NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JULY 31, 2011

1. NATURE OF ACTIVITIES:

The Lander Grinspoon Academy, The Solomon Schechter School of the Pioneer Valley, Inc. (the "Organization") is a Jewish day school that welcomes children of families from all Jewish traditions and backgrounds with a mission to provide a rich, academically rigorous, and values-based education integrating general and Jewish studies in a nurturing environment.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Organization have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis of presentation

The Organization follows the provisions of Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") Revenue Recognition and Presentation of Financial Statements. Under these provisions, net assets and all balances and transactions are presented based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets and changes therein are classified and reported as follows:

- Unrestricted net assets Net assets not subject to donor-imposed stipulations as to their use. A portion
 of these net assets may be designated for specific purposes by the Board of Directors (the Board) of the
 Organization.
- Temporarily restricted net assets Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that will be met by actions of the Organization and/or the passage of time.
- Permanently restricted net assets Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that they be maintained permanently by the Organization. There were no permanently restricted net assets as of July 31, 2011.

Expenses are reported as decreases in unrestricted net assets. Gains and losses on other assets or liabilities are reported as increases or decreases in unrestricted net assets unless their use is restricted by explicit donor stipulation or by law. Expirations of temporary restrictions on net assets (i.e. the donor-stipulated purpose has been fulfilled and/or the stipulated time period has elapsed) are reported as net assets released from restrictions.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, as of the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JULY 31, 2011

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES: (CONTINUED)

Accounts receivable

Revenue is recognized on the accrual basis. The Organization records a receivable at the aggregate unpaid balance less an allowance for doubtful accounts. The Organization does not charge interest on unpaid balances. All amounts determined to be collectible are expected to be received within one year.

On a periodic basis, the Organization evaluates its accounts receivable and establishes an allowance for doubtful accounts. The allowance is based on the prior years' experience and management's analysis of specific accounts receivable. The allowance for doubtful accounts totaled \$4,692 as of July 31, 2011.

Pledges receivable

Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a promise to give to the Organization that is, in substance, unconditional. Pledges receivable are recorded at the present value of future cash flows, net of an allowance for uncollectibility. All pledges are typically due within one year or less, for which their net realizable value is a reasonable estimate of fair value.

On a periodic basis, the Organization evaluates its pledges receivable and establishes an allowance for doubtful accounts. The allowance is based on the prior years' experience and management's analysis of specific pledges made. Pledges receivable are considered past due based on the pledge date and are written off when management believes amounts will not be collected. Management does not believe a reserve is required at July 31, 2011.

Property and equipment

The Organization capitalizes property and equipment over \$2,000. Lesser amounts are expensed. Purchased property and equipment is capitalized at cost. Donations of property and equipment are recorded as contributions at their estimated fair value. The cost of property and equipment is depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets.

The cost of maintenance and repairs is charged to operations as incurred; significant renewals and betterments are capitalized. When assets are retired or otherwise disposed of, the cost and related accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts, and any resulting gain or loss is reflected in the change in net assets for the period.

Deferred revenue

Tuition and other fees which are paid in advance are deferred and subsequently recognized as revenue during the period in which they are earned.

Revenue and support

Revenue is recognized on the accrual basis. Tuition and other fees charged are deferred and recognized in the period in which they are earned.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JULY 31, 2011

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES: (CONTINUED)

Revenue and support (continued)

Contributions and grants, including unconditional promises to give, are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions in the period received. Conditional promises to give are not recognized until the conditions on which they depend are substantially met. Contributions of assets other than cash are recorded at their estimated fair value at the date of the gift.

The Organization is the beneficiary of income from donor-restricted purpose funds held, administered and controlled by the Jewish Federation of Western Massachusetts, Inc. d/b/a the Jewish Endowment Foundation of Western Massachusetts (the "Foundation"). These funds consists of gifts received with a donor stipulation that require the funds to be used for the benefit of the Organization and held for an indefinite period of time. The principal of these funds is neither in the possession nor under the control of the Organization and as these funds are subject to the Foundation's variance power, neither the fund assets nor the present value of the estimated cash receipts from these funds are recorded on the accompanying financial statements. Assets held by the Foundation for the benefit of the Organization totaled approximately \$64,000 as of July 31, 2011. The Organization has requested that allocations from this fund be reinvested rather than distributed for the year ended July 31, 2011.

Student financial aid

Tuition revenue and related fees are reported net of the discount attributable to reductions in amounts charged to students whether funded by unrestricted Organization funds or restricted specific purpose gifts.

Contributed services

Donated services are recorded as contributions when those services create or enhance non-financial assets or require specialized skills provided by individuals possessing those skills and which would be typically purchased if not provided by donation.

The Organization pays for most services requiring specific expertise. However, many individuals volunteer their time and perform a variety of tasks that assist the Organization with specific assistance programs and various committee assignments. The value of this contributed time and service is not reflected in these statements as it is not susceptible to objective measurement or valuation.

Allocation of expenses

The costs of providing the various academic and other activities of the Organization have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of functional expenses. Expenses associated with a particular activity are charged to that activity. Certain indirect expenses are allocated among academic, development (fundraising) and management and general activities based on related salary expenses.

