Management's Discussion and Analysis

Years Ended June 30, 2011 and 2010

Introduction

South Peninsula Hospital (SPH) is a rural community hospital that serves a population of approximately 14,000 and spans 8,900 square miles. SPH's mission is to promote and improve community health and wellness by providing high quality, cost-effective, locally coordinated, and holistic health care.

South Peninsula Hospital provides a variety of healthcare services including;

- Diagnostic Laboratory and Imaging
- Inpatient Hospitalization
- Outpatient Care
- General and Orthopedic Surgery
- Skilled Long-term Nursing Care
- 24-Hour Emergency Services
- Specialty Care Clinics
- Community Health Services
- · Rehabilitation Therapy
- Sleep Lab Services

SPH is a service area enterprise fund of the Kenai Peninsula Borough serving the Southern Kenai Peninsula. SPH operates as a not-for-profit hospital and healthcare organization with business-type activities. SPH follows accrual based accounting and records transactions in accordance with Governmental Accounting Standards for an enterprise fund.

The Statement of Net Assets and Statement of Revenues, Expenses and Changes in Net Assets

One of the most important questions asked about the hospital's finances is, "is the hospital as a whole better or worse off as a result of the year's activities?" The Statement of Net Assets and the Statement of Revenue, Expenses and Changes in Net Assets report information about the hospitals resources and its activities in a way that helps answer this question. These statements include all restricted and unrestricted assets and all liabilities using the accrual basis of accounting. All of the current year's revenues and expenses are taken into account regardless of when cash is received or paid. The hospital's net assets are the difference between its assets and liabilities reported on the Statement of Net Assets.

These two statements report the hospital's net assets and changes in them. You can think of the hospital's net assets as one way to measure the hospital's financial health, or financial position. Over time, increases or decreases in the hospitals net assets are one indicator of whether its financial health is improving or deteriorating. You will need to consider other non-financial factors, however, such as changes in the hospital's patient base and measures of the quality of service it provides to the service area, as well as local economic factors to assess the overall health of the hospital.

Management's Discussion and Analysis, continued

The Statement of Cash Flow

The final required statement is the Statement of Cash Flows. The statement reports cash receipts, cash payments, and net changes in cash resulting from operations, investing, and both capital and non-capital financing activities. It provides answers to such questions as "Where did cash come from?" "What was cash used for?' and "What was the changes in cash balance during the reporting period?"

The Hospital's Net Assets

The hospital's net assets decreased in by \$205,438 in 2011 and increased by \$1,357,403 in 2010.

A new patient wing was completed in October 2009 and remodeled areas for pharmacy, laboratory, obstetrics and surgical services were completed in June 2010. Construction costs for this phase of the expansion totaled \$17,014,946, including capitalized interest expense. Construction began on a MRI building in August 2010 and was completed in April 2011 at a total cost of \$1,290,806.

Management's Discussion and Analysis, continued

The capital infrastructure of the hospital is primarily funded by an established property tax mil rate which pays the bond issues and provides for equipment replacement. Long range capital expenditures are expected to be adequately funded by this mil rate and funded depreciation.

Operating Results and Changes in the Hospital's Net Assets

The hospital had a \$2,987,795 loss from operations for fiscal year 2011. The hospital had strong revenue growth of almost \$4 million for the fiscal year. The revenue growth was offset by large increases in expenses. The hospital experienced a \$2.6 million increase in salaries and wages as a result of a new collective bargaining agreement that went into effect early in the fiscal year. \$900,000 of that increase was a one-time signing bonus paid out in August 2010; the remainder was an overall 14% increase in wages that brought wages in line with other Alaska hospitals. The collective bargaining agreement is in effect through December 31, 2013; salaries and wage expense should remain stable through that time. The hospital also recorded its first full year of bond interest expense of \$940,000. Prior to fiscal year 2011, a large part of the interest expense was capitalized as part of the hospital expansion costs. The increase in expenses resulted in a \$205,438 decrease in net assets.

