ARTICLE I. - NAME

Section 1. - The name of the organization shall be the United Planning Organization.

ARTICLE II. - PURPOSE AND FUNCTION

Section 1.

The United Planning Organization is the officially designated Community Action Agency for the District of Columbia. Its purpose is to provide leadership, support and advocacy to advance low income and other eligible residents of Washington, D.C., to assist them in achieving self-sufficiency and self-determination, and to enhance generally the quality of life in the local community.

Section 2. - This general purposes and functions of UPO are:

a. Empower individuals, families and communities to move toward self sufficiency and improve the quality of their lives through, economic development, services for the aged, income management, housing, emergency services, employment, education, health and nutrition.

- b. To collect and analyze data on the incidence and nature of poverty; to identify major issues which require community action; and to set priorities and develop corrective measures.
- c. To analyze existing public, private and civic agencies and services as they concern the issues of poverty and improve coordination and methods for fuller mobilization of all resources for support of community action efforts.
- d. In cooperation with the participating agency network, community, business, governmental agencies, and other human service providers, plan and implement human service programs to assist low income and other eligible residents.
- e. To serve as the administrative agency for the utilization and application of governmental and other funds to support UPO's purposes, while assuring responsible fiscal oversight.

ARTICLE III. - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. - Board of Directors

The Board of Directors shall be the governing body of the organization that will manage the business and property of the Corporation consistent with these Bylaws, Certificate of Incorporation and by the requirements of law.

Section 2. - Composition

a. General Provisions

The Board of Directors shall consist of not more than twenty-one (21) members and shall be so constituted that (1) one-third of the total members of the Board are elected public officials or their representatives designated by the Delegate, District of Columbia, U.S. House of Representatives; the Mayor of the District of Columbia; and the Chair of the Council of the District of Columbia; (2) one-third of the members are persons chosen in accordance with democratic selection procedures adequate to assure that they are representative of the poor in the area served; and (3) one-third of the members are officials or members of business, law, industry, financial, labor, religious, welfare, education, child welfare and development, or other major groups and interests in the community.

Each member shall be a resident of the District of Columbia. The failure of any member to meet the residential qualifications set forth in this provision shall be cause for removal, and the Board shall remove the member in accordance with the procedures set forth in Article III, Section 4, of these Bylaws.

b. Selection Procedures

The number and composition of the Board of Directors fixed by the Certificate of Incorporation or these Bylaws may be modified by the vote of the majority of the members present and voting except that the number of directors shall in no event be reduced to less than twelve, nor shall the composition or maximum number of the Board of Directors be changed in any manner which would be in violation of any law or regulation governing such composition.

(1) Elected Public Officials or their Representatives

The Delegate, District of Columbia, U.S. House of Representatives shall designate one (1) representative; the Mayor of the District of Columbia shall designate four (4) representatives; and the Chair of the Council of the District of Columbia shall designate two (2) representatives.

(2) Representatives of Low-Income Residents

One-third of the members are persons chosen in accordance with democratic selection procedures established by the Board of Directors to assure that they are representatives of low-income residents in the area served. Representatives of low-income residents shall be chosen in accordance with such procedures and criteria as may be established by the Board of Directors. Such procedures must assure that the representative was democratically selected.

(a) One representative of low-income residents shall be chosen from the designated election service areas within the District of Columbia as designated by the Board of Directors.

Each member of the Board selected to be a representative of lowincome residents shall be a resident of the specific designated area at the time of his (her) selection as a election service representative, and at all times during his (her) term. representative whose income exceeds 125% of the federal income poverty guidelines issued by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services must reside in an area with a concentration of poverty greater than the District of Columbia average at the time of his (or her) selection as a representative, and at all times during his (or her) term. The failure of any representative to meet the residential qualifications set forth in this provision shall be cause for removal, and the Board shall remove such representative in accordance with the procedures set forth in Article III, Section 4. -Removal of a Director, of these Bylaws.

