Senior Solutions & JFS at Home assists seniors and disabled or chronically ill adults to live as independently as possible, for as long as possible without compromising their safety or health. JFS at Home services are designed for people seeking a completely customized care program, provided by qualified, bonded and insured staff members, and available 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. In fiscal year 2011, Senior Solutions provided 1,694 clients with direct services and affected 4,235 lives.
