The Foundation

Dean Witter was born in Wausau, Wisconsin in 1887. He moved to California with his family in 1891, and after purchasing country land tracts in various areas of the state, the family moved to San Carlos on the Peninsula and eventually settled in Berkeley.



Dean Witter graduated from the University of California, Berkeley in 1909, and from 1909 worked for Louis Sloss & Company as a salesman on the California coast. With Charles Blyth he started Blyth, Witter & Company in 1914 and the two men ran the company until 1924, when he launched Dean Witter & Company with his brother Guy, cousins Jean and Ed Witter and their brother-in-law, Fritz Janney.

The San Francisco office of Dean Witter, located at 45 Montgomery Street, was company headquarters; the business expanded greatly over the years, partly through mergers. At the time of Witter's death in 1969 there were nearly 80 branches of Dean Witter & Co. in the U.S. and Canada and the company was the largest investment house on the West Coast.

Dean Witter interrupted his career to volunteer for duty in both World War I and World War II, during which he attained the rank of colonel.

During Dean Witter's lifetime, he found recreation in hunting and fishing and in enjoyment of the outdoors. In business and as a fisherman, Colonel Witter enjoyed pursuing the difficult task. He preferred the elusive trout to the easy fishing of a well-stocked pond. In this spirit, The Dean Witter Foundation seeks to practice imaginative grantmaking in the fields of finance and conservation.

It is the policy of The Dean Witter Foundation to support specific wildlife conservation projects in Northern California and seminal opportunities to improve and extend environmental education. The Foundation makes additional grants to launch and expand innovative K-12 public education initiatives.

Program Limitations

The Foundation does not:

Accept funding requests from individuals or awards loans, scholarships and grants to specific individuals.

Assume any obligation to provide continuing support to grantee programs.

Make grants for annual fundraising events, operating deficits, and capital campaigns.

Support sectarian religious activities or sectarian religious facilities.

Applying for Grants

Grant Application Procedures

The Foundation does not have a standard application form. Applicants should send one complete proposal to the Consultant with the following elements:

Cover Letter

- Brief description of the applying organization and proposed program.
- Amount of request.
- Statement that the proposal is supported by the organization's governing board.
- Name, address and telephone number of the appropriate contact person.

Specific Request

- Description of the purpose and need for the program and the problems it addresses.
- Program goals and objectives to be achieved.
- Description of geographic area and target population to be served.
- Outline of specific activities and timeline to achieve the program goals and objectives.
- Measurable objectives to evaluate program results.

Personnel Information

- Names and qualifications of the key personnel who will implement the program.
- Names and principal affiliations of the officers, directors and senior staff.

Organizational Information

- Brief history of the organization.
- Description of services, past accomplishments and capacity to execute the program.

Financial Information

- Detailed program budget itemized by standard accounting revenue and expense categories.
- The amount requested from the Foundation and how these funds will be used.

EXHIBIT 1

- List of other private and public funders approached and the amounts both requested and received to date for support of the program.
- Plan to generate continued funding for the program at the end of the grant. If the request is for multi-year funding, state the reasons why more than one year of support is necessary and provide a budget for each year of requested support.
- Overall organizational budget covering the years during which the proposed program will take place.
- Most recent annual financial statement, preferably audited. If an audited statement is unavailable, provide financial statements of revenue and expenses and IRS Form 990.

Addenda

- A copy of the organization's current IRS exemption letter.
- Any other supporting materials that would be helpful in evaluating the proposal.