Management's Discussion and Analysis, continued

Other Economic Factors

There are issues facing the hospital that could result in material changes in its financial position in the long term. Among those issues are:

Risks related to changes in Medicare and Medicaid reimbursement Increasing numbers of uninsured and underinsured patients Competition in the local health care market Nursing and other healthcare related labor shortages Healthcare Reform

The hospital is certified as a provider under both the Medicare program, which provides certain healthcare benefits to beneficiaries who are over 65 year of age or disabled, and the Medicaid program, funded jointly by the federal government and the state, which provides medical assistance to certain needy individuals and families. Approximately 32% of the hospital's gross patient revenue for fiscal year 2011 was derived from Medicare and 25% from Medicaid.

Notes to Financial Statements

June 30, 2011 and 2010

(1) The Reporting Entity

The South Peninsula Hospital Service Area Enterprise Fund (the Fund) is an enterprise fund of the Kenai Peninsula Borough, which was incorporated as a second class borough on January 1, 1964, under provisions of the State of Alaska Borough Act of 1961. Included in the financial statements are all entities for which the Fund has oversight responsibility. The Fund accounts for the provision of hospital services for the south peninsula area within the Kenai Peninsula Borough. The South Peninsula Hospital (the Hospital) is operated under a sublease and operating agreement ("Operating Agreement") by South Peninsula Hospital, Inc. Under the terms of this agreement, which expires December 13, 2013 with an optional six year extension, the South Peninsula Hospital Service Area provides funds to the Hospital, for payment of debt service, additions to, repairs and replacement of property, plant and equipment and for operational purposes if needed.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Enterprise Fund Accounting

Enterprise funds are used to account for government operations which are financed and operated in a manner similar to private business enterprises. It is the intent of the Kenai Peninsula Borough that the costs (expenses, including depreciation) of providing services to the general public on a continuing basis be financed or recovered primarily through user charges. The acquisition, maintenance and improvement of the physical plant facilities required to provide these services by the Fund are financed from existing cash resources of the Fund and the South Peninsula Hospital Service Area, the issuance of general obligation bonds by the Kenai Peninsula Borough on behalf of the Fund, and State and federal grants.

The accrual basis of accounting is followed by the Hospital. Under the accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recorded when incurred. The Hospital follows all applicable private sector guidance issued prior to December 1, 1989 as long as it does not conflict with Governmental Accounting Standards Board pronouncements.

Equity in Central Treasury

The Kenai Peninsula Borough has combined monies available for investment from all of the Borough's separate reporting funds into a "Central Treasury". The Central Treasury concept permits the more efficient investment of the combined assets from the separate funds. Each fund whose monies are deposited in the Central Treasury has equity therein.

Investments

The Hospital's policy is to invest only in obligations of the U.S. Treasury, its agencies and instrumentalities, fully collateralized certificates of deposit, commercial paper, and money market mutual funds. Investments are stated at fair value.

Service Area Enterprise Fund

Notes to Financial Statements, continued

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, continued

Inventory

Inventory consists primarily of hospital supplies and pharmaceuticals and is stated at the lower of cost (first-in, first-out method) or market.

Prepaid Expenses

Certain payments to vendors reflect cost applicable to future accounting periods and are recorded as prepaid expenses.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Interest incurred during the construction phase of construction is included as part of the capitalized value of the asset constructed. Depreciation is charged to operations by use of the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets, estimated to be ten to fifty years for buildings and three to fifteen years for equipment. Land is not depreciated. Expenditures for renewals and betterments are capitalized and maintenance and repairs are expensed when incurred. Gains and losses upon asset disposal are reflected in income.

Charity Care

The Hospital provides care to patients who meet certain criteria under its charity care policy without charge or at amounts less than its established rates. Because the Hospital does not pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as charity care, they are not included in net revenue.

Net Patient Service Revenue

Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payers, and others for services rendered, including estimated retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payers. Retroactive adjustments are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted in future periods as final settlements are determined.

Property Taxes

Property taxes attach as an enforceable lien on property as of January 1 each year. Taxes are levied by the Kenai Peninsula Borough on July 1 and are due in either two installments on September 15 and November 15, or one installment due October 15. The Borough bills and collects its own property taxes, those of the Borough service areas including the South Peninsula Hospital Service Area Enterprise Fund, and those of the cities within the Borough.