- (b) One representative shall be designated by the UPO Policy Council who represents the UPO Policy Council and the neighborhood where the member resides.
- (3) Representatives of Major Groups and Interests

One-third of the representatives of major groups and interests in the community shall be chosen as follows:

(a) The Board of Directors of UPO, sitting as a major group and interest in the community, shall elect the remaining directors from among groups representative of business, law, industry, financial, labor, religious, welfare, education, child welfare and development, or other major group and interests in the community.

Section 3. - Terms

- a. <u>Terms of Board Members</u> The term of each director shall be three years. Upon completion of a director's term, that director shall continue to serve until a successor is appointed. Except as otherwise provided herein, no member shall serve more than two successive terms. After a hiatus of at least six years from service on the Board, a former director shall be eligible for appointment as a director for not more than two successive three-year terms.
- b. <u>Board Continuity</u> To ensure the continuity of the Board, directors shall be selected on a staggered basis. Any director who has served on the Board for more than six years shall be rotated off the Board in 2007; and any director who was selected to be a representative of the poor in 2005 with a term of three years shall rotate off the Board in 2008.
- c. Resignation Any director may resign by giving written notice of such resignation to the Board.

Section 4. - Removal of a Director

Any director may be removed by a majority of the entire number of directors for any cause deemed sufficient by the directors upon a motion duly made by the Nominating, Bylaws and Board Governance Committee. However, before any member may be removed, he shall be notified in writing at least two weeks prior to the next board meeting

of the reason for the proposed action against him, the action contemplated by the Board pursuant to such reasons, and a reasonable opportunity to show cause and be fairly heard by the Board regarding the reasons.

Section 5. - Attendance

The Nominating, Bylaws and Board Governance Committee of the Board shall, at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors, place before the Board a written motion regarding the removal of any member of the Board of Directors who shall have failed to attend three consecutive regularly scheduled meetings of the Board of Directors and notify the Secretary of the Board. Upon submission of said motion by the Nominating, Bylaws and Board Governance Committee, the matter shall be deemed properly before the Board for discussion and vote, including a consideration of the issue of whether cause deemed sufficient by the Board has been shown. The provisions of Section 4 shall apply to any action contemplated under this section.

Section 6. - Vacancies - Board

In order to fill board vacancies, the Nominating, Bylaws and Board Governance Committee shall submit to the Board the names of persons that the Committee believes are qualified to fill such vacancies, as established by the Board. From the foregoing nominations, the designated members of the Board shall elect new directors to fill existing vacancies, consistent with Article III, Section 2.b. - Selection Procedures. Such election shall be by majority vote of those members present and voting. Within 30 days of notice of a Board vacancy, the Board will initiate the process to have the vacancy filled.

Section 7. - Board Meetings

- a. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held during evening hours at such places and times as may be fixed by general resolution of the Board, or at such places or by teleconference and times as shall be specified by the Board.
- b. Special meetings shall be held whenever called by the Chair or by a majority of the

Board, either in writing or by vote. There shall be not less than six regularly scheduled meetings of the Board of Directors annually. These meetings shall take place not less than every other month -- January, March, May, July, September, and November.

c. The Board shall keep minutes of all of its meetings which shall provide a full account of the business conducted.

Section 8. - Notice of Meetings

Notice in writing or by electronic interface of the place, day and hour of every regular meeting of the Board shall be given to each director not later than seven days before the day set for the meeting. Notice in writing or by electronic interface of the place, day and hour of special or emergency meetings of the Board shall be given not less than 24 hours before the day set for the meeting.

Section 9. - Quorum

A majority of the membership of the Board of Directors shall be necessary and sufficient to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at every meeting of the Board, but if at any meeting there be less than a quorum present, a majority of those present may without notice adjourn the meeting until a quorum shall attend. At any such adjourned meetings at which a quorum shall be present, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the meeting as originally notified.

Section 10. – Designation of Board Members

The Board of Directors may designate from time to time Board Members to boards of other tax-exempt organizations or governmental units or instrumentality. All designations shall be in the best interest of the Corporation and shall protect and further the interest of the Corporation.

ARTICLE IV.

