Notwithstanding that the public support percentage indicated at Line 14 is less than 33 ⅓ percent, Fort Worth Art Association should qualify as a publicly supported organization under the facts-and-circumstances test prescribed under Section 1.170A-9(e)(3) of the Regulations.

- ◆ The total amount of governmental and public support normally received by Fort Worth Art Association is well in excess of 10 percent of its total support normally received. Fort Worth Art Association's total support includes additional support from The Burnett Foundation, a private foundation. This support is not counted in its entirety in the numerator of the public support calculation, which explains why the organization does not meet the 33 ⅓ percent public support test. This support continues to fund operating deficits of the Fort Worth Art Association precipitated by the opening of the new facility for the Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth in 2002.

For fiscal years ended June 30, 2003, June 30, 2004, and June 30, 2005, the public support of Fort Worth Art Association was in excess of 33 ⅓ percent – 35.83, 38.47 and 35.45, respectively. For fiscal years ended June 30, 2006, June 30, 2007, June 30, 2008, June 30, 2009, June 30, 2010, and June 30, 2011, the public support percentage fell below 33 ⅓ percent – 29.56, 32.05, 27.61, 28.59, 29.41, and 25.82 respectively – but remained well above 10 percent.

- ◆ Fort Worth Art Association has a continuous and bona fide program for solicitation of funds and sponsorships. Fort Worth Art Association has a sophisticated membership program with varying levels of membership and an employed membership department.
- ◆ Fort Worth Art Association operates the Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth which is open to the general public. The Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth maintains one of the foremost collections of postwar art in the central United States, consisting of more than 2,600 significant works of modern and contemporary international art. The Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth maintains 53,000 square feet of gallery space.
- ◆ Thousands of persons visit the Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth annually. Further, the Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth has educational programs that appeal to adults, youth, children, and educators.
- ◆ The composition of Fort Worth Art Association's Board of Directors is representative of broad public interests. Such persons are diverse in age, areas of expertise, profession, race, etc.
