided in Section 5, the terms of the directors shall be for three (3) years, and, after completing a three (3) year term, such directors may be re-appointed to one additional three (3)-year term. This provision becomes effective when these restated PHCF Bylaws are adopted by the PHC Board (the "Effective Date") with respect to years of service rendered after the Effective Date only. A director appointed to fill the seat of a director who has not completed his or her term shall serve the remaining portion of the term, and if that period is less than two (2) years, such director shall also be eligible to be reappointed to two full consecutive terms. Any officer of the Board whose term as a director expires during such officer's term as an officer shall have his or her term as an officer expires.
- Section 5. <u>Implementation and Staggering of Terms</u>. The incumbent directors in office shall constitute the new PHCF Board with additional members appointed by the PHC Board. The incumbent director may complete the current term with eligibility for an additional term in accordance with Article IV, Section 4 of these Bylaws.
- Section 6. <u>Director Duties</u>. Directors are responsible for assisting in the acquisition and administration of funds and for providing strategic, managerial, operational, and financial oversight for the benefit of the entities.
- Section 7. Compensation. Directors shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for all reasonable, itemized expenses associated with such service.
- Section 8. <u>Vacancies</u>. All vacancies on the Board (whether due to expiration of the term of a director, death, resignation, removal or otherwise) shall be filled by appointment by a majority vote of the PHC Board. Directors appointed to fill vacancies on the Board due to death, removal, or resignation shall hold office for the unexpired portion of the term.
- Section 9. Resignation. Any director may resign at any time by giving notice to the Chair of the PHCF Board. Such resignation, which may or may not be made contingent on formal acceptance, shall take effect on the date of receipt or, if acceptable to the PHCF Board, at any later time specified therein.
- Section 10 Removal. A director may be removed during his/her term for any reason by a majority vote of the PHC Board.
- Section 11. Fiscal Agent. The PHC Board may appoint any bank or trust company having its principal office in the State of Georgia and having a capital and surplus of not less than \$10,000,000 as fiscal agent of the Corporation and delegate to such bank or trust company the custody and routine management of the corpus of the Corporation's funds, subject to the directions and supervision of the PHC Board. The PHC Board may likewise delegate to such a bank or trust company or to an investment manager or advisor the powers and duties to invest and reinvest the Corporation's funds subject to the direction and supervision of the PHC Board.

ARTICLE V BOARD MEETINGS

Section 1 Regular Meetings. Regular meetings of the PHCF Board shall be called by the Chair at a place, time and date set by him or her.

- Section 2 Special Meetings. Special meetings of the PHCF Board may be called by the Chair or any two (2) directors. Such meetings shall be held at a time and place set by the Chair or the directors calling such meeting.
- Section 3 Notice. Notice of any meeting shall be given at least three (3) and not more than thirty (30) calendar days prior thereto by written notice delivered personally or sent by mail to each director at his/her address as shown on the records of the Corporation. Notices of all meetings of directors shall also be delivered to the Chair of the PHC Board.
- Section 4 <u>Waiver of Notice</u>. Any director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance by a director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.
- Section 5 Quorum of Directors. A quorum of the PHCF Board shall be constituted only if a majority of the directors then in office is present at the meeting.
- Section 6 Manner of Acting. Except as otherwise provided in the Corporation's Charter, these Bylaws or by applicable law, the act of the majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the PHCF Board.
- Section 7 Presumption of Assent. A director who is present at a meeting of the PHCF Board at which action on any matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his/her contrary vote is recorded or his/her dissent is otherwise entered in the minutes of the meeting. Such right to dissent shall not apply to a director who voted in favor of such action.
- Section 8. <u>Informal Action by Directors</u>. Action may be taken by the Board without a meeting, if delivery of the written consent to the action in question is made to all directors, and such written consent is signed by at least two-thirds (2/3) of all the directors then in office and filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the PHCF Board.
- Section 9 <u>Electronic Conference</u>. Directors may participate in any PHCF Board or committee meeting by means of telephone/computer conference or similar communications equipment if all persons participating in the meeting can hear and communicate effectively with each other. Such participation in a meeting shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.
- Section 10. Conflicts and Confidentiality. Conflict-of-interests and confidentiality requirements and standards are specified by the PHC Board. A voting member of the Board who receives compensation from PHCF or other PHC entity is precluded from voting on matters pertaining to that member's compensation.
- Section 11 Board Policies and Decisions. The Board exercises influence over, and in, PHCF on behalf of the sole corporate member (PHC) and community stakeholders by formulating policies and making decisions regarding matters requiring its attention. PHCF Board policies, resolutions and decisions must be filed, immediately after adoption, with the Secretary of the PHC Board. Except as otherwise provided herein, such policies, resolutions and decisions of the PHCF Board are not subject to prior approval/ratification of the PHC Board, but should the need arise, may be rescinded by the PHC Board through a majority vote of its directors.