Unearned Revenue

Unearned revenue consists of payments received as of June 30 for property taxes due October 15th. Such deferred property tax revenues are for support for the following fiscal year operations.

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, continued

Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Hospital considers all highly liquid investments and deposits in the Kenai Peninsula Borough central treasury to be cash equivalents except those included in assets whose use is limited. The central treasury, which holds cash and investments, is used essentially as a cash management pool by each fund.

Assets Whose Use is Limited

Assets whose use is limited are assets set aside by the Board for future capital improvements or other uses over which the Board retains control and may, at its discretion, use for other purposes, except for bond funds which must be used for Hospital expansion and trust funds held in escrow. These investments are recorded at fair value and are included in unrestricted net assets.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(3) Uncompensated Care

Bad debts and charity care are subtracted from patient service revenue to arrive at net patient revenue. The following information relates to uncompensated care for the years ended June 30:

(10) Interest Capitalized

During 2011 and 2010, the Hospital capitalized \$53,443 and \$373,906, respectively, in interest costs. In 2011, this amount was comprised of \$53,515 in construction phase interest, net of \$72 interest earnings on bond funds. (11) Third-Party Payor Programs

The Hospital has agreements with third-party payers that provide for reimbursement at amounts different from its established rates. Contractual adjustments under third-party reimbursement programs represent the difference between the Hospital's established rates for services and amounts reimbursed by third-party payers. A summary of the basis of reimbursement with major third-party payers follows:

Medicare

Critical Access Hospitals are paid based on each hospital's reported costs. Inpatient, Outpatient, Laboratory, Therapy, and Swing-Bed services are paid at 101 percent of the hospitals cost of providing those services. The hospital is reimbursed at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports and audits by the Medicare fiscal intermediary.

Medicaid

Inpatient and outpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are paid for through a cost reimbursement method. Inpatient stays are paid on a per day rate with limits based on diagnosis. Outpatient services are reimbursed as a percentage of charges.

(12) Defined Benefit Pension Plan

Description of Plan

The Hospital employees participate in the South Peninsula Hospital Employees' Pension Plan, a defined benefit single employer plan. The Plan was established and is administered by the South Peninsula Hospital. The Plan issues separate financial statements that are available by contacting the Hospital at South Peninsula Hospital, 4300 Bartlett St., Homer, Alaska 99603.

Funding Policy

The Plan's funding policy provides for actuarially determined periodic contributions by the Hospital at rates that, for individual employees, increase gradually over time so that sufficient assets will be available to pay benefits when due. The Plan uses the traditional unit credit actuarial method. Significant actuarial assumptions used to calculate the net pension obligation are identical to those used for funding purposes.

Annual Pension Cost and Net Pension Obligation (Asset)

The annual required contribution for the current year was determined as part of the January 1, 2010 actuarial valuation. The actuarial assumptions included: (a) January 2010 segment interests of (1) Years 0-5-3.780%, (2) Years 6-20-6.310%, and (3) Years over 20-6.570% rate of returns (net of administrative expenses); (b) projected salary increases of 2.0% per year; and (c) no inflation rate.

(13) Risk Management

The Hospital is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets, medical malpractice, errors and omissions, injuries to employees, and natural disasters. The Hospital purchases commercial insurance for all risks of loss except as described below.

Risk Management, continued

The Hospital is insured for medical malpractice claims by a modified claims-made policy for any occurrence since January 1, 1987 reported during the current policy period or renewal thereof. Management has no reason to believe that the Hospital will not be able to obtain such coverage in future periods. The Hospital also retains \$100,000 of medical claims expense per covered employee each year, with coverage limited to a lifetime maximum of \$1,000,000 per covered employee.

Self-Insured Health Plan

The Hospital is self-insured for employee health insurance claims. Health Plan administration and processing is contracted to an independent third-party service provider. Health expense claims, administrative fees, and stop loss premiums are accrued in the period incurred. An estimate for claims incurred but not reported (IBNR) and claims incurred but not paid (IBNP) as of the Statement of Net Asset's date has been recorded based on claims lag reports from the plan administrator:
