Saint George's School Investment Policy

(Approved by the Board on November 23, 1998) (Amended by the Board on May 14, 2003) (Amended by the Board on June 5, 2006) (Amended by the Board on March 7, 2011)

I. INVESTMENT POLICY PURPOSE

The purpose of this Investment Policy ("Policy") is to provide the Saint George's School ("School") Investment Committee with investment objectives and operating guidelines for the School's Endowment Fund and other special funds.

II. INVESTMENT COMMITTEE CHARTER

From Bylaws amended September 1995 (Article VI, Section 7) - "The Investment Committee shall be responsible for the investment of the endowment and other special funds of the School and shall have the authority to select, terminate, direct, and monitor investment managers in the management of securities and other property of the School in accordance with the investment policy adopted by the Board. This committee shall report to the Board no less often than quarterly as to the status of the School's investments including market values, income and consistency with the Board's investment policy, and shall report to the Board whenever requested by the President."

III. INVESTMENT POLICY ADMINISTRATION

- A. The Investment Committee ("Committee").
 - 1. Primary responsibility for investing the assets of the School's Endowment Fund and other special funds ("Funds") resides with the Committee.
 - 2. The Committee will meet regularly and at least once per calendar quarter to:
 - Monitor and review the performance of custodians and investment advisors compared to objective and appropriate indices and other standards established by the Committee or set by the Board of Trustees ("Board");
 - Verify that investment activities are in conformity with this Policy and each Fund's purposes and restrictions.
 - 3. As needed and at least annually the Committee Chair will provide the Board with a Funds Status Report and an update on investment performance and investment manager performance.
 - 4. Minutes of Committee meetings will be prepared and approved by the Committee and distributed to the Board.
- B. Investment advisors.
 - 1. With prior Board approval, the Committee may select and retain investment advisors to manage all or part of the investments for Funds.
 - 2. All investments managed by investment advisors will be subject to this Policy.

- C. Investment custodians.
 - With prior Board approval, the Committee may select and retain at least one custodian who will conduct investment transactions on behalf of the School.
 - 2. Each Fund's investments will be segregated or separately identified to facilitate reporting and monitoring.

IV. ASSET CATEGORIES AND STRATEGIES

- A. The primary factor influencing the risk and performance of the School's Funds is determined by the allocation of assets among the various categories of approved securities. The allocation of assets will be guided by the concept of prudent risk-taking in full compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.
- B. Approved Asset Categories and Investment Strategies.
 - 1. Domestic Equity

Common and preferred stocks of companies domiciled in the United States and/or registered with recognized securities exchanges in the U.S., and mutual funds of such stocks registered with recognized securities exchanges in the U.S.

Investment Strategies:

- Large-Cap (Growth, Blended and Value)
- Mid-Cap (Growth, Blended and Value)
- Small-Cap (Growth. Blended and Value)
- 2. International Equity.

Common and preferred stocks of companies domiciled outside the U.S. in developed markets and registered with recognized securities exchanges outside the U.S., and mutual funds of such stocks registered with recognized securities exchanges in the U.S.

Investment Strategies:

- Large-Cap (Growth, Blended and Value)
- Mid-Cap (Growth, Blended and Value)
- Small-Cap (Growth, Blended and Value)
- Emerging market equities Funds that invest in companies whose principal business activities are located in emerging markets countries.
- 3. Alternative Equity.

Securities are intended to provide counter-cyclical returns that reduce the overall volatility and risk profiles of their respective investment categories. These investments should exhibit low to negative correlations to more traditional equity investments and may reduce Fund returns in rising markets but should mitigate Fund declines in falling markets. Investment Strategies:

 Real Estate - Real estate investment trusts (REITs) and mutual fund investments that may include companies that are principally engaged in the U.S. real estate industry, companies whose products or services are related to that industry, suppliers to the real estate industry and property managers.

