	The Rhode Island Hospital Foundation (the Foundation) provides philanthropic support to various programs at Hasbro Childrens Hospital (HCH), the pediatric divors of Rhode Island Hospital (RIH) Noteworthy were transfers of \$724,728 to HCH in support of its Child Life Program, which offers pediatric patients and their fam opportunities for recreation, creativity and diversion to provide a sense of normalcy during their hospital stay. The goals of HCH's Child Life Program are to (1) encourage children and adolescents to maintain a sense of independence, self-esteem and control, (2) reduce the potential stress associated with the medical experience, (3) reestablish family routines, and (4) listen and advocate for family-centered care. In fiscal year 2011, the Foundation transferred \$359,178 to The Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University in support of shared chairs in cardiothoracic surgery, orthopedics, urology, emergency medicine, and oncology. In addition, \$208,085 was transferred to RIH to support treatment of the poor/indigent.

During the fiscal year ended September 30, 2011, the Foundation made temporarily restricted net asset transfers to Rhode Island Hospital amounting to \$8,574,262 to be spent by Rhode Island Hospital in support of certain building and equipment additions or specified clinical programs. A master database of Rhode Island Hospital Foundation's temporarily restricted funds is maintained as the primary source for identifying each fund's restriction, the availability of the current balance and the authorized personnel for the respective fund. The database contains the fund's name, primary reporting department, most recent month end balance, fund purpose/restriction, and the management responsible for the fund. Expenditures (purchase requisitions, work order requisitions, check requests and employee reimbursements) from Rhode Island Hospital's temporarily restricted funds must be presented to the Lifespan Finance Department for approval prior to processing. Each request is reviewed to ensure the availability of funds and that the expense/purchase is both in conformity with the fund's restriction and approved by the required levels of authorized personnel referenced in the database. The Foundation and Brown University (Brown) have several agreements pursuant to which each entity maintains endowment funds representing 50% of certain endowment gifts which support various clinical shared chairs. A percentage of the annual income from such funds is used to support the named Professorships and payments distributing these amounts are made by the Foundation to Brown on a quarterly basis. Under the terms of the agreements, Brown provides an accounting to the Foundation sixty days following the anniversary of each agreement.