OFFICERS, EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AND OTHER COMMITTEES

Section 1. - Officers of the Corporation

The officers of the Corporation shall be a Chair, a Vice Chair, a Treasurer and a Secretary.

Section 2. - Duties of Officers

The officers shall have such authority and perform such duties of the Corporation's business as usually pertain to the offices they hold, as may be assigned to them by the Board, or as may be otherwise provided by these Bylaws.

a. Duties of the Chair

The Chair of the Board of Directors shall be responsible for the execution of the functions and duties as provided by these Bylaws and for the execution of other powers as may be assigned by the Board. The Chair shall convene and preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors.

b. Duties of the Vice Chair

The Vice Chair, in the absence or disability of the Chair, shall perform the duties and exercise the powers of the Chair. The Vice Chair shall generally assist the Chair in performing such other duties, and execute other powers as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors.

c. Qualifications and Duties of the Treasurer

(1) Qualifications - The Treasurer shall have a professional background in financial management and an understanding of accounting for nonprofit organizations.

- (2) <u>Duties</u> The Treasurer shall be responsible for reporting to the Board on all financial matters of the Corporation. The Treasurer's responsibilities shall also include:
 - serving as the chairperson of the Audit and Finance Committee;
 - conducting, along with the Audit and Finance Committee, the Board's review of and action related to the Board's financial responsibilities;
 - working with the President and Chief Executive Officer and the Vice President of Finance and Chief Financial Officer of the Corporation to ensure that appropriate financial reports (including internally prepared monthly financial statements) are made available to the Board on a timely basis;
 - communicating the Board's priorities to the President and Chief Executive Officer and/or the Vice President of Finance and Chief Financial Officer with respect to the annual budget and presenting the budget to the Board for approval; and
 - reviewing the annual audit.

d. Duties of the Secretary

The Secretary shall be responsible for assuring that minutes of Board meetings are recorded, keeping records of board actions, sending out meeting announcements, distributing copies of minutes and the agenda to each board member, keeping records of board attendance and assuring the corporate records are maintained and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or the Chair. The Secretary shall confer with the Nominating, Bylaws and Board Governance Committee on matters concerning attendance. The Secretary shall have the authority to

affix the Seal of the Corporation to any instrument requiring it, upon approval of the Board of Directors and, when so affixed, the seal may be attested to by the Secretary's signature.

Section 3. - Election of Officers

The officers shall be elected by the Board every two (2) years beginning in calendar year 1995. Each officer may succeed himself (or herself) in office. Each person elected an officer shall continue in office until the next annual meeting after his (or her) election or until his (or her) successor shall have been duly elected and qualified, or until his (or her) resignation or removal in accordance with these bylaws.

Section 4. - Removal of an Officer

An officer may be removed by a majority vote of the entire Board whenever in its judgment the best interest of the Corporation will be served thereby. Prior to any action being taken under this section, the affected officer shall be notified in writing at least two weeks in advance of the reasons for his (or her) proposed dismissal and given a reasonable opportunity to be fairly heard by the Board regarding the alleged reasons.

Section 5. - Vacancies - Officers

In the event of a vacancy for an officer for cause occurring, a successor to serve the unexpired term may be elected by the Board of Directors in the same manner as his (or her) predecessor at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. - Executive Committee

a. The Board of Directors shall establish an Executive Committee composed of the officers of the Corporation, the immediate past chair and the chairpersons of all Standing Committees of the Board. The Chair of the Board of Directors shall serve as chairperson of the Executive Committee. Additional members may be appointed by the Chair. The Executive Committee shall hold monthly meetings and, except

for the power to amend the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws, shall exercise all the powers of the Board between meetings of the Board. All Executive Committee actions, however, shall be reported to the Board at its next meeting and shall stand unless rescinded by the Board. A majority of the Executive Committee's total current membership shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

b. Responsibilities:

Subject to ratification by the Board of Directors at its next meeting, the Executive Committee shall:

- (1) Act on behalf of the Board when needed.
- (2) Provide direction to the President and Chief Executive Officer (President/CEO).
- (3) Establish committees as needed to address issues not assigned to a standing committee.
- (4) Develop and represent public positions on behalf of the Board of Directors.
- (5) Receive committee reports, and act as needed.
- (6) Perform an annual evaluation of the President/CEO.
- (7) Based upon Board approval, execute documents necessary to carry out fiduciary responsibilities.
- (8) Coordinate the work of the Board and develop an annual work schedule for the Board.
- (9) Recommend approval of all personnel matters pertaining to the

President/CEO (i.e., salary, leave, benefits, etc.).