- Commodity funds Mutual funds that may include diversified commodities investments.
- Long/short or equity market neutral strategies Mutual funds that allow the manager to purchase those U.S. equity securities that it deems undervalued (long positions) and sell those securities that it deems overvalued, but that it does not currently own (short sell positions), or employ an options strategy to accomplish the same objective.

4. Domestic Fixed Income.

Fixed income securities issued with the full faith and credit of the U.S. Government, securities issued by domestic corporations (see definition above), and mutual funds of either securities registered with recognized securities exchanges in the U.S. Securities with ratings below investment grade are limited to 5% of total Fund value.

Investment Strategies:

- U.S. Treasury and U.S. Government agency securities
- U.S. Tips
- GNMA securities
- Corporate bonds of domestic corporations

5. International Fixed Income.

Fixed income securities issued with the full faith and credit of foreign governments, securities issued by foreign corporations (see definition above), and mutual funds of either securities registered with recognized securities exchanges in the U.S. All securities will have credit ratings by recognized rating agencies of investment grade or better. Foreign currency exposure may be hedged or unhedged.

Investment Strategies:

- Sovereign debt
- Quasi-Sovereign debt
- Emerging Markets debt
- Corporate Debt
- 6. Cash and Equivalents.
 - Insured bank accounts and certificates of deposit
 - Money market funds

Investment Strategy:

The balances of cash and zero-yield equivalents will be minimized, consistent with the cash flow needs of the School as determined by the School Finance Committee (subject to this Policy), by prudent investment management, and by necessary investment transaction activity.

C. Approved Asset Allocations.

Regularly and at least annually the Committee will review the asset allocation and risk/return profiles of the various Funds and approve a risk management table for each Fund that specifies the asset categories and investment strategies approved for each Fund. These tables will also specify the minimum, target and maximum percentage asset allocations for each Fund.

D. All investments approved by the Committee must have a readily ascertainable market value and must be readily marketable.

V. PERFORMANCE MONITORING

- A. Regularly and at least quarterly the Committee will review the performance (net of fees) of each Fund's investments according to the following criteria:
 - 1. A composite benchmark for each Fund consisting of, but not limited to, the following unmanaged market indexes dynamically weighted proportionately to the asset allocations in each Fund:
 - Domestic Equities: Russell 3000
 - International Equities: MSCI EAFE
 - Fixed Income: Barclay's Capital 1-5 year Government/Corporate Index
 - Volatility Protection: 30% S&P 500/70% T-bills
 - 2. In keeping with each Fund's performance objectives, the Committee will evaluate investment performance over a suitable long-term investment horizon, generally full market cycles of at least 3-5 years.
- B. Regularly and at least annually the Committee will review the performance of invest advisors and custodians according to the following standards:
 - 1. The quality of professional activities executed on behalf of the School.
 - 2. A demonstrated understanding of the School's investment needs.
 - 3. The quality of investment advice offered and guidance provided.
 - 4. Overall investment performance.

VI. ENDOWMENT FUND

A. Endowment Fund purpose.

The School's Endowment Fund is a perpetual endowment fund. The purpose of the Endowment Fund is to provide a reliable and stable annual source of supplemental support for the School's operating budget. Annual support will be subject to the Endowment Fund Spending Policy below. Endowment Fund

support is unrestricted as to use in the operating budget except for restrictions which are imposed by gifts accepted into the Fund.

- B. Endowment Fund investment objectives are:
 - 1. to provide a reliable and stable annual source of supplemental support for the School's operating budget;
 - 2. to protect Fund purchasing power by controlling (in priority order) principal risk and volatility, real growth of principal, total return, and income;
 - 3. to achieve consistent, inflation-adjusted growth of principal.
- C. Endowment Fund investment guidelines. Except for particular assets accepted to be held pursuant to the donor's specific instructions, and except for other investments the Board of Directors may approve. Endowment Fund assets will be invested according to the Approved Asset Allocations above.
- D. Endowment Fund Spending Policy.
 - 1. A "total payout amount" from the Endowment Fund will be determined annually by the School Finance Committee not to exceed five and one-half percent (5.5%) of the average market value of the Endowment Fund over the preceding thirteen (13) calendar quarters. Appropriate adjustments will be made to the average market value for contributions made to and withdrawals from the Endowment Fund during each such quarter.
 - 2. From the total payout amount, there will be deducted all applicable costs of holding and administering Endowment Fund investments including, without limitation to, costs of management, custodians, investment advisors, and legal and accounting costs applicable to the Endowment Fund.
 - 3. Distributions from the Endowment Fund will be made at least annually and no more often than quarterly at the discretion of the School Finance Committee.
 - 4. The Endowment Fund Spending Policy may be waived for individual years by a majority vote of the Board.