ARTICLE VI BOARD COMMITTEES

The PHCF Board, by a majority vote of directors, may designate from among its members one or more committees, including an Executive Committee which shall have the full power and authority of the PHCF Board except as limited in these Bylaws. Each committee shall consist of at least four (4) directors. No committee shall have authority with respect to any of the following matters: (a) the dissolution, merger, consolidation of the Corporation; (b) the amendment of the Charter of the Corporation; (c) the sale, lease, or exchange of all or substantially all of the property of the Corporation; (d) amendment or repeal of these Bylaws; or (e) the amendment or repeal of any resolution of the PHCF Board which, by its terms, cannot be amended or repealed except by the action of the full PHCF Board or by the PHC Board.

ARTICLE VII OFFICERS OF THE BOARD

- Section 1. Officers. The officers of the Board shall be a Chair, a Vice Chair, and Immediate Past Chair. No director shall hold more than one (1) office during any one (1) year.
- Section 2 <u>Election</u>. All officers shall be elected by the PHCF Board at its annual meeting, subject to approval of the PHC Board. Each elected officer shall assume office at the next regular meeting and shall serve until a successor is elected and approved by the PHC Board.
- Section 3. Terms. All officers other than the Chair shall serve terms of one (1) year with no limitation on the number of terms that can be served. The Chair shall serve a term of two (2) years and shall be eligible for reappointment as Chair for two additional two (2) year terms. Any officer of the Board whose term as a director expires during such officer's term as an officer shall have his or her term as a director extended such that it shall expire at the same time such officer's then current term as an officer expires.
- Section 4. Removal. Any officer may be removed (with or without cause at any time) by a majority vote of the PHC Board.
- Section 5. Resignation. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the PHF Board Chair or the Secretary. Such resignation shall take effect on the date of receipt or at any later time specified therein.
- Section 6 <u>Duties</u>. Responsibilities, roles and expectations of officers may be specified in governance protocols.
- Section 7 Inability to Act. In case of the absence or inability to act of any officer, the PHCF Board, with approval of the PHC Board, may delegate the powers and duties of an officer to another director.
- Section 8 Other Officers and Agents. The PHCF Board may authorize the appointment of other officers and agents as it shall deem necessary, who shall hold offices for such terms, shall exercise such powers, and shall perform such duties as may be authorized by the PHCF Board. The PHCF Board may also require reasonable bonds of any of the officers or employees of

PHCF for the faithful performance of their duties.

ARTICLE VIII OFFICERS OF THE CORPORATION

- Section 1. Officers. The officers of the Corporation shall be a Chief Executive Officer ("CEO"), a Vice President and Chief Development Officer ("CDO"), secretary, and a treasurer, and such other officers as the CEO may appoint, subject to the approval of the PHCF Board.
- Section 2 <u>CEO</u>. The CEO of the Corporation shall be the CEO of PHC. The CEO shall be an ex officio member of the PHCF Board with voting privileges.
- Section 3. Vice-President, Philanthropy shall serve as the Executive Director, ex-officio. The Executive Director shall be appointed by, and serve at the pleasure of, the PHC CEO on the basis of advice provided by the PHCF Board.
- Section 4. Secretary. The Secretary of the Corporation shall be the Secretary of PHC.
- Section 5 Treasurer. The Treasurer of the Corporation shall be the Executive Vice President/ Chief Financial Officer of PHC.
- Section 6 Removal. Any officer may be removed (with or without cause at any time) by a majority vote of the PHC Board.
- Section 7 Other Officers and Agents. The PHCF Board may approve the appointment of other corporate officers and agents by the CEO as it shall deem necessary, who shall hold offices for such terms, shall exercise such powers, and shall perform such duties as may be authorized by the PHCF Board. The PHCF Board may also require reasonable bonds of any of the officers or employees of the Corporation for the faithful performance of their duties.