Section 7. - Standing Committees

The following Standing Committees are hereby established to assist the Board of Directors in carrying out the purposes of the Corporation. The Chair of the Board of Directors shall appoint the chairperson of each of the Standing Committees. Standing Committees will work in cooperation with each other.

a. AUDIT & FINANCE COMMITTEE

Responsibilities:

- (1) The Audit & Finance Committee shall review a) the financial statements of the Corporation, b) the independent public accountants qualifications and independence, and c) the performance of the Corporation's internal audit function and independent audits.
- (2) Each member of the Audit & Finance Committee shall be able and understand fundamental financial statements, including the Corporation's balance sheet, revenue and expense statement and cash flow statement, or shall become able to do so within a reasonable period after his (or her) appointment to the Audit & Finance Committee.
- (3) The Audit & Finance Committee shall meet as often as it determines is appropriate, but not less frequently than nine (9) times per year.

The Audit & Finance Committee shall:

- (1) ensure that the Board receives accurate and complete information and make sure that federal and state reporting takes place.
- (2) develop and recommend to the Board an audit policy to govern the Corporation's selection of an independent auditor to conduct the annual financial audit and recommend the selection of the independent auditor.
- (3) meet and review with management and the independent auditor the results of the audit of the Corporation's annual financial statements and any other matters related to the conduct of the audit, which are to be communicated to the Audit & Finance Committee under generally accepted auditing standards.

 Recommend action on the annual audit to the full Board of Directors.
- (4) provide assistance regarding corporate accounting and reporting practices, including yearly monitoring and evaluation of the quality and integrity of the financial systems and funding mechanisms of the Corporation.
- (5) meet and review with the independent auditor the adequacy and effectiveness of the Corporation's internal accounting and financial controls.
- (6) review findings from completed internal audits and progress reports.
- (7) develop, recommend or implement programs, projects and strategies pertaining to a) the identification and garnering of new resources to expand and reinforce the Corporation's program efforts; b) long-range financial planning techniques designed to enhance the financial security of the Corporation; and c) the establishment of annual funding priorities for Corporation programs.
- (8) recommend to the Executive Committee such modifications to UPO funding plans and resource allocations as are necessary to 1) improve program effectiveness and efficiencies, employee morale, and program economies; and 2) to maximize the impact of UPO's funding upon conditions of poverty

in the metropolitan Washington area.

- (9) conduct or authorize investigations into any matters within the Audit and Finance Committee's scope of responsibilities.
- (10) establish and disclose formal procedures for (a) the receipt, retention, and treatment of complaints received by the Corporation regarding accounting, internal accounting controls or auditing matters; (b) confidential, anonymous submission of concerns regarding questionable accounting or auditing matters; and (c) prevent retaliation.
- (11) review with the Vice President of Legal Affairs and General Counsel any legal and regulatory matters that may have a material impact on the Corporation's financial statements, financial condition or results of operations.
- (12) review and recommend an annual budget for the agency and implement a quarterly process to present recommendation for modifications to the annual budget as needed.

b. PROGRAM COMMITTEE

Responsibilities:

- (1) Provide oversight of the Corporation's Community Needs Assessment Process to assure input from customers, partners and the use of appropriate demographic data including coordination with Parent Policy Committee.
- (2) Based upon the results of the Community Needs assessment, recommend for Board approval Priority Focus Areas for service delivery.
- (3) Develop the Corporation's Strategic Plan and make recommendations for Board adoption.