VII. SPECIAL FUNDS

- A. Special Funds.
 - 1. PPRRSM Fund;
 - 2. Capital Campaign Funds;
 - 3. Other special funds;
 - 4. The School's Operating Fund is not a special fund for the purposes of this Policy.
- B. Special Funds investment objectives are:
 - 1. to provide a reliable and stable source of supplemental support for specified items in the School's operating budget;

- 2. to protect each Fund's purchasing power by controlling principal risk and volatility, real growth of principal, total return, and income in a priority consistent with the purposes and restrictions of each Fund, such purposes and restrictions to be determined by the Board and the School Finance Committee.
- C. Special Funds investment guidelines.
 To achieve each Special Fund's liquidity needs and growth objectives, and consistent with each Special Fund's purpose and restrictions. Special Funds assets will be invested according to the Approved Asset Allocations above.
- D. Special Funds Spending Policy.
 - 1. A "total payout amount" distribution from each Special Fund will be determined annually by the School Finance Committee consistent with the purposes and restrictions of each Fund.
 - 2. From the total payout amount, there will be deducted all applicable costs of holding and administering each Special Fund's investments including, without limitation to, costs of management, custodians, investment advisors, and legal and accounting costs applicable to each Fund.

REVISED BY-LAWS OF SAINT GEORGE'S SCHOOL

Article II General

- Section 1. The name of this corporation shall be "Saint George's School."
- Section 2. This corporation shall have its domicile and principal place of business at 2929 West Waikiki Road, Spokane, WA 99208-9298.
- Section 3. The Official Seal of Saint George's School shall be in the form of a shield emblazoned with the Cross of Saint George, the Patron Saint of the School (red gules); and in the field, sun in its splendor "Or" (gold) reminiscent of the early inhabitants of this region, the Spokane Indians, known as "Children of the Sun"; the field of the shield will be "Azure" (blue). Atop the shield is The Crest, the Lamp of Learning "Argent" (silver); the Supporters, deer that frequent the area around Saint George's (gold); the motto at the base, Caritas, Deus, Veritas, charity God truth.
- Section 4. The members of the corporation shall be the members of the Board of Trustees.
- Section 5. The corporation specifically is forbidden from operating at any time in a discriminatory manner. Saint George's School does not discriminate against applicants for employment, employees, applicants for admission, or students on the basis of race, color, and national or ethnic origin.

Article II Board of Trustees

Section 1. Generally:

The government and direction of the business of Saint George's School shall be vested in the Board of Trustees. The Board shall consist of not less than nine nor more than twenty-five regular members. In addition to these regular members, the Head of School and General Counsel for the School shall be ex-officio (non-voting) members of the Board. The Board of Trustees shall be self-perpetuating, and shall have the power in case of death, resignation, or disability of any member of the Board, to fill any vacancy caused thereby. A Trustee shall hold office for the term for which the Trustee shall be elected.

Section 2. Terms of Trustees:

Trustees shall be elected by the Board for terms of three years. Trustees may serve three successive terms based on a deliberative term renewal process. Trustees' terms of office shall be arranged so that terms of office for approximately one-third of the Trustees shall expire each year. Trustees' terms begin on the first day of July and end on the thirtieth

ı

day of June. A person may be re-elected to the Board after being off the Board for one year.

