OTHER initiatives include SFSP-the Summer Food Service Program-a Minnesota Department of Education administered program that funds free meals to children 18 and younger during the summertime. We identify high poverty areas annually in our collaboration with the Minnesota Department of Education using school free and reduced meal program data to PROVIDE mingrants to eligible agencies and organizations, as well as planning our outreach efforts fo