- (4) Perform annual review of Management's Tactical Plan and approved project outcomes.
- (5) Review, quarterly, the progress of the Corporation to reach its project outcomes and report the same to the Board of Directors.
- (6) Review proposed application/executive summaries to assure compliance with approved priority areas and strategic plan and recommend for action by the Board.
- (7) Review of the implementation of funded activities to assure quality controls are in place to meet contractual responsibilities. Make recommendations for revisions or expansion where specific funded activities may benefit.
- (8) Review the monitoring reports of all funding sources to determine the need for Board or Management Action.
- (9) Review and make recommendations on grant applications.
- (10) Ensure that the Board receives information and updates on all planned program reviews and program audits in a timely manner.
- (11) Provide oversight for UPO program operations including coordination with UPO Head Start delegate agencies and Parent Policy Committee.
- (12) Periodically present to the Board the operational strengths and weaknesses of selected program activities, for information and education purposes.

c. NOMINATING, BYLAWS AND BOARD GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE

Responsibilities:

(1) Identify and recommend director nominees to fill expiring and vacant Board

- seats and address corporate governance matters. In making such recommendations, consider the knowledge and skills essential to the Board.
- (2) Receive recommendations of interest groups, community groups, board member and individuals for persons to be considered for filling expiring and vacant Board seats.
- (3) Develop and recommend criteria for minimum standards of eligibility for all members of the Board of Directors. Certify: (a) the designation of Mayoral Designees, (b) the democratic election of the Representatives of the Poor, and (c) the election of Representatives of Major Groups and Interests.
- (4) Consider the qualifications of directors and make recommendations for the offices of Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer.
- (5) Conduct orientation sessions for new directors within a reasonable period of time after their appointment or election as a director, and organize ongoing training sessions for the entire Board.
- (6) Consider and make recommendations with respect to the Bylaws and regulations affecting the proper governance of the Board of Directors.
- (7) Periodically review the United Planning Organization Bylaws; and consider, prepare and make recommendations of proposed additions or amendments to these Bylaws consistent with Article VII. Amendments to the Board of Directors for review and adoption.
- (6) Develop and recommend to the Board the Corporate Governance Guidelines that should be adopted by the Board; and review and reassess, as appropriate, the adequacy of the Corporate Governance Guidelines and recommend any proposed changes to the Board for approval.
- (7) Develop and recommend to the Board a Code of Business Conduct and

Ethics that should be adopted by the Board; and review and reassess, as appropriate, the adequacy of the Code of Business Conduct and Ethics.

- (8) Review and reassess, taking into account the assessment of the relevant committees as to their respective responsibilities, the adequacy of the Board's various committee responsibilities annually and recommend any proposed changes to the Board for approval.
- (9) Monitor and evaluate the Board's performance. Confer with the Secretary of the Board on matters concerning attendance and enforcement of Article III. – Board of Directors Section 5. – Attendance of these Bylaws.
- (10) Conduct exit interviews with outgoing members leaving before terms expires.

d. HUMAN RESOURCES COMMITTEE

Responsibilities:

- (1) Monitor, evaluate and make recommendations concerning policies, strategic matters and collaborate on board training related to UPO human resources, personnel and temporary staff issues.
- (2) Periodically review and recommend approval of the personnel policies of UPO that are outside the regular collective bargaining process and consider trends affecting the policies;
- (3) Monitor the collective bargaining process and administration of collective agreement(s) and advise on the improvement of labor-management relations;
- (4) Receive reports for review and/or recommendation for approval of proposals for negotiations with bargaining unit; and agreements or memorandum of agreement or amendments to be presented to the Board;

