UWHC's Financial Stability Partnership is a diverse group of stakeholders working together to help hard working people and their families in Hunterdon County become financially stable and take the next steps to long-term independence.

Current initiatives: Free tax preparation done by trained volunteers for low-wage working individuals and families ensures that families receive the Earned Income Tax Credit and other tax credits that boost their income while saving them preparer fees. In 2010, the VITA site generated over \$209,000 in refunds, raising client's incomes by nearly 15% on average. In addition, clients saved an estimated \$38,500 in tax preparation fees. Almost 220 volunteer hours were dedicated to this program. During the tax season UWHC expanded our awareness campaign for claiming the EITC, split refunds and savings campaigns.

UWHC's Holiday Hands and Winter Fuel Fund also increase financial stability by reducing financial pressures on lower-income families,

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elderly residents on fixed incomes, single parents, and people suffering from illness who are struggling with medical bills during the holiday time and winter months. For the 2010 holiday season, UWHC served over 1600 individuals in need and engaged 111 companies/organizations as well as nearly 98 community individuals in these efforts.

The Hunterdon Diaper Bank launched in January of 2010, a short-term emergency support for babies, mothers, the elderly and people with disabilities. The Hunterdon Diaper Bank was developed to inspire the people of Hunterdon County to make a difference in the lives of their neighbors by providing diapers, wipes, and incontinence supplies through financial generosity and volunteer commitment. We work to convert our community's compassion into action on behalf of those in need by increasing awareness of the issues facing vulnerable populations. The objectives of The Diaper Bank are threefold in scope: (1) to ensure that families and individuals have an adequate supply of diapers; (2) to raise community awareness that "basic human needs" include diapers and that these needs are not being met for many individuals and families; (3) to advocate for policy reform so that diapers are included in the definition of and provision for the "basic human needs" of families.

UWHC was the fiscal agent for a unique tri-county collaboration between Hunterdon, Warren, and Sussex Counties to alleviate homelessness. Partners from local human services agencies, County Divisions of Social Services and Departments of Human Services are working together on an approach that will utilize shared services, while still meeting local

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and individual needs. Despite areas of great wealth in our community, many individuals and families struggle to make ends meet and find themselves homeless, in temporary motel rooms, doubled up in tight quarters, or on the street. The Hunterdon Housing Alliance was convened by United Way of Hunterdon County to bring together the collective expertise of partners who are dedicated to addressing the lack of affordable housing in Hunterdon County.

The Homeless Prevention Rapid Re-Housing grant (HPRP) aims to prevent families and individuals from becoming homeless, and to help those who are already homeless to be quickly re-housed and stabilized. This program provides time-limited wraparound services through case management, housing search assistance, financial assistance for rent, security deposits, moving costs and utilities, legal services, credit and budget counseling, and credit repair services. The end goal is to stabilize households so that they will maintain permanent housing and become self-sufficient

Funded programs include food and shelter, housing, legal services, financial assistance, services for victims of domestic violence, and emergency assistance.

Plans for the coming year:

Plans for the coming year include expanding services to increase self-sufficiency for individuals and families with the launch of our Financial Resource Center, increasing awareness and access to financial resources and supports.

Tools for Schools - donations of school supplies were collected for students who are unable to afford them. Many families worry about the beginning of the school year because of the expense of buying back-to-school items. Receiving a donation of these supplies helps free up some family income for other necessities. Our Tools for Schools program supports Hunterdon County students in achieving greater educational success, by providing students the necessary basic tools so that they start the school year ready to learn. For the 2011 school year, UWHC served over 1600 students and engaged 67 companies/organizations and 30 community individuals in these efforts.

Youth 4 United Way, is a service learning program that increases student awareness of community needs and assists with linking our youth to ways that they can support those needs. Program goals are threefold: 1). Expand student education and experiences, 2). Encourage young people to give of their time, treasure, and unique talents, 3). Develop leadership skills in our youth. Upon completion of the class, students are expected to achieve the following outcomes:

- Increased awareness of existing community needs
- Increased awareness of their personality, learning, and leadership styles and how they might impact the effectiveness of a group or team
- Broader involvement in community service to address local as well as national and global needs
- Increased understanding of and practice applying the essential skills involved in effective, meaningful philanthropic work
- Increased understanding of essential skills of effective leadership

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- Increased understanding of problem solving and decision making
- Development of a life-long commitment to service and philanthropy as part of civic responsibility.

Funded programs include: child care, after-school care, life skills, teen programs, literacy programs, and mentoring.

Plans for the coming year:

Continue to partner with Workforce Investment Board (WIB) and its partners to develop plans for a economic and workforce development initiatives to help low-wage, low-skilled workers gain the skills and opportunities to earn a family sustaining wage.

Every community has unique needs, and United Way makes it our mission to understand and respond to those needs. We support programs and initiatives that reflect Hunterdon County's unique demographic, social, and geographic makeup to ensure that people with special needs have opportunities for recreation and socialization, that our youth have opportunities to grow and develop, and that everyone has a place to turn when they need help.

Current initiatives:

2-1-1 is a universally respected and growing national model. Today there are over 190 million Americans in 45 states who have access to community resources by dialing 2-1-1. New Jersey's 2-1-1 system, was piloted in Hunterdon County and has been in place statewide since February 10, 2005 and is accessible by landline, cell phone, and internet. 2-1-1 is managed by the NJ211 Partnership. 2-1-1 is an effective management tool. The system generates real time data on requests, complaints, and services. Over time, 2-1-1 data will improve

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the quality of programs and services by making it possible to harvest essential information on resource allocation and use it for policy decision-making and budgeting.

Fotonovellas are widely-read short stories that are commonly used in the Latino community to inform readers through use of the characters' dialogues, rather than an impersonal, detailed brochure. Typically, stories present information in the context of a step-by-step "how to" that follows the characters as they find and access services, and shows how their lives are improved after accessing services. This format helps to overcome not only language barriers, but also cultural barriers that often stand between the Latino population and the health and human services they need.