Section 3. Nominations and Election of Trustees:

It shall be the duty of the Governance Committee to nominate to the Board of Trustees the name or names of persons whom they deem qualified for election as Trustees, but nothing in this article shall deprive any Trustee the right to make nominations from the floor at any meeting of the Board when nominations are presented by the Governance Committee. At this meeting, the Board shall vote to accept or reject those names presented in nomination. By their vote, the Board shall authorize the Governance Committee to offer a Board position to the affirmed candidates.

Where affirmed candidates are asked and agree to serve, they shall commence serving on the Board as of the first day of July, excepting those filling un-expired terms, in which event, they shall commence serving immediately. Candidates agreeing to serve shall be acknowledged as such at the Board's Annual Meeting unless filling an un-expired term. New trustees filling an un-expired term shall be acknowledged at the next meeting of the full Board.

Section 4. Honorary Trustee:

The Honorary Trustees shall serve in an advisory capacity and be entitled to attend all regular meetings of the Board. They shall have no vote, nor be included in a quorum.

Section 5. Advisory Members:

The presidents, chairs, or co-chairs of the Saint George's School Parents Association, Alumni Association, and Advisory Council shall serve in an advisory capacity to the Board and are welcome to attend all regular meetings of the Board. They shall have no vote, nor be included in a quorum.

Section 6. Vacancies:

Vacancies which shall occur on the Board of Trustees, or its officers, shall be filled as soon as practicable thereafter at a regular meeting of the Board, or at a special meeting duly called for that purpose. Trustees elected to fill vacancies shall begin serving immediately and shall complete the term of office held by the vacating Trustee. Said Trustee shall be considered to have held office for one full term if the term being filled consists of one half or more of a full three (3) year term.

Section 7. Head of School:

The Board of Trustees shall be responsible for the selection, supervision, and termination of the Head of School.

Section 8. Removal of Trustees:

Any member of the Board of Trustees may be removed from the Board, with or without cause, by a 2/3 (two-thirds) majority of all voting Board members present, at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Trustees.

Article III Officers of the Board

- Section 1. The officers of the Board of Trustees shall consist of a President of the Board, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer and such other officers as the Board may from time to time deem appropriate.
- Section 2. All such officers shall be nominated by the Governance Committee or from the floor at the regular meeting immediately preceding the Annual Meeting. The officers of the Board of Trustees shall be elected by a majority of those present at the Annual Meeting, held in either May or June. Each officer shall hold office for a period of one year, commencing immediately following their election. After three successive terms, no officer may be re-elected to the same office for a fourth term except by vote of two-thirds of the Board of Trustees. A vacancy may be filled at any regular or special meeting of the Board.

Article IV Duties of Officers

- Section 1. The President shall call all meetings of the Board and shall preside at all meetings, or in the President's absence, the Vice-President, or in the absence of both, a Chairperson Pro Tempore shall be elected. The President shall have charge of the operation of the corporation's affairs, subject to the direction of the Board of Trustees, and shall be an exofficio member of all committees.
- Section 2. The Secretary shall be responsible for having the minutes recorded of all meetings of the Board, shall attest all documents of the Board, and shall be responsible for the custodianship of the seal and of the record books, papers, and documents of the corporation. Copies of all minutes shall be mailed to each Board member in a timely manner prior to the following Board meeting.
- Section 3. The Treasurer shall chair the Finance Committee, shall keep a record of all funds of the School and shall make a report of such funds to the Board at each meeting. When duly authorized by resolution of the Board of Trustees, the President, Vice-President, or Treasurer may borrow money for the purpose of meeting school expenses, and give a note or notes therefore and grant such security interests as may be necessary to secure such note or notes.

Article V Committees of the Board

Section 1. Committees:

There shall be the following Standing Committees of the Board of Trustees:

Development

Governance

Executive

Finance

Investment

Section 2. Task Force:

Task Force Committees shall be considered as an Ad-hoc committee of the Board. They are subject to comply with all requirements for committees set forth in these by-laws.