- (5) Monitor the development and implementation of UPO policies and programs, which affect staff relations including, but not limited to, equal opportunities, workplace diversity, and employee assistance programs;
- (6) Periodically assess the framework governing the salary schedule to determine whether the schedule is in line with UPO's values and relevant regulations, whether there is appropriate internal equity or differences among positions and departments, whether specific positions are appropriately placed on the scale, whether compensation is in line with that at similar organizations and or whether the compensation supports (rather than hinders) UPO's ability to recruit qualified staff; and recommend the salary schedule for Board approval.
- (7) Annually review specific salaries of staff against the salary schedule, to ensure that no individuals are being paid outside the range of that person's position; and to ensure compliance with the salary schedule and to protect against favoritism.
- (8) Review the benefits package health insurance, long-term disability, 401(k) and so forth and make recommendations for Board approval with reference to current market trends.
- (9) Review and provide general oversight of workplace health and safety policies and processes that ensure compliance with occupation and environmental health and safety legislation, relevant regulations, standards and codes of practice.
- (10) Receive and present annual health and safety report to the Board with recommendations for improvement as necessary.
- (11) Monitor, review and recommend approval of framework for staff engagement, recruitment, retention, development and training, employee well-being,

appraisal and succession planning.

- (12) Review and recommend procedures for Board approval for executive level staff to present disputes, problems or grievances, especially when such relate to the overall administration and management of the corporation's affairs to the Board.
- (13) Consider only those matters brought to it in accordance with established procedures, and recommend any necessary actions to the Board.
- (14) Consider the future and present workforce needs of UPO and make recommendations concerning directions to take as determined for approval by the Board.
- (15) Receive reports and make recommendations to the Board on established personnel policies and procedures.

e. DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Responsibilities:

- (1) Develop, create and recommend to the Board of Directors:
 - strategies and activities designed to support and advance the mission and strategic plan of UPO with special emphasis on fundraising; and
 - publicity and public relations strategies and activities to enhance the recognition and image of UPO, its activities and accomplishments throughout the Washington Metropolitan Area.
- (2) Work with the President and Chief Executive Officer and UPO staff on the planning, policies and conduct of UPO's Martin Luther King, Jr. annual

- breakfast; the UPO/Joseph A. Beavers Scholarship and other scholarship programs; and other needs of the organization.
- (3) Recommend nominees for the board of directors of the UPO Inspire

 Foundation, and make regular reports to the Executive Committee and Board
 of UPO on Foundation activities.
- (4) Assist in implementing and coordinating the fund-raising activities authorized by the UPO Board of Directors. These acts may include, but are not limited to:
 - a) involving all UPO board members in fundraising activities;
 - b) promoting the development of UPO through various forms of planned giving such as bequests, trusts and gifts of cash or other assets;
 - c) monitoring fund-raising activities in an effort to see that ethical practices are in place and being followed;
 - d) working with board and staff to ensure that donors are acknowledged appropriately and their confidentiality is protected, as requested, and as permissible by law;
 - e) evaluating the effectiveness of fundraising activities;
 - f) developing partnerships with private and/or public sectors to improve the work, scope, image and success of UPO in accomplishing its mission;
 - g) training Board members on development concepts, ethics and techniques;
 - h) making recommendations for UPO Board approval and working closely with consultants, as necessary, to provide professional

services to assist UPO in successful fundraising activities and community awareness strategies.

- (5) Seek opportunities for pro bono and in kind assistance to support UPO activities and initiatives.
- (6) Report regularly to the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors on the Development Committee's activities and submit any recommendations to the Executive Committee and Board of Directors for approval.
- (7) Meet on a regular basis, as necessary, to accomplish the work of the committee.

The Board of Directors may designate no more than one community representative who is not a member of the Board of Directors to serve on any one Standing Committee. The chairperson of any Standing Committee, however, must be a member of the Board of Directors.

Section 8. - Other Committees

The Board of Directors may, by resolution, establish such other committees as it may deem necessary and shall define their duties, term, the manner in which they shall operate and other incidents. Such committees may include those that are advisory in nature and may serve to provide greater community involvement in the content area focus of the organization.

ARTICLE V. - STAFF

Section 1. - President and Chief Executive Officer (President/CEO)

The Board of Directors shall appoint a President and Chief Executive Officer (President/CEO) who shall be immediately responsible to it and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The President/CEO shall, subject to such review and

approval as the Board of Directors may require, be responsible for the administration and supervision of all operational phases of the Corporation.

