	Emergency Shelter – Emergency shelter stays for youth (ages 10 – 18) range from a few hours up to 14 days. Important aspects of the emergency shelter program include: • A safe, stable environment, with 24-hour structured supervision by qualified, caring adults. • Healthy meals and snacks; personal hygiene products; clothing and shoes, if needed. • Access to medical care and other essential services. • A plan to reunite the youth with the family (if appropriate), along with support services such as family mediation.
4b	During FY 2010-11, we served 58 youth in this program, providing 662 bednights. (Code:) (Expenses \$ 96,415 including grants of \$) (Revenue \$ 630)
	Transitional Shelter – The Transitional Living Program is for youth ages 15-18 who do not have a suitable home to go back to. Each youth works with trained staff to set goals and create his or her own case plan. Succeeding in school and/or job training are stressed. The program encourages self-sufficiency through the Positive Youth Development approach, giving young people opportunities to exercise leadership, build skills, and get involved in their communities. The shelter provides Independent Living Skills Workshops, tutoring, referrals to employment resources, etc. During FY 2010-11, we served 13 youth in this program, providing 452 bednights.

Part III. Line 4d: Other program services.

Albany House Start-up / Linn County Outreach Project (\$42,402) In collaboration with community members and public agencies, JSYSI is working to open a second shelter facility for youth in Albany, Oregon, and to expand our service area to all of Linn County. Activities completed this year include: hiring staff to build and strengthen relationships with Albany and Linn County partners (County Juvenile & Health Departments, local schools, etc); appointing a task force of board members and Linn County residents to publicize the project and plan fundraising efforts; appointing a site-selection committee to look for a suitable building to buy or lease as a shelter; preparing a program plan that will make the program eligible for federal grants to support the project; planning an outreach strategy to extend services into rural Linn County.

Special Programs and Activities (\$20,622) As funding allows, shelter staff seek out opportunities to provide social events, educational activities, and classes for current and former clients. An example from FY 10-11 was a mandala painting class taught by a local volunteer and funded by a grant from the Benton County Cultural Coalition. This service area also includes our Mentoring program, which matches qualified community volunteers with youth for one-on-one interaction and helps fund mentor/mentee activities. During FY 10-11, 15 youths were matched with mentors.

Part VI Line 11: Has the organization provided a copy of this Form 990 to all members of its governing body before filing the form?

Two months before the filing deadline, the Business Manager provided an overview of the form to board members at a their monthly meeting and described the financial data to be included in the filing. All questions regarding governance were also reviewed with the board before those sections of the form were completed. Once the form was finished, the Business Manager and Board Treasurer reviewed it in detail. The completed form, with all Schedules and supplementary materials was compiled into a single pdf document and e-mailed to all board members for review before the form was signed by the Treasurer and submitted to the IRS.

Part VI Line 12: Does the organization regularly and consistently monitor and enforce compliance with the policy?

When they join the Board, all new members are given a copy of the Conflict of Interest Policy and they are made aware of its purpose and requirements. Every board member fills out a disclosure form annually. Monitoring compliance with the policy is the responsibility of the board's Executive Committee (President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer). The secretary is responsible for maintaining the file of disclosure forms and keeping a list of board members' roles (if any) in local companies that might do business with Jackson Street. The Executive Committee is involved in all significant spending decisions, and can easily check this list to see if potential conflicts of interest are

likely to arise. If there is any indication that this might occur, the board member(s) involved will be asked to update their disclosure form(s) so that the Committee can evaluate potential conflicts of interest.

Part VI Line 15: Did the process for determining compensation of the following persons include a review and approval by independent persons, comparability data, and contemporaneous substantiation of the deliberation and decision?

The Board approved a new Executive Compensation Policy in early 2010, for use in determining compensation for the Executive Director. The policy embodies all the requirements indicated in question 15 (independence of participants, collection of comparability data, documentation of the process). The board's Executive Committee is responsible for collecting the comparability data and any other information needed for the process; the Secretary is responsible for documentation. A review must be done every two years or whenever an increase in compensation of more than 5% is contemplated. The process was first implemented in November, 2011, to review the Executive Director's salary when mid-year budget revisions were considered.

Part VI Line 19: Describe in Schedule O whether (and if so, how), the organization makes its governing documents, conflict of interest policy, and financial statements available to the public.

Currently all public documents are available upon request, and can be viewed at Jackson Street's business office. Most are also available in the form of pdfs which can be e-mailed. (We have plans to add them to our website in the year ahead.)
