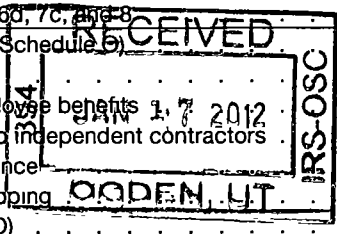

Areyvut engages tweens and teens in Jewish "wow" moments that last a lifetime. We provide empowering opportunities for individuals to make a difference in their lives and the lives of others and demonstrate to young participants that the Jewish community and the world value and need their involvement. Areyvut works on the cutting edge of youth programming to engage students in both service and philanthropy and uses Jewish texts and values to contextualize its work. In doing so, Areyvut ignites in its participants a lifelong commitment to helping others, particularly within a Jewish context, and provides tools and resources to enable students to use their passions to achieve real results in diverse settings. In doing so, we demonstrate to participants that Judaism is practical, relevant, and exciting. Our impact, however, reaches far beyond the students who walk through our doors. We engage their families, their synagogues, their schools, and local agencies in a joint effort to help those in need and reach thousands through our online resource center. Our work is building a community of thoughtful doers and givers who bring to life the core Jewish values of chesed, tzedakah, and tikkun olam.

In Part I Line 16 we had \$11,426.11 of other expenses including \$951.20 to attend and participate in conferences, \$1,168 to maintain and host our web site (www.aryvut.org), \$1,335.67 for credit card acceptance fees for event registrations and donations and \$7,971.23 on program related expenses including our Mitzvah Clown, Bnai Mitzvah and Teen Philanthropy Programs.

For Part II we started this year with \$4,071.71 and finished with \$5,341.22.

For Part III our program related expenses came to \$83,912.84 which includes salaries, health insurance, supplies, materials, copying, conferences and all other program related expenses. These costs cover all Areyvut programs including our:

A Kindness a Day Calendar that features a daily kindness drawn from traditional Jewish sources, to inspire good thoughts and good works.

National Mitzvah Day that actively engages everyone, from children to senior citizens, in giving back to the community through social action programs.

Mitzvah Clowning where we teach about the mitzvah of bikkur cholim (visiting the sick) and the art of medical clowning. Each month we coordinate friendly visits with senior citizens, children with special needs and others who are in need of laughter and smiles.

Jewish teen philanthropy program that teaching students about the non-profit to world, organizations in need and enables them to have a strong voice in their philanthropic giving.
