If the chair of the board believes board action is appropriate, the interested person must leave the board meeting where the financial or other interest is discussed and voted upon, unless requested to stay either to respond to questions or provide information to the Board on the matter under discussion. The remaining board members decide if a conflict of interest exists and the appropriate course of action. Officers, key employees, faculty, and staff are covered by the University conflict of interest policy individuals are informed of this policy at the time of hire. The policy is contained in the Human Resources. Policy Manual and is available to faculty and staff on the university's website. Upon identification of a potential conflict of interest, the matter is reviewed and evaluated by university officials and a determination is made regarding an appropriate action. Finally, the Office of Finance and Business. Affairs, through the Office of the Controller, reviews carefully all proposed business transactions, expenditures, and requests for reimbursements to determine compliance with university policies, including those relating to conflict of interest.

Within the institution, appropriate comparability data is also obtained and reviewed for all other officers, key employees and any other highly compensated employees.