Section 3. Chairs of Committees:

The Chairs of all Committees shall be appointed by the President in consultation with the Executive committee and confirmed by the Board of Trustees. Their terms of office shall commence on the first day of July and continue until the thirtieth of June or until their successors are appointed. The Chairs shall be current Trustees.

Section 4. Committee Membership:

Members of all Committees shall be appointed by the President in consultation with the Committee Chair and confirmed by the Board of Trustees. Each trustee shall be appointed to at least one Standing Committee or Task Force. The Board of Trustees may determine the number of Trustees who shall constitute each committee. Non-trustees may serve on committees but no committee shall have less than two trustees. A majority of the members of each Standing Committee shall constitute a quorum with each committee chair and member entitled to vote.

The Executive Committee shall be comprised of the following members: the President of the Board of Trustees, the Vice-President, the Secretary, the Treasurer, and such additional trustees to be elected by the Board of Trustees. In addition, the General Counsel of the School shall serve as a non-voting member.

The Governance committee shall be limited to present or former trustees and shall consist of at least five present or former trustees. The majority shall be present trustees.

Section 5. Reporting:

All Committees shall report periodically to the Board. All Committees shall meet at the call of their respective chairperson, or at the request of any two members, and should meet regularly during the school year.

Section 6. Ad-hoc Committees:

Ad-hoc Committees may be appointed by the Executive Committee as needed. Each such Committee shall have at least two trustees.

Article VI Duties of the Committees of the Board

Section 1. Executive Committee:

The Executive committee shall have and exercise all the powers of the Board in the intervals between the meetings of the Board whenever the Committee shall consider that action by it necessary to promote the welfare, interest, or efficiency of the School, except only as limited by the statutes of the State of Washington, by the Articles of Incorporation of the School or by these By-Laws. The Executive Committee shall keep minutes of its meetings and shall report on its meetings at the following Board meeting. The Executive Committee of the Board will complete an annual evaluation of the performance of the Head of School. The culmination of this process will be a written evaluation presented to the Head of School in June. The Head of School will be evaluated, from the concluding school year, on the performance of duties as outlined in Article IX, Duties of the Head of School, and on the success in attaining published annual goals. The President of the Board shall submit, in writing, a summary report regarding the Head of School's evaluation to all voting members of the Board, in executive session, as soon as possible after meeting with the Head of School.

Section 2. Governance Committee:

In addition to the responsibilities set forth in Article II, Section 3, and Article III, Section 2, the Governance Committee shall also nominate to the Board the names of qualified candidates for any vacancy or expected vacancy in the Advisory Council as they occur. Candidates may be elected by the Board at the same meeting of the candidate's nominations. The Governance Committee shall nominate a chairperson and co-chairperson of the Advisory Council, which shall be elected by the Board of Trustees at the Board's Annual Meeting.

The Governance Committee shall conduct the orientation for new trustees and oversee the general development and continuing evaluation of the Board.

Section 3. Finance Committee:

The Finance Committee shall have such general supervision of the financial affairs of the School as will enable it to advise and to make recommendations to the Board on budget and financial matters including the level of tuition and fees, the collection of monies owing to the School, the request by parents for releases from contracts, the auditing and payment of claims against the School, and the keeping and auditing of the accounts of the School, and the keeping and auditing of the accounts of the School. For these purposes, the Finance Committee and/or Finance Chairperson shall periodically examine all monies, deposits, and evidences of debt belonging to the school.

The Finance Committee shall cause an annual audit to be made by a Certified Public Accountant of the books and accounts of the School including funds governed by the Investment Committee. The committee may, at its discretion, require a review to be substituted for that audit.

The Finance Committee shall receive, no later than March of each year, advance copies of the Head of School's budget forecast and, no later than October of each year, the Head

of School's final budget and shall make recommendations to the Board to accept, reject, or modify these statements when they are presented to the Board for adoption.

The Finance Committee shall have the right and duty to establish and regulate one or more bank accounts for the school.