ARTICLE IX

LEGAL COMPLIANCE & INDEMNIFICATION

- Section 1. <u>Due Care</u>. The PHCF Board shall take all reasonable and prudent steps to conform with all applicable Federal, State and local laws and regulations in addition to these Bylaws and the Bylaws of PHC.
- Section 2 Director/Officer Indemnification and Insurance.
 - (a) Actions Against Directors. The Corporation shall indemnify to the fullest extent permitted by the Georgia Nonprofit Corporation Code, any individual, made a party to a proceeding (as defined in O.C.G.A.§ 14-3-850) because he or she is or was a director (as defined in O.C.G.A. §14-3-850), against liability (as defined in O.C.G.A. § 14-3-850) incurred in the proceeding, if the director acted in a manner the director believed in good faith to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the Corporation and, in the case of any criminal proceeding, the director had no reasonable cause to believe such director's conduct was unlawful.
 - (b) Advances for Expenses of Directors. The Corporation shall pay for or reimburse

the reasonable expenses incurred by a director who is a party to a proceeding if:

- (i) The director furnishes the Corporation a written affirmation of the director's good faith belief that the director has met the standard of conduct set forth in Section 2(a) above; and
- (ii) The director furnishes the Corporation a written undertaking, executed personally or on the Director's behalf, to repay any advance if it is ultimately determined that the Director is not entitled to indemnification.

The written undertaking required by paragraph (b) above must be an unlimited general obligation of the director but need not be secured and will be accepted without reference to financial ability to make repayment.

- (c) Incorporation by Reference. Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 14-3-858(c), there is incorporated by reference into these Bylaws the provisions of the part of the Georgia Nonprofit Corporation Code beginning at § 14-3-850. In the event of an amendment to this part of the Georgia Nonprofit Corporation Code relating to indemnification, these Bylaws shall incorporate the amendment, unless doing so would materially affect the interests of directors and officers in an adverse way, in which case the original intent of these Bylaws shall be preserved to the extent permitted by law.
- (d) Officers, Employees and Agents. The Corporation shall indemnify each officer, employee or agent who is not a director to the extent such officer, employee or agent is entitled to mandatory indemnification under O.C.G.A. § 14-3-852 or is the subject of court-ordered indemnification under O.C.G.A. § 14-3-854. The Corporation may, in the discretion of the PHCF Board, also indemnify and advance expenses to an officer, employee or agent who is not a director to the extent specified in any general or specific action of the PHCF Board or in any contract, subject in each case to the public policy limitation contained in O.C.G.A. § 14-3-856(2).
- (e) <u>Insurance</u>. The Corporation shall purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of an individual who is or was a director or officer of the Corporation or who, while a director or officer of PHC, is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee or agent of another foreign or domestic business or nonprofit corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan, or other enterprise against liability asserted against or incurred by the individual in that capacity or arising from the individual's status as a director or officer, whether or not the Corporation would have power to indemnify the individual against the same liability under applicable law.

ARTICLE X SEAL

The seal of the Corporation shall be in such form as the Board may determine. In the event it is inconvenient to use such a seal at any time, the words "Corporate Seal" or the word "Seal" in parentheses or scroll accompanying the signature of an officer signing for and on behalf of the Corporation shall be the seal of the corporation. The seal shall be in the custody of the Secretary

and affixed by him or her on such papers as may be directed by law, by these bylaws, or by the PHCF Board.

ARTICLE XI

ADOPTION AND AMENDMENT

- 1. These Bylaws were adopted on the 28th day of June, 2011 by the affirmative vote of a majority of the PHC Board. They shall replace any previous Bylaws.
- 2. The Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws of the Corporation may be altered, amended or repealed at any meeting of the PHCF Board, with ratification by the PHC Board, or at any meeting of the PHC Board, by an affirmative vote of a majority of all directors of the PHC Board. The Bylaws at no time shall contain any provision inconsistent with law or with the Articles of Incorporation.