Section 2. - Vice President of Administrative Support and Chief of Staff (VP/COS)

Subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, the President and Chief Executive Officer (President/CEO) shall hire a Vice President of Administrative Support and Chief of Staff (VP/COS). The VP/COS shall serve as the second in command and shall perform duties as defined in a job description provided by the President/CEO. In the absences of the President/CEO, the VP/COS shall be responsible for the administration and supervision of all operational phases of the Corporation. The VP/COS shall provide direct supervision of administrative support units.

Section 3. - Vice President of Legal Affairs and General Counsel

Subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, the President and Chief Executive Officer (President/CEO) shall hire a Vice President of Legal Affairs and General Counsel (VP/General Counsel). The VP/General Counsel shall serve as the chief legal advisor for the Corporation and legal advisor to the President/CEO. The VP/ General Counsel shall perform duties as defined in a job description provided by the President/CEO.

Section 4. - Vice President of Finance and Chief Financial Officer (VP/CFO)

Subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, the President and Chief Executive Officer (President/CEO) shall hire a Vice President of Finance and Chief Financial Officer (VP/CFO). The VP/CFO shall be recommended for employment by the President/CEO. The VP/CFO shall account for all budgets and fiscal matters for the Corporation and must report to the President/CEO and the Board of Directors monthly on the financial status of the Corporation. Strict adherence shall be followed with regard to the all applicable Office of Budget and Management Circulars for Non-Profit Fiscal Management, Assurances of all

Grants and Contracts to guarantee that the standards of the office are addressed in a manner consistent with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.

Section 5. - Vice President of Operation and Chief Operations Officer (VP/COO)

Subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, the President and Chief Executive Officer (President/CEO) shall appoint a Vice President of Operations and Chief Operations Officer (VP/COO). The VP/COO shall be recommended by the President/CEO and charged with the responsibility of oversight of Daily program operations assuring compliance with outcome projections and contractual requirements.

Section 6. - Independent Auditing Firm

Based upon the recommendation of the Audit and Finance Committee, the Board of Directors shall hire an Independent Auditing Firm to provide for an annual audit of the approved budget of the organization. The firm shall work with management to provide the appropriate oversight and review as required by OMB Circular A-133. The findings and results of the audit must be provided to the full Board of Directors no later than six months after the end of the fiscal year.

ARTICLE VI. - SUNDRY PROVISIONS

Section 1. - Compensation

No member of the Board of Directors, any board of directors, or any committee or council created by such Board shall receive compensation for his (or her) service as a member. Nothing in this section shall preclude such member from receiving reimbursements for authorized expenses in connection with his (or her) work as a member.

Section 2. - Checks

All checks, drafts, or order for payment of money, notes or other indebtedness, issued in the name of the Corporation, except payroll checks, shall have two signatures and be signed by at least one of the designated officers of the Board. The President and Chief Executive Officer (President/CEO) and the Vice President of Operations and Chief Operating Officer (VP/COO) may sign with a designated Board officer. Such signers shall be designated by resolution of the Board of Directors. No checks shall be signed in blank. The President/CEO, or in his (or her) absence, the VP/COO, may sign payroll checks.

Section 3. - Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall extend from October 1 to September 30, unless otherwise provided by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. - Seal of the Corporation

The Seal of the Corporation shall be circular in form, with the name of the Corporation and "District of Columbia" inscribed around the outer edge and in the center the word "incorporation" and the year of incorporation.

Section 5. - Rules of Order

Except insofar as the Bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation and applicable statues shall otherwise provide, meetings of the Board of Directors and/or committees of the Board shall be conducted, to the extent pertinent, in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.

Section 6. - Conflict of Interest Policy

All directors shall adhere to the Conflict of Interest Policy adopted September 2003 and as amended.

ARTICLE VII. - AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws, or any part of them, or any additional or amended Bylaws, may be altered or repealed, and new Bylaws may be adopted at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors upon thirty (30) days notice in writing to the Board of Directors, the notice of which shall set forth said intention and the terms of the proposed amendment, by the vote of a majority of the members present and voting.