Section 4. Investment Committee:

The Investment Committee shall be responsible for the investment of the endowment and other special funds of the School and shall have authority to select, buy, sell and hold securities and other property of the School in accordance with the investment policy adopted by the Board. This committee shall report to the Board no less often than quarterly as to the status of the School's investments including market values, income and consistency with the Board's investment policy, and shall report to the Board whenever requested by the President.

Section 5. Development Committee:

The Development Committee shall foster a culture of philanthropy at the School, advise the Development Office staff in planning and implementing fundraising efforts to carry out the mission of the school, and educate the school community about Independent School fundraising.

Article VII Financial Administration

- Section 1. The fiscal year of the School shall begin on July 1 each year.
- Section 2. When duly authorized by the Board of Trustees, the President and Secretary shall execute and acknowledge conveyances of real property owned by the School.
- Section 3. No Trustee shall at any time have any right, title, or interest in or to any of the property of the School.
- Section 4. Inasmuch as the Trustees, as individuals, may have large and diversified business interests, no contract or other transaction between the School and any corporation, firm, or individual shall be affected by the fact that Trustees of the School are directors or officers of such corporation, or are members of such firms or are interested as individuals therein, if at the meeting of the Board or Committees at which the contract or transaction was authorized there was present a quorum of Trustees or committee members not so interested and the contract or transaction was approved or ratified by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Trustees or committee members not so interested.
- Section 5. All Trustees, Honorary Trustees, the Head of School and all members of a committee of the Board (or legal representative of any such person) shall be indemnified by the School against the reasonable costs, expenses and attorney fees paid or incurred in connection with any action, suit or proceeding to which any such person may be made a party by reason of his or her being or having been such a Trustee, Honorary Trustee, Head of School, or committee member; provided (1) that action, suit, or proceeding shall be

prosecuted to final determination and it shall not be finally adjudged that he or she has been derelict in performance of his or her duties; or (2) said action, suit or proceeding shall be settled or otherwise terminated without a final determination on the merits and it shall be determined by the Board of Trustees that said person has not in any substantial way been derelict in the performance of his or her duties as alleged in such action, suit or proceeding. Expenses incurred in defending any such action, suit or proceeding may be paid by the School in advance of the final disposition thereof upon receipt of the undertaking by the Trustee, Honorary Trustee, Head of School, or committee member to repay such amount unless it shall ultimately be determined that he or she is entitled to be indemnified by the School as authorized herein. The privilege or power conferred herein shall be in addition to (and not in restriction or limitation of) any other privilege or power which a corporation of the State of Washington may have with respect to the indemnification or reimbursement of Directors, officers or employees, and shall continue as to a person who has been a Trustee, Honorary Trustee, Head of School, or committee member and shall insure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such a person.

Article VIII Meetings

Section 1. Regular Meetings:

Regular meeting of the Board of Trustees should be held monthly throughout the school year, and the regular meeting held in either May or June shall be designated as the Annual Meeting of the Board of Trustees. The Board may allow non-trustees to attend regular meetings as observers.

Section 2. Special Meetings:

Special meetings and executive sessions (meetings of only regular voting members) of the Board may be called at any time by the President and shall be called by the President whenever requested in writing by three Trustees who shall specify in their request the business for which they desire the meeting called.

Section 3. Notice:

Notice of the time and place of every meeting shall be sent to each Trustee at his or her usual address not less than five nor more than ten days before such meeting. In case of a special meeting, such notice shall specify the business for which the meeting is called. Written notice of a special meeting may be waived by the Executive Committee.

Section 4. Voting:

At any regular or special meeting of the Board, a majority of the Trustees shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The vote of the majority of Trustees present at any meeting shall prevail. Trustees are not entitled to vote through proxy.

Section 5. Attendance:

Regular attendance is expected to all trustees for Board meetings and Board committee meetings. Trustees shall notify the Board President or Head of School prior to missing a

Board meeting, and the committee chair if missing a committee meeting. In principle, we value the personal interaction that takes place with the physical presence of trustees at Board meetings. However, when necessary, we do allow trustees to participate in conversations and vote remotely.

