


SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES
Years Ended September 30, 2011 and 2010

The summary of significant accounting policies of Service For Peace, Inc (a non-profit organization) is presented to assist in understanding the Organization's financial statements. These policies conform to accounting principles generally practiced in the United States. The financial statements and notes are representations of the Organization's management, which is responsible for their integrity and objectivity.

Nature of Organization

Service For Peace, Inc ("the Organization") was incorporated in the State of Delaware on February 13, 2002. It is a not-for-profit organization that has received federal income tax exemption under section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, as an organization described in section 501(c)(3). The Organization was organized to promote volunteerism at the community level. Through service projects and educational seminars, they train upcoming community leaders to use volunteerism as a means of promoting good citizenship and peace between people of different races, faiths and nationalities. Their goal is to create a worldwide movement of selfless service. The Organization is supported by donations from the public.

Basis of Presentation and Recent Accounting Pronouncements

On June 29, 2009, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued an accounting pronouncement establishing the FASB Accounting Standards Codification (the "ASC") as the source of authoritative principles recognized by the FASB to be applied by nongovernmental entities. The pronouncement was effective for financial statements issued for periods ending after September 15, 2009, for most entities. On the effective date, all non-SEC accounting and reporting standards were superseded. The Organization adopted the new accounting pronouncement for the year ended September 30, 2009 as required, and the adoption did not have a material impact on the statements taken as a whole.

FASB ASC 855, Subsequent Events, was issued in May 2009. FASB ASC 855 establishes general standards of accounting for and disclosures of events that occur after the balance sheet date but before financial statements are issued or are available to be issued. It requires the disclosure of the date through which an entity has evaluated subsequent events and the basis for that date, that is, whether that date represents the date the financial statements were issued or were available to be issued. The Organization adopted FASB ASC 855 for the year ended September 30, 2009.

Basis of Presentation and Recent Accounting Pronouncements (continued)

The Organization adopted FASB Accounting Standards Codification Topic 958 for Not-For-Profit Entities; Subtopic 205 for Presentation of Financial Statements; Section 05 for Overview and Background, "Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit-Organizations." FASB ASC 958-205-05 requires the presentation of a complete set of financial statements, including a statement of cash flows, and to group expenses according to the purpose of function for which costs are incurred (rather than natural category).

FASB ASC 958-205-05 also requires that the various funds be categorized to the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets and changes therein are analyzed and reported as Unrestricted Net Assets – Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed restrictions, Temporarily Restricted – Net assets subject to donor-imposed restrictions, or law that may be met by actions of the Organization and/or the passage of time and Permanently Restricted – Net assets subject to donor-imposed restrictions requiring that they be maintained permanently by the Organization. For the years ended September 30, 2011 and 2010, The Organization has no temporarily or permanently restricted net assets.

The accompanying financial statements of the Organization have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and accordingly reflect all significant receivables, payables and other liabilities. Revenues are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets. Expenses are reported as decreases in unrestricted net assets.

Cash and Cash Equivalents, and Credit Risk

For purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, the Organization considers all unrestricted highly liquid investments with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents. The Organization's cash investments are placed with high credit-quality financial institutions and may exceed the amount of federal deposit insurance.

Inventory

Inventory consists of souvenir items held for sale and/or give-away at events held by the Organization and is carried at the lower of cost or market.

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are carried at cost. All equipment costing \$1,000 or more has been capitalized. Depreciation of all capitalized assets is computed by the straight-line method over estimated useful lives.

Donated Services

The Organization receives a substantial amount of non-professional services donated by many individuals, without compensation, in support of the Organization's activities. The financial statements do not reflect the value of those contributed services because, although clearly substantial, no reliable basis exists for determining an appropriate amount.

Expense Allocation

The costs of providing various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the Statement of Activities and the Statement of Functional Expenses. General and administration expenses include those expenses that are not directly identifiable with another specific function but provide for the overall support and direction of the Organization.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America as per guidance of the newly implemented Accounting Standard Codification FASB ASC 958 "Not for Profit Entities" requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through February 16, 2012, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE B – FEDERAL FUNDS GRANT

In December 2005 the Organization received a three year grant from the Corporation for National and Community Service (“CNCS”) for its “Martin Luther King Jr. Season of Service” program. The initial grant was for \$78,800 per year, and ran from December 2005 through November 2008. In September 2008 CNCS renewed the grant for a second three-year term. The renewed grant was for \$97,500 per year, and ran from September 2008 through August 2011 with terms similar to the first three-year grant. These are federal funds under CFDA #94.007. The grant requires that at least 70% of total project expenses come from other sources. In-kind matching donations are permitted. See Note F below for subsequent event.

The Organization received \$97,500 for the second year of the new grant, in November 2009 and April 2010. During the grant year ended August 2010 the Organization and its sub-recipient partners received matching contributions, mostly non-cash, totaling \$355,523. The matching funds received were thus 79% of total project expenses. See Note D below.

The Organization received \$97,500 for the third year of the new grant, in November 2010 and March 2011. During the grant year ended August 2011 the Organization and its sub-recipient partners received matching contributions, mostly non-cash, totaling \$223,421. The matching funds received were thus 70% of total project expenses.

NOTE C – DONATED MATERIALS, SERVICES AND USE OF FACILITIES

The Organization received donated materials with an approximate fair value of \$21,734 and \$10,055 in the years ending September 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively. The Organization received donated professional services with an approximate fair value of \$53,653 and \$68,115 in the years ending September 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively. The Organization received the donated use of facilities with an approximate fair value of \$2,000 and \$6,102 in the years ending September 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively. These amounts are included in contributions and expenses in the statements of activities.

NOTE D – COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

Fellowship Hosting Agreement

In June 2011, the Organization renewed its fellowship hosting agreement with a non-profit organization, Atlas Corps, which agrees to recruit, train and place two individuals from overseas to participate in a fifty-week fellowship at the Organization. Through their fellowships, these individuals have opportunities to understand American culture and society and gain exposure to American techniques, methodologies and expertise in their occupational fields, while participating in the Organization's activities, conferences and seminars.

The Organization in turn, agreed to pay Atlas Corps a total of \$54,000 in four quarterly installments of \$13,500 each over the duration of the agreement, which will terminate in December 2012 unless otherwise extended by the parties. The first quarterly installment of \$13,500 was paid during the year ended September 30, 2011.

Concentration

The Organization received 24% and 15% of its income from two non-profit organizations and 32% from a business corporation in the year ending September 30, 2011. The Organization received 28%, 16% and 11% of its income from three non-profit organizations and 10% from a federal agency (see Note B above) in the year ending September 30, 2010.

NOTE E - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

In the year ended September 30, 2011, the Organization received cash donations totaling \$461,910 from two non-profit organizations that have officers and directors in common with the Organization. In the year ended September 30, 2010, the Organization received cash donations totaling \$270,000 from one non-profit organization that has officers and directors in common with the Organization.

The Organization also received cash donations of \$377,000 and \$87,500 from a business corporation that has officers and directors in common with the Organization, in the years ended September 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively.

In the year ended September 30, 2010, the Organization received program service revenue of \$19,360 from a non-profit organization that has an officer in common with the Organization.

NOTE F – SUBSEQUENT EVENT

In September 2011, CNCS awarded another three year grant to the Organization for its Martin Luther King Jr. Season of Service Program. This is the third three-year grant that the Organization has received from CNCS for this program. The new grant is for \$160,000 per year, and runs from 2012 through 2014 with terms similar to the previous two three-year grants. See Note B above.