Liquidity

In order to provide information about liquidity, assets have been sequenced according to their nearness to conversion to cash, and liabilities have been sequenced according to the nearness of their resulting use of cash.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JULY 31, 2011

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES: (CONTINUED)

Income taxes

The Organization is a tax-exempt organization as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and, except for taxes pertaining to unrelated business income, is exempt from federal and state income taxes. No provision has been made for income taxes in the accompanying financial statements as the Organization has had no unrelated business income.

The Organization has not taken any tax positions which would have a material effect, individually or in the aggregate, upon the Organization's financial statements. The Organization believes it has not taken any significant uncertain tax positions or any tax positions that would jeopardize the Organization's tax-exempt status. The Organization files income tax returns in the United States federal and state jurisdictions and is no longer subject to examinations by tax authorities for years before July 31, 2008.

Fair value of financial instruments

The carrying values of the Organization's cash, receivables, payables, accrued expenses, deferred revenue and notes payable approximated their fair value based on their maturities as of July 31, 2011.

4. LINE OF CREDIT:

The Organization has a revolving line of credit, dated September 19, 2003, payable on demand, in an amount not to exceed \$50,000. Interest is payable monthly based on the bank's base rate (3.25% at July 31, 2011). The line of credit is secured by the assets of the school.

7. LEASING ACTIVITIES:

The Organization leases the land on which the school building was built from the Congregation B'Nai Israel in Northampton, Massachusetts at no cost. The lease commenced August 13, 2002 and is for a period of seventy-five years.

The Organization also leases certain office equipment under operating leases which expire in July 2013. The lease provides for monthly payments totaling \$388. Total lease expense under the equipment leases were approximately \$4,700 for the year ended July 31, 2011.

8. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS:

From time to time, the Organization enters into transactions with individuals or entities that have a relationship to a member of the Board or an employee of the Organization. These transactions are subject to Board approval. Tuition paid by and financial assistance provided for children of certain board members totaled approximately \$133,200 and \$5,600, respectively. Tuition paid by and financial assistance provided for children of certain faculty members totaled approximately \$48,100 and \$62,900, respectively. Amounts owed from board and faculty members totaled approximately \$2,200 and \$5,100, respectively, as of July 31, 2011.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JULY 31, 2011

9. CONCENTRATIONS AND FINANCIAL RISK:

The Organization's operations expose it to a variety of financial risks that include concentrations and credit and liquidity risks.

Concentrations

The Organization's grants were provided by two unrelated not-for-profit organizations.

The public charity foundation holds donor endowed funds established for the benefit of the Organization. As the foundation has variance power, the Organization does not own the assets and therefore the funds are not recorded on its books. For the year ended July 31, 2011, support from the public charity totaled approximately 33% of total grants.

The private foundation provides annual support to the Organization as well as tuition support to families of students attending the school. In addition, the major benefactor of the private foundation guarantees the mortgage note of and provided an interest-free loan to the Organization (see Note 5). For the year ended July 31, 2011, support from the private foundation totaled approximately 67% of total grants.

Credit risk

Financial instruments subject to a concentration of credit risk consist of cash and receivables.

The Organization maintains cash balances at a financial institution located in Western Massachusetts. The cash account balances are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("FDIC"). Balances in excess of the FDIC insurance limits are insured by the Depositors Insurance Fund ("DIF"). The Company has not experienced any losses on its accounts and monitors the credit-worthiness of the financial institutions with which it conducts business. Management believes the Organization is not exposed to any significant concentration of credit risk on cash.

The Organization monitors its overdue receivable balances and maintains an allowance for potential losses that are assessed on an ongoing basis (see Note 2).

Liquidity risk

The Organization is exposed to liquidity risk with respect to its contractual obligations and financial liabilities. Prudent liquidity risk management requires maintaining sufficient cash deposits and availability of funding through an adequate amount of committed donors.

Management and the Board are confident that the Organization will continue to have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, these financial statements do not include any adjustments to the carrying amount or classification of assets and liability that would result if the Organization was unable to continue as a going concern.

10. Subsequent events:

Management has evaluated subsequent events through June 8, 2012, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JULY 31, 2011

11. PRIOR PERIOD ADJUSTMENTS:

The Organization discovered that previously issued financial statements included an error. The misstatement related to the following:

 Investment funds held at the Jewish Federation of Western Massachusetts, Inc. d/b/a as the Jewish Endowment Foundation of Western Massachusetts ("JEFWM") were incorrectly recorded as an asset of the Organization.

Although the Organization is the named beneficiary of the fund, the agreement explicitly states that it is irrevocable and that the funds belong to JEFWM with absolute authority and control. In addition, JEFWM has variance power, which explicitly grants JEFWM the unilateral power to redirect use of the funds from the Organization to another.

As the fund does not belong to the Organization and the distributions can be redirected, an asset should not be recorded in the accompanying financial statements. Fund assets held by JEFWM totaled \$54,351 as of July 31, 2010.