Article IX Duties of the Head of School

- Section 1 The Head of School shall be responsible for the conduct and operation of the School under the supervision of the Board of Trustees.
- Section 2. Among other things, the Head of School shall employ and discharge teachers; fix compensation of teachers within the budgeted amount of teachers' salaries; determine the course of studies; accept, discipline, and discharge students; and generally do such other things as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the School, subject only to the power of removal vested in the Board time impose.
- Section 3. Prior to the first of April of each year, the Head of School, with the advice and approval of the Finance committee, shall submit to the Board a budget forecast for the fiscal year beginning on the following July 1.
- Section 4. No later than October of each year, the Head of School, with the advice and approval of the Finance Committee, shall submit to the Board a final budget for the fiscal year which shall have begun on the preceding July 1. This final budget shall contain such modifications of the budget forecast as may be deemed necessary or desirable.

This final budget shall be considered by the Board at its first meeting following such submission. The Board of Trustees shall have final authority in determining the form and substance of each year's budget.

- Section 5. The Head of School shall provide a monthly report of the work and condition of the School to the Board and an annual report of the progress of the School at the Annual Meeting of the Board. The Head of School shall present for the consideration of the Board such measures as he or she may deem necessary or expedient for the welfare of the School.
- Section 6. The Head of School shall regularly provide information regarding the financial condition of the School to the Board.
- Section 7. The Head of School shall be an ex-officio (non-voting) member of the Board. In addition, the Head of School shall be a member of all Committees of the Board, but shall have no power to vote. The Head of School shall be entitled to attend all meetings of the

Board and all Committees of the Board, except those designated as executive session unless otherwise invited by a majority vote of the Board.

Article X Saint George's School Advisory Council

Section 1. In addition to the Board of Trustees, Saint George's School shall be served by an Advisory Council which shall be responsible for providing advice and special assistance to the School when needed.

The Council shall meet at least once annually and its members shall serve unlimited terms. Council members shall be nominated by the Governance Committee and approved by the Board of Trustees. Council members that become trustees of the Saint George's School Board shall be excused from active participation on the Council for their Board term.

The Council shall have co-chairpersons nominated by the Governance Committee and approved by the Board of Trustees. The Advisory Council shall not have the power to make decisions or take action on behalf of the School or the Board of Trustees but shall serve as a resource to both.

Article XI Saint George's Parents Association

- Section 1. Saint George's School shall also be served by a parents association, which shall function primarily as a forum for communication between parents and as a forum for the exchange of information between parents and current members of the Saint George's community (faculty, staff, students, and trustees). This Association shall serve as the basis of support in affirming parental accord with Saint George's School dedication to excellence in education. It shall provide support in terms of parent volunteer services for the programs of the School. Its by-laws shall be subject to approval by the Saint George's School Board of Trustees.
- Section 2. Funds raised by or appropriated to the Parents Association shall be disbursed at the membership's discretion. The Parents Association shall not have the power to make decisions or take action on behalf of the School without prior approval of the Board of Trustees and/or the Administration of the School.

Article XII Saint George's School Alumni Association

Section 1. Saint George's School shall also be served by an alumni association which shall function primarily as a forum to promote a continuing and mutually beneficial relationship between the alumni and Saint George's School. This Association shall serve as the basis of support in encouraging alumni to maintain a strong sense of identity with and commitment to Saint George's School. It shall promote and support alumni participation

in fund-raising activities and encourage active participation in giving. Its by-laws shall be subject to approval by the Saint George's School Board of Trustees.

Section 2. Funds raised by or appropriated to the Alumni Association shall be disbursed at the membership's discretion. The Alumni Association shall not have the power to make decisions or take action on behalf of the School without prior approval of the Board of Trustees and/or the Administration of the School.

Article XIII Amendments

Section 1. The Board of Trustees may at any meeting thereof amend, repeal, or alter these By-Laws, or any article thereof, by a two-thirds vote of the Board, provided notice in writing of any such proposed action has been given to the members of the Board at least ten days prior to the meeting.
